WHEREAS it is enacted by section two of the Traffic Act Amendment Act (No. 2), 1968 that that Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby fix the 20th December, 1968, as the date on which the Traffic Act Amendment Act (No. 2), 1968 shall come into operation.

TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-1968.

Police 65/1181.

I, JAMES FREDERICK CRAIG, being the Minister of the Crown to whom, at the date hereof, the administration of the Traffic Act, 1919 (as amended) is committed, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by that Act and the Interpretation Act, 1918-1962, do, for the purpose of the former Act, approve of—

- (a) apparatus bearing the trade name, "Breathalyzer", together with any ancillary apparatus or fitting supplied for use therewith, as apparatus for ascertaining the percentage of alcohol in the blood of a person by analysis of his breath; and
- (b) apparatus bearing the trade name, "Alcotest", together with any accessory or fitting supplied for use therewith, as apparatus providing an indication as to whether or not the percentage of alcohol in the blood of a person equals, or exceeds, a predetermined percentage.
