WHEREAS it is provided, *inter alia*, by section 17 of the Charitable Collections Act, 1946-1949, that the Governor may by proclamation vest in the Minister the moneys, securities for moneys or goods collected by a war fund or held for any charitable purpose by or on behalf of any person, society, body or association, on being satisfied, *inter alia*, that a majority of at least three-fourths in number of the persons who are trustees, or who have the control of the moneys or securities for money or goods have consented thereto; and whereas I, the Governor, am satisfied that at least three-fourths of the Trustees of The Air Force Memorial House Trust Fund, being the persons who have the control of moneys, securities for moneys or goods collected by a war fund or held for a charitable purpose consent to the whole of the assets of that Fund being vested under and for the purposes of the said Act in James Frederick Craig, the Minister of the Crown to whom, for the time being, the administration of the said Act is committed: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting under the provisions contained in that section and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby vest in the said James Frederick Craig all of the moneys, securities for money or goods collected or held for a charitable purpose by the Trustees of The Air Force Memorial House Trust Fund, established under the War Funds

Regulation Act, 1939, to be held upon the trust upon which they were held prior to their being so vested.

Land Act, 1933-1967.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1967, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. 3692/66.—That Reserve No. 29392 should vest in and be held by the Shire of West Kimberley in trust for the purpose of Public Recreation and Hallsite.

Corres. 1478/66.—That Reserve No. 29464 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Gnowangerup in trust for the purpose of Meteorological Station.

Corres. 3951/67.—That Reserve No. 29476 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Yalgoo in trust for the purpose of Shire Council Depot.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies, in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Land Act, 1933.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of subleasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. 935/68.—That Reserve No. 29173 should vest in and be held by the Town of Geraldton in trust for the purpose of Public Recreation.

(The Order in Council dated 12th June, 1968, is hereby superseded.)

Corres. 2993/68.—That Reserve No. 29474 should vest in and be held by the Town of Albany in trust for the purpose of Public Recreation (Pistol Club).

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies, in trust for the purposes aforesaid, with power to the said bodies, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserves for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the leases, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

THE Shire of Cockburn under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

Scheme Text.

1. Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Cockburn Town Planning Scheme No. 3—Wattleup Residential Area Scheme (hereinafter called the Scheme).

2. Responsible Authority: The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of the Scheme is the Shire of Cockburn (hereinafter referred to as the Council).

3. Maps: The following Maps are attached to this Text and form part of the Scheme:—

Land Use Map—Map No. 2.

Scheme Proposals Map—Map No. 3.

4. Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within the inner edge of a blue border on the Land Use Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as the Scheme Area.

5. General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are:—

- (a) To improve and develop the Scheme Area to the best possible advantage.
- (b) To plan within the Scheme Area suitable roads.

(c) To ensure the proper drainage of the roads and of those parts of the Scheme Area which require drainage or other such works.

(d) To facilitate and co-ordinate progressive subdivision and development of land within the Scheme Area.

(e) To make provision for land to be used for Public Open Space and Local Authority purposes.

6. Method of Carrying out Objects: As and when owners of land within the Scheme Area subdivide their land such subdivision shall be according to a plan which will be capable of forming part of an overall plan of subdivision and development for the Scheme Area.

7. The plan of subdivision shown in the Scheme Proposals Map forms a basis for subdivision and development of the Scheme Area but the Council may with the consent of the Town Planning Board permit alterations or variations to the Scheme Proposals Map where in its opinion circumstances justify such action provided that no such alteration or variation shall be permitted if in the opinion of the Council and the Town Planning Board it would impede the subdivision and development of the Scheme Area as a whole.

8. Subdivision: An owner of land within the Scheme Area who desires to subdivide his land either alone or in conjunction with other owners shall submit a plan of proposed subdivision to the Town Planning Board as required by the Town Planning and Development Act of Western Australia.

9. New Roads: All new roads within the Scheme shall be constructed and drained at the expense of the owners of land therein and each owner shall pay the costs of the construction and drainage of the roads within the land owned by him.

10. In cases where the situation of a new road within the Scheme Area is such that it would be fair and equitable that the owners of adjoining land should each contribute to the cost of the construction or drainage of that road and such owners are unable to agree upon the proportion of the costs payable by each of them then the amount payable by each owner shall be determined by arbitration in manner hereinafter provided.

11. If the Council shall construct or drain a new road within the Scheme Area prior to the subdivision of the land adjoining such road the costs of the construction and drainage of the said road and all compensation and other costs consequent upon the acquisition of the land paid by the Council shall be paid to the Council by the respective owners of land as and when their land is subdivided and the provisions of clauses 9, 10 and 14 shall apply in respect of such payments.

12. If an owner shall claim compensation for the resumption from him of land to be used for a road there shall be set off against the amount of compensation payable to him the amount by which the value of the remainder of his land has been increased by the construction of the roads within the Scheme Area and by the operation of this Scheme.

13. If an owner shall subdivide his land and if he or his predecessors in title shall have claimed or shall have been paid compensation by reason of the resumption by the Council of the land for a new road within the Scheme Area he shall before the approval of his plan of subdivision release the Council from the payment of compensation or repay to the Council the compensation paid by it to him or his predecessors in title as the case may be.

14. Drainage: For the purpose of assessing drainage costs the Scheme Area shall be divided into two portions one lying north of Wattleup Road and the other lying south of Wattleup Road. Each owner upon the subdivision of his land shall pay to the Council an amount which bears the same proportion to the estimated costs as revised from time to time of drainage of that portion of the Scheme Area in which the owner's land is situated as the area of his land bears

to the whole of the privately owned land within such portion of the Scheme Area and the Council shall at the appropriate time carry out the drainage of the Scheme Area in accordance with the drainage plan approved by the Council with such modifications as may from time to time be determined by the Council.

15. Public Open Space: Subject to any alteration of sources for the purpose of providing the finance necessary for the acquisition of the lands coloured green on the Scheme Proposals Map to be used for Public Open Space and Local Authority purposes and for the carrying out of the said drainage works. If the Council shall be unable to raise the said loans or any of them or to provide the necessary finance it shall be under no liability to the owners of land within the Scheme Area or to any other person by reason of its failure to acquire the said lands or carry out the said works.

22. The Council shall apply all moneys paid to it in pursuance of clauses 14 and 17 hereof in reduction of the said loans and interest thereon or the reimbursement of the finance made available from other sources for such purposes respectively. In the event of the moneys received by the Council in pursuance with clauses 14 and 17 being insufficient to repay the said loans and interest or other moneys the Council shall repay the balance thereof from its general fund.

23. In the event of the moneys received by the Council in pursuance of clauses 14 and 17 hereof being greater than the amount necessary to repay the said loans and interest thereon or other money the balance thereof shall be applied by the Council in further improvements and facilities within the Scheme Area.

24. Valuations: For the purpose of clause 17 the value of the owner's land shall be determined by a disinterested and competent valuer appointed by the Council. If an owner objects to the value so determined he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty-eight days after having been informed of the said value or the revised value. If the valuer does not agree to change the value to a figure acceptable to the owner the value shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with clause 26 hereof.

25. If a valuation made by the valuer shall be changed as the result of an objection the valuer may reconsider the values placed on other lands and make such revaluations as he considers just and equitable. The owners affected by such revaluation shall forthwith be notified of any change in value.

26. Arbitration: Any dispute or difference between the owners as to their respective rights under the Scheme or as to the valuation of any land may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895, or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force and if the parties fail to agree upon any one single arbitrator he may be nominated by the Council.

27. Powers and Authorities of Council: In carrying out the provisions of the Scheme the Council shall have the following powers and authorities:—

- (a) To enter and inspect any land within the Scheme Area.
- (b) To make agreements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the Scheme Area.
- (c) To enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of land within the Scheme Area.
- (d) If any owner of land within the Scheme Area does not proceed with the subdivision or development of his land in accordance with the terms of the Scheme or by reason of the nature of his land is unable to subdivide or develop it and his failure to do so in the opinion of the Council will unduly delay the completion of the Scheme the Council may resume the land of such owner or owners and proceed with the subdivision and development of the said land in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme.

(e) In the event of the Council exercising its powers under clause (d) it shall have all the powers of an owner in the subdivision development and disposal of the said land but before selling the land so subdivided and developed it shall offer the new lots to the original owner upon his paying to the Council all costs and expenses consequent upon the resumption subdivision or development of the said land and upon his releasing the Council from all claims for compensation in respect of such resumption. All moneys received by it from such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of all costs and expenses consequent upon such subdivision and secondly in payment of all compensation in respect of the resumption of the said land. The balance of any of such moneys may be retained by the Council and the Council shall make good any deficit.

(f) If the offer mentioned in clause (e) hereof be not accepted the Council may retain all or any part of the said land but if it does so it shall be responsible to pay such costs of subdivision of the said land and compensation for its resumption as are then unpaid.

(g) The Council may resume any land within the Scheme Area for Public Open Space or Local Authority purposes.

(h) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled whether under clause (d) hereof or otherwise upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit and without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition that buildings of a specified character with specified parking or other facilities shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specified purpose.

(i) Extend the time within which payments have to be made to the Council and agree to the securing of such payments.

28. Twenty-eight days written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to section 10 of the Act. Any expenses incurred by the Council under the said section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in such Court of Civil Jurisdiction as is competent to deal with the amount of the claim.

29. The Council may at any time exercise the powers conferred by section 13 of the Act.

30. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent the Town Planning Board from imposing conditions on the granting of its approval to a subdivision of land in respect of any matters not mentioned herein.

31. Claims for Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of this Scheme may be made within six months of the Scheme coming into operation.

It is hereby notified, for public information, that the Hon. Minister for Mines has approved of the undermentioned rules and scale of fees to come into operation as from the 1st January, 1969.

(1) Assays, analyses and tests may be made of any Western Australian raw material or manufactured product by the Government Chemical Laboratories when not unduly interfering with official work, subject to the pre-payment of the fees set out below and the conditions laid down in paragraphs (4) and (6) hereunder.

(2) Reductions of the usual fees may be allowed under certain conditions viz.:—

(a) for a number of samples submitted by the one person at the one time for identical treatment:—

Five to ten (inclusive) 20% reduction.

Eleven or more 25% reduction.

A special reduced fee may be charged where the extra work involved in a number of samples is so small as to warrant a special fee.

(b) Agricultural materials, including waters, will be charged at one-half rates to persons who provide evidence that they are *bona fide* prospectors, farmers, market gardeners, orchardists, graziers or other primary producers (name of owner or occupier, location number of site of sample, etc.) and that the examination is needed for the proper conduct of their business as such.

(c) Mineral identifications and assays will be charged at one-half rates for Western Australian ores and minerals taken from ground not held under gold mining lease, mineral lease, reserve, dredging claim or mineral claim provided the exact locality where the specimen was found is disclosed. At the discretion of

the Director such mineral identifications and assays may be done free of charge for prospectors.

This paragraph does not apply to samples showing free gold, or tailings or other metallurgical products.

(3) A special fee will be charged for any abnormal, lengthy or intricate investigation, in accordance with the actual cost to the Laboratories. This includes assays for the less commonly occurring elements.

(4) All samples for examination must be addressed to the Director, Government Chemical Laboratories, 30 Plain St. Perth, and must be marked on the outside with the name and address of the sender. This information should also be enclosed with the sample(s) and each sample should be distinctly and separately marked. A letter must be sent at the same time stating the reasons why the sample is submitted and enclosing the prescribed fee, and, if applicable, stating the exact locality from which each mineral specimen was taken (paragraph 2c).

(5) Samples will normally be dealt with in order of their receipt, at such times as do not interfere with Departmental work.

(6) The Director reserves the right to refuse to make any particular examination on the ground of (i) the laboratories being already too fully occupied to accept more samples; (ii) the sample being unsuitable for the purpose; or (iii) any other good and sufficient reason. He also reserves the right of publishing after the expiration of 12 months, the result of any assay or other investigation made in part at the public expense.
