Rule of Court.

(Sittings and Winter Vacation for 1969.)

WE, the Honourable Sir Albert Wolff, K.C.M.G., Chief Justice of Western Australia and the Honourable John Evenden Virtue, the Honourable Roy Vivian Nevile, the Honourable Gordon Bede D'Arcy, the Honourable John Hale, and the Honourable Oscar Joseph Negus, Puisne Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia and the Honourable Gordon Thomas Staples Acting Judge of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Act 1935-1964, and The Rules of the Supreme Court, 1909, and of every other power enabling us in this behalf, hereby order as follows:—

WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of section 17 of the Charitable Collections Act, 1946-1949, all of the moneys, securities for moneys or goods collected or held for a charitable purpose by the Trustees of the Air Force Memorial House Trust Fund, established under the War Funds Regulations Act, 1939, are vested in James Frederick Craig as the Minister of the Crown to whom for the time being the administration of the said Act is committed and are held by him upon the trusts upon which they were held prior to their being so vested; and whereas under the provisions of subsection (2) of section 17 of the Act the Governor may by proclamation vary the trusts and may by the same proclamation vest the said moneys, securities and goods or part thereof in such persons and for such charitable purposes as the Governor shall specify: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting under the provisions of subsection (2) of section 17 of the said Act and with the advice and consent of Executive Council, do hereby vest in the Australian Flying Corps and Royal Australian Air Force Association (Western Australia Division) an association incorporated under the Associations Incorporation Act, 1895-1962, all of the moneys, securities for moneys or goods hereinbefore described and vested as aforesaid, and specify that they be applied by the association for the charitable purposes of—

- establishing a memorial to those West Australian members of Her Majesty's Air Forces, Flying Corps and ancillary services who have fallen in war or died as a result of their service;
- providing a home or homes for aged and/or necessitous ex-airmen and ex-airwomen and their dependants;
- providing for the maintenance, recreation and comfort of the inmates of such homes;
- providing for the relief of distress among ex-airmen and ex-airwomen;
- providing a headquarters meeting place and social centre for the activities of the abovementioned association;
- undertaking any activity for the preservation of the traditions of Her Majesty's Air Forces and for the benefit of members and ex-members thereof as shall be consistent with the objects of the abovementioned association as expressed in its constitution; and

(g) doing all such other lawful things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of any of the above purposes.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 14 of the Fauna Conservation Act, 1950-1967, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:—

- (1) That the period from six o'clock in the afternoon of 11th January, 1969, to seven o'clock in the afternoon of 30th April, 1969, shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild duck in the Third Schedule hereto in that part of the State which lies within the boundaries of the shires specified in the First Schedule hereto, with the exception of those areas defined in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (2) That from five o'clock in the forenoon of 12th January, 1969, to seven o'clock in the afternoon of 30th April, 1969, shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild duck defined in the Third Schedule hereto in those parts of the State which lie within the boundaries of the South-West and Eucla Divisions as defined in section 28 of the Land Act, 1933, with the exception of those areas defined in the First and Second Schedules hereto.
- (3) That a person shall not take any wild duck or the egg of any wild duck for the purpose of keeping it in captivity, or for the purpose of aviculture, or for the purpose of sale.
- (4) That a person shall not sell any wild duck.
- (5) That a person shall not take any wild duck by any means other than a shot-gun, provided that this restriction shall not prohibit a person who is a native, within the meaning of the Native Welfare Act, 1905-1954, from using any native artifact in the taking of wild ducks.
- (6) That a person shall not take or attempt to take wild ducks from any boat, raft, launch or other type of boat which is powered by any type of motor or engine or which is propelled or towed by any means other than by hand nor shall he use in any manner whatsoever such boat, raft, launch or other type of boat in the taking of any wild ducks.

Second Schedule.

General Areas.

- (1) All fauna sanctuaries except those which may have been classified as shooting or hunting areas pursuant to the provisions of section 12A of the Fauna Conservation Act, 1950-1967.

- (2) All municipalities and townsites in the South-West Land Division.
- (3) All State Forest, timber reserves, town reservoirs and other areas where shooting is prohibited under the provisions of any other Act, regulation or by-law.
- (4) The whole of the area within a radius of 20 miles of the General Post Office, Perth.

Albany Shire.

- (6) The whole of the waters of Lake Seppings and all land within 20 chains of its shores.
- (7) The whole of the waters of Nannarup (or Taylor) Inlet and all the land within 20 chains of its shores.
- (8) The whole of the waters of the King and Kalgan Rivers and all land within 20 chains of their banks.
- (9) The whole of the waters of Oyster and Princess Royal Harbours and all land within 20 chains of their shores.

Balingup Shire.

- (10) The whole of the area within a radius of 1½ miles from the Post Office of Balingup.

Busselton Shire.

- (11) The whole of the waters of the Vasse and Wonnerup Estuaries and all land within 20 chains of their shores.
- (12) The whole of the waters of the Vasse River and all land within 20 chains of its banks.
- (13) The whole of reserves 3872 and 3876 (Public Utilities) in the Broadwater.

Capel Shire.

- (14) All that portion of the Capel River between the Capel and Stirling bridges and all land within 20 chains of the river's bank.

Corrigin Shire.

- (15) The whole of reserves 12899 and 12900 at Nambadilling.

Dandaragan Shire.

- (16) The whole of Caro Swamp and all land within 80 chains of its shores.

Denmark Shire.

- (17) All that part of Wilson Inlet situated between the low water mark of Ratcliffe Bay (Southern Ocean) and a line joining the southernmost extremity of reserve 12344 and the north-eastern corner of Plantagenet location 1828.

Dumbleyung Shire.

- (18) All that portion of the Coblin River downstream from the eastern side of the bridge at the junction of road 3375 and road 323 (Oxley Road) to the prolongation eastwards of the southern boundary of Kojonup location 3928 and all land within 20 chains of that part of the river's banks.

Gingin Shire.

- (19) The whole of the waters of Lake Nambung, Bambun and Mungala and all land within 20 chains of their shores.
- (20) The whole of Swan Location 2340 including Wallering Swamp.

Gnowangerup Shire.

- (21) The whole of the land and waters contained within reserves 21646 and 21647 in the Wellstead and Beaufort Estuaries, respectively.

Harvey Shire.

- (22) All those waters of the Leschenault Inlet extending southwards from a line drawn south-east from Waterloo Head (Belvedere), on the west foreshore to a point on the opposite foreshore and all land within 20 chains of the included foreshores.
- (23) The whole of the Harvey Catchment area.

Mandurah Shire.

- (24) The whole of the area within a radius of 2 miles of the Post Office at Mandurah.
- (25) All that part of the Harvey Estuary lying south and south-east of a line drawn from the southernmost point of the eastern boundary of Murray location 372 to the northernmost point of the western boundary of reserve 2990 and all land within 20 chains of that part of the included shoreline and further including the whole of reserve A23756 and the whole of Murray locations 1209 and 720.
- (26) All that part of the Harvey River from the prolongation eastward of the southern boundary of Murray location 720 to the confluence of that river with the Harvey Estuary and all land within 20 chains of that part of the river's banks.

Manjimup Shire.

- (27) All that part of the waters of Lake Muir lying north and east of a line drawn from the north-eastern corner of Nelson Location 1330, to the northernmost point of Nelson Location 9246, and all within 80 chains of the north-western, northern and eastern shores of the said lake between the said locations.
- (28) The whole of the waters of Byenup Lagoon and all land and waters within 3 miles of its shores, including the whole of the waters of Tordit-Gurrup Lagoon, and Poorginup, Neeranup and Coorinup Swamps and all land within 80 chains of their shores.

Mundaring Shire.

- (29) The whole of the waters of Lake Leschenaultia and all the land within 20 chains of its shores.

Murray Shire.

- (30) All that portion of the Serpentine River from road 8629 at the southern end of Goegrup (Willies) Lake to Peel Inlet near the Old Mill and all the land within 20 chains of the river banks.
- (31) All that part of the Harvey Estuary lying south and south-east of a line drawn from the southernmost point of the eastern boundary of Murray location 372 to the northernmost point of the western boundary of reserve 2990 and all land within 20 chains of that part of the included shoreline and further including the whole of reserve A23756 and the whole of Murray locations 1209 and 720.
- (32) All that part of the Harvey River from the prolongation eastwards of the southern boundary of Murray location 720 to the confluence of that river with the Harvey Estuary and all land within 20 chains of that part of the river's banks.

Rockingham Shire.

- (33) The whole of the shire of Rockingham.

Toodyay Shire.

- (34) All that portion of the Avon River in the Toodyay District between the northern boundary of Avon Location 3 and a point opposite road number 2069, and all land within 20 chains of the river banks.
- (35) All that portion of the Avon River from Dumbarton Bridge to the Railway Bridge north of Toodyay, and all land within 20 chains of the river banks.

Upper Blackwood.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Yilgarn Town Planning Scheme No. 1. (Southern Cross Townsite) hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the maps in the Appendices hereto.

3.13 Within those areas delineated on the Approved Planning Scheme Map as Rural Zone the use of any land or buildings for any purpose other than the following is hereby prohibited:—

- (a) Rural use.
- (b) All uses permitted within the Residential "A" Zone.
- (c) Roads.
- (d) Mining operations.
- (e) Utility installations.

PART IV.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

4.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), or any other law authorising the development to be carried out had been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Responsible Authority has been obtained in writing;

(b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this part on that land, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

4.3 Discontinuance of Non-conforming Use.

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Responsible Authority may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

PART V.—GENERAL PROVISION.

Plot Ratios and Site Coverage.

5.1 Within the Commercial "A" and Commercial "B" zones, no new buildings shall be constructed or existing building altered or re-built unless the plot ratio thereof does not exceed 1.2.

5.2 Within the Commercial "A" and Commercial "B" zones no new building shall be constructed or existing building altered or re-built unless the site coverage thereof does not exceed 0.6.

5.3 Within the residential "B" zone, no building shall be constructed, or existing building altered or re-built on a lot except in conformity with the provisions of Table 213A of the Uniform General Building By-laws 1965 (as amended).

Building Lines.

5.4 No building shall be constructed closer to the frontage of the lot on which it stands than the distances prescribed hereunder:—

- (a) In a Residential "A" zone—25 ft.
- (b) In a Residential "B" zone—in conformity with the provisions of Table 213A of the Uniform General Building By-laws, 1965 (as amended).
- (c) In an Industrial zone—30 ft.

PART VI.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

6.1. Disposal of Land: The Responsible Authority may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

6.2. Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purposes of Part II shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part II shall apply.

6.3. Entry to Premises: The Responsible Authority may by its engineer or other authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

6.4. Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.
