- (a) establish a special court to be called a Children's Court at Mt. Goldsworthy, to exercise jurisdiction in and for the area known as the Gascoyne Magisterial District; and
- (b) appoint—
 - (i) Hilary Joseph Ryan, Stipendiary Magistrate, Carnarvon, to be a special magistrate for; and
 - (ii) Peter Henry Cribb and John King, both of Mt. Goldsworthy, to be members of the Children's Court at Mt. Goldsworthy.

 - (ii) Louis Fenwick, Douglas William Nielsen and Allan Roberts, all of Dampier, to be members of the Children's Court at Dampier.

Stirling Drainage District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 558/65.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 11 of the Land Drainage Act, 1925-1954 that the Governor may, by Order in Council—

- (a) constitute any defined portion of the State a drainage district for the purposes of that Act;
- (b) specify the boundaries of such district;
- (c) assign a name to such district;
- (d) abolish a district;

and whereas a drainage district known as the Stirling Drainage District is deemed to have been duly declared under the Act; AND WHEREAS it is now expedient to abolish that district and to again constitute it with redefined boundaries: now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor doth—

- (a) abolish the drainage district known as the Stirling Drainage District; and
- (b) constitute the portion of the State enclosed by the boundaries specified in the Schedule to this Order to be a drainage district for the purposes of the Land Drainage Act, 1925-1954, and to assign to that district the name Stirling Drainage District.

Schedule.

Stirling Drainage District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the Low Water Mark of the Indian Ocean situate in prolongation northwesterly of the southwestern boundary of Stirling Estate Lot 146 and extending generally northeasterly along that Low Water Mark to a point situate in prolongation northwesterly of the northeastern boundary of Wellington Location 492; thence southeasterly to and along that boundary to the eastern corner of that location; thence southwesterly 8 chains 52 and five tenths links along the southeastern boundary of that location to a northern corner of part of Location 41, as shown on Land Titles Office plan 4605; thence southeasterly along a northeastern boundary of that part to the northwestern side of Road Number 49; thence generally northeasterly along that side to the southern corner of the western severance of Lot 317 of Location 41 aforesaid, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 3097; thence generally east-southeasterly to and along boundaries of that lot to the southeastern boundary of Location 41 aforesaid; thence generally northeasterly along that boundary to the southwestern corner of Location 664; thence easterly along the southern boundary of that location to the northwestern side of Bussell Highway; thence generally southwesterly along that side to the northeastern corner of Location 2991; thence westerly along the northern boundary of that location and southwesterly 11 chains 59 and three-tenths links along its northwestern boundary to a northeastern corner of part of Location 41, as shown on Land Titles Office plan 4605 aforesaid; thence northwesterly along the northeastern boundary of that part to the southeastern side of Road Number 49 aforesaid; thence generally southwesterly along that side and the southeastern side of Road Number 60 to the northeastern boundary of Stirling Estate Lot 142; thence westerly, northwesterly and southwesterly along boundaries of that lot and southwesterly along northwestern boundaries of Lots 141 and 190 and onwards to the northeastern boundary of Lot 140, thence generally southeasterly and generally southerly along that boundary and eastern boundaries of Lots 143, 144 and 145 to a point situate in prolongation northwesterly of the northernmost northeastern boundary of Lot 148; thence generally southeasterly to and along northeastern boundaries of that lot and onwards to the northwestern corner of Lot 152; thence easterly and southerly along boundaries of that lot and southerly along the eastern boundaries of Lots 56 and 55 to the southeastern corner of the lastmentioned lot; thence westerly along southern boundaries of that lot and lots 54, 51 and 50 and

onwards to the eastern boundary of Lot 48; thence southerly along that boundary and southerly and westerly along boundaries of lot 45 to its southwestern corner; thence southerly and easterly to and along boundaries of Lot 43 to its southeastern corner; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of Lot 42 and onwards to the northern boundary of Lot 20; thence easterly and southerly along boundaries of that lot and southerly along eastern boundaries of Lots 19 and 18 and onwards to the northern boundary of Lot 31; thence easterly and southerly along boundaries of that lot to its southeastern corner; thence easterly and southerly to and along boundaries of lot 30 and onwards to the southeastern corner of Lot 33; thence westerly and northerly along boundaries of that lot to the southeastern corner of Reserve 9515; thence westerly along southern boundaries of that Reserve and Lot 232 to the eastern side of Road Number 3497; thence generally northwesterly along that side, northeastern boundaries of Lots 251, 249 and 250 and again the eastern side of Road Number 3497 to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the northern side of Road Number 13232; thence generally westerly to and along that side, generally southwesterly along the northwestern side of that road, excluding widenings as shown on Lands and Surveys Diagram 71072, and westerly to the easternmost corner of Lot 103; thence generally southwesterly along southeastern boundaries of that lot and lots 104, 106, 230, 107 and 108 to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of Lot 121; thence easterly along that boundary to its northeastern corner; thence southwesterly along southeastern boundaries of that lot and lots 120 to 116 inclusive to the southeastern corner of the last-mentioned lot; thence generally northwesterly and generally northeasterly along boundaries of that lot to its northwestern corner and thence generally northwesterly to and along southwestern boundaries of lot 146 aforesaid and onwards to the starting point, as shown in red on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 44700-1-1.

ORDER IN COUNCIL

P.W.W.S. 103/52.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (1) of section 12 of the Land Drainage Act, 1925-1954, that the Governor may at any time, by Order in Council extend any district by the addition thereto of any land that has not thereto formed part of a district; and whereas it is now desired to extend the Capel-Boyanup Drainage District constituted by an Order in Council made the 9th April, 1952 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th April, 1952; Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor doth extend the said Capel-Boyanup Drainage District by the addition thereto of the land that has not thereto formed part of a district and as is contained within the portion of the State enclosed by the boundaries of that district as re-defined and specified in the Schedule to this Order.

Capel-Boyanup Drainage District

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the southwestern side of Road Number 60 with a northwestern boundary of Wellington Location 47 and extending southeasterly along the southwestern side of Road Number 60 aforesaid to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the western boundary of Location 708; thence northerly and easterly to and along boundaries of that location and the northern boundary of Location 348 and onwards to the western boundary of Location 3328; thence northerly along that boundary to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the southern boundary of Boyanup Agricultural Area Lot 179; thence easterly along that prolongation to the eastern boundary of Wellington Location 3329; thence southerly along that boundary and onwards to the southwestern side

- (a) controlling land development by zoning;
- (b) other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Kulin Town Planning Scheme No. 1 (Kulin town area) hereinafter called 'the Scheme' and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the maps in the Appendices hereto.

1.3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Kulin.

1.4 In the Scheme the planning area is divided into the following zones:—

- Residential.
- Commercial.
- Industrial.
- Recreational.
- Railway.
- Rural.

1.5 Arrangement of Scheme:

The Scheme is divided into the following

Parts and Appendices—

Part I.—Preliminary.

Part II.—Zones.

Part III.—Non-conforming Uses.

Part IV.—Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are appended as follows—

1. Land Use Map marked "Map No. 2".
2. Planning Proposals Map marked "Map No. 3" or Approved Planning Scheme Map marked "Map No. 4" (as the case may be).

1.6 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations, 1963, except that the following words shall be added to the definition of service station—"a cafe may also form part of such premises".

PART II.—ZONES.

2.1 Table No. 1 appended to Clause 2.2 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross references between the list of "Use Classes" on the left-hand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on the top of that Table.

2.2 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 appended to this clause have the following meanings—

- "P" = A use that is permitted under the provisions of this Scheme.
- "AA" = A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Responsible Authority.
- "IP" = A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Responsible Authority.
- "X" = A use that is not permitted.

2.3 (a) No development of any land in the Scheme Area shall be commenced or continued without the approval of the Responsible Authority.

(b) Approval under this Part does not exempt the person to whom exemption is granted from the requirements, if any, to obtain promises or approval for development on the land under any other law.

PART III.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

3.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), or any other law authorising the development to be carried out had been duly obtained and was current.

3.2 Where in respect of land zoned under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 3.1 of this Part on that land, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

3.3 Discontinuance of Non-conforming Use:

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Responsible Authority may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

PART IV.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

4.1 Disposal of Land: The Responsible Authority may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

4.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*.

4.3 Entry to Premises: The Responsible Authority may by its engineer or other authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

4.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.
