# Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1964. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency The Honourable Sir Albert TO WIT A. A. WOLFF, Lieutenant Governor and Administrator. [L.S.] By His Excellency The Honourable Sir Albert Jshre Wolff, Knight Commander of the Most Ostiguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant Governor and Administrator in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 27 of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1964, that the Governor, without constituting any irrigation dis-trict under Part IV of the said Act, may, on the recommendation of the Minister and acting with the advice of the Commissioners appointed under subsection (4) of section 3 of the Act, at any time and from time to time by Proclamation declare that Part III of the said Act shall extend to and have effect in and throughout any portion of the State to be defined in the proclamation, and shall apply to and have effect in relation to all rivers, streams, watercourses, lagoons, lakes, swamps or marshes situated within that portion of the State specified and defined aforesaid, but that no such declaration shall be made until after the expiration of thirty days after notice of intention to make such declaration has been given to the local authority or local authorities in or through whose district or districts such rivers, streams, watercourses, lagoons, swamps, lakes or marshes run or are situ-ate to the intent that before the making of such declaration any objection by such local authority or local authorities may be considered; and whereas the Minister has recommended and the Commissioners have advised the Lieutenant-Governor by Proclamation to declare that Part III of the said Act shall extend to and have effect in relation to those portions of the State that are defined in the Schedule to this Proclamation and shall apply to and have effect in relation to all rivers, streams, watercourses, lagoons, lakes, swamps, and marshes situated within that portion of the State; and whereas after due notice given the local authority or local authorities concerned have not made any

objection to the proposed declaration: Now, thereon the recommendation of the Minister and with the advice of the Commissioners and in exercise declare that Part III of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1964, shall extend to and have effect in and throughout each of the portions of the State as separately defined in the Schedule hereto and shall apply to and have effect in relation to all rivers, streams, watercourses, lagoons, lakes, swamps and marshes situated within those portions of the State and which portions are, for the purposes of that Act, to be known as the Ser-pentine River System and the Dandalup River System, respectively.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 6 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1967, that the Governor may by proclamation revoke or vary any proclamation made under this Act; and whereas by a proclamation made the 9th November, 1960 and published in the Government Gazette on the 18th November, 1960, the Lieutenant-Governor did, inter alia, prohibit the bringing by any person into the area bounded by a circle having a radius of twenty-five miles from the Carnarvon Post Office of any covering in which bananas have been conof any covering in which bananas have been con-tained or packed; and whereas it is now expedient to vary that prohibition: Now, therefore, I the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of Executive Council, do hereby vary the abovementioned proclamation made the 9th Nov-ember, 1960, by adding after the word, "generally" in the last line of the proclamation, the passage, "unless, in the case of a covering, it is a bruce box, or a bulk container, returned from Perth after use in transporting bananas to Perth from the said area" the said area".

WHEREAS by the Companies Act, 1961-1966, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that section 348 of the Act does not apply to or in relation to a foreign company that is included in a class of companies incorporated under the law of another State, Territory or country, being a class of companies which the Governor has declared by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette to be a class of companies of a kind the same or substantially the same as exempt proprietary companies under the Companies Act, 1961-1966: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Companies Act, 1961-1966, doth hereby declare exempt proprietary companies incorporated under the laws in force in the Territory of Papua and New Guinea, to be a class of companies of a kind the same or substantially the same as exempt proprietary companies under the Companies Act, 1961-1966.
