AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers at Perth, the 9th day of October, 1968 the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 74/66 (Pt. A).

WHEREAS it is provided, *inter alia*, by subsection (5) of section 190 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1967, that where a council intends to submit a by-law for confirmation by the Governor, the council shall cause notice of the intention to submit the by-law for confirmation by the Governor to be published once in a newspaper circulating in the district of the municipality; and whereas

on the 25th November, 1967 the council of the municipality of the City of Perth with the intention of complying with the above provision, caused to be published in *The West Australian* newspaper, a notice of a by-law made on the 20th November, 1967 for the amendment of its By-law No. 63, but through accidental omission failed to set out in the notice its intention to submit the by-law for the confirmation by the Governor; and whereas it is enacted *inter alia*, by section 688 of the above Act that where through an accidental omission anything required to be done by or under the Act is not done within the prescribed time, manner or form, the Governor for the purposes of the Act, may by order take such measures as are necessary for the rectifying the omission, and may validate anything which has been done otherwise than in the prescribed time, manner or form: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor acting with the advice and consent of Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, doth, for the purpose of giving effect to the intention and purposes of the Act, hereby validate the notice published by the council of the municipality of the City of Perth, in *The West Australian* newspaper on the 25th November, 1967, with respect to the by-law made by the council on the 20th November, 1967.

"Inflammable material" is defined for the purpose of this notice to include bush, timber, boxes, cartons, paper and like inflammable materials, rubbish and also any combustible matter, but does not include green standing trees, or growing bushes and plants in gardens or lawns.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$200, and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Harvey.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required, on or before the dates referred to below, to remove from the land owned or occupied by you, all inflammable material or to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following, and thereafter to maintain the land or the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including the 31st day of March, 1969.

A. Rural Land (i.e. all land within the Shire of Harvey other than land within the townsites of Yarloop, Harvey, Brunswick, Roelands and Australind.)

- (1) You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1968, clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks at least 6 feet wide inside and within 5 chains of the external boundaries of the land owned or occupied by you.
- (2) You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1968, where more than 500 acres of land owned or occupied by you has been cleared or part cleared for agricultural purposes clear of all inflammable material, additional firebreaks not less than 6 feet wide so as to divide the land which has been cleared or part cleared for agricultural purposes in the areas of not more than 500 acres.
- (3) You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1968, where buildings or haystacks exist on the land owned or occupied by you, clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks not less than 6 feet wide within 5 chains of the perimeter of such building or haystack in such a manner as to completely encircle the building or haystack.
- (4) You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1968, where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) clear of all inflammable material firebreaks not less than 1 chain wide in the following positions on the land on which the bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated:—

- (a) Immediately inside the external boundaries of the land; and
- (b) in such positions as would divide the land into separate areas of not more than 300 acres, each surrounded by a firebreak at least one chain wide.

- (5) Where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) and such bulldozing, chaining and preparing of the bush is completed after the 15th day of November, 1968, you shall, within 28 days of completing the bulldozing, chaining or preparing of the bush, clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks not less than 1 chain wide in the following positions on that land on which the bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated—

- (a) immediately inside the external boundaries of the land; and
- (b) in such positions as would divide land into separate areas of not more than 300 acres, each surrounded by a firebreak at least one chain wide.

If for any reason it is considered to be impractical to clear firebreaks or to remove the inflammable material from land as required by part A of this notice you may apply in writing to the Council or its duly authorised officer, on or before the 1st day of November, 1968, for permission to provide firebreaks in an alternative position. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

B. Townsite Land (i.e. all land within the Townsite of Yarloop, Harvey, Brunswick, Roelands and Australind).

- (1) You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1968, clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks at least 6 feet wide immediately inside the external boundaries of the land owned or occupied by you.

The owner or occupier of land who fails or neglects to comply with the requirements of this notice is guilty of an offence under subsection 3 of section 33 of the Act and is liable for a penalty of not less than \$10 or more than \$200 and the Council may do the works and charge the owner or occupier for such works. If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

- (3) Immediately inside the common boundary between the land and any railway reserve. Should the land adjoining a railway reserve be in crop, the fire break is required to immediately encircle the land under crop; PROVIDED, that breaks may be installed other than immediately inside the boundaries, in such positions as are specifically approved in writing by a duly appointed fire control officer.

Homesteads and Haystacks: On or before the 30th day of November, 1968, to clear a firebreak of one chain in width around the perimeter of all

homestead buildings and haystacks and to maintain such firebreak clear of all inflammable materials until the 15th day of April, 1969.

Townsites: On or before the 15th day of December, 1968, all townsite residential lots, of an area of one-half acre or less, within the Shire of Kojonup are required to be cleared by the owner and/or occupier of all inflammable materials and maintained free of such inflammable materials until the 15th day of April, 1969. Other townsite blocks must comply with requirements listed in preceding sections.

THE Ravensthorpe Shire Council, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of—

- (a) controlling land development by zoning;
- (b) other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

**PART I.—PRELIMINARY.**

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Ravensthorpe Town Planning Scheme No. 1 hereinafter called 'the Scheme' and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the maps forming part of the Scheme.

1.3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Ravensthorpe.

1.4 In the Scheme the planning area is divided into zones.

1.5 Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme is divided into the following Parts:—

Part I.—Preliminary.

Part II.—Zones.

Part III.—Non-conforming Uses.

Part IV.—Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are as follows:—

- (1) Land Use Map marked "Map No. 2".
- (2) Scheme map.

1.6 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" to the Town Planning Regulations, 1967, except that the following words shall be added to the definition of service station—"a cafe may also form part of such premises", and car park—"all types of trucks may be included in a car park use class".

**PART II.—ZONES.**

2.1 Table No. 1 appended to Clause 2.2 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross references between the list of 'Use Classes' on the left-hand side of the Table and the list of 'Zones' on the top of that Table.

2.2 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 appended to this clause have the following meanings—

- "P" = A use that is permitted under the provisions of this Scheme.
- "AA" = A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Responsible Authority.
- "IP" = A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Responsible Authority.
- "X" = A use that is not permitted.

2.3 (a) No development of any land in the Scheme Area shall be commenced or continued without the approval of the Responsible Authority.

(b) Approval under this Part does not exempt the person to whom exemption is granted from the requirements, if any, to obtain permission or approval for development on the land under any other law.

**PART III.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF  
LAND.**

3.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as

amended), or any other law authorising the development to be carried out had been duly obtained and was current.

3.2 Where in respect of land zoned under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 3.1 of this Part on that land, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended) or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

### 3.3 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Responsible Authority may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

## PART IV.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

4.1 Disposal of Land: The Responsible Authority may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

4.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*.

4.3 Entry to Premises: The Responsible Authority may by its engineer or other authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

4.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.
