Child Welfare Act, 1947-1967.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 19 (2) (a) of the Child Welfare Act, 1947-1967, it is provided that the Governor may appoint such persons, male or female, as he may think fit, to be members of any particular Children's Court and may determine the respective Children's Court and may determine the respective seniorities of such members; and whereas by section 19 (1) (b) (ii) of the said Act the Governor may amend, vary or revoke any such appointment: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby appoint the persons named in the First Schedule hereto to be Members of the Children's Court at Bunbury and doth hereby revoke the appointments of the persons named in the Second Schedule hereto as Members of the Children's Court at Bunbury.

Land Act, 1933-1968.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1968, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. 11078/97.—That Class "A" Reserve No. 8979 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Donnybrook in trust for the purpose of Park Lands.

Corres. 3591/47.—That Reserve No. 22687 should vest in and be held by the Town of Kalgoorlie in trust for the purpose of Public Recreation.

Corres. 2882/64.—That Reserve No. 29518 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Perth in trust for the purpose of Pedestrian Accessway.

Corres. 1395/68.—That Reserve No. 29541 should vest in and be held by The Western Australian Wild Life Authority in trust for the purpose of Wild Life Sanctuary.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies, in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Factories and Shops Act, 1963-1965.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by subsection (2) of section 85 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1963-1965 that where any shop is situate in the municipal district of the Shire of Yilgarn, the shop shall, subject to the provisions contained in the Division of that Act relating to particular classes of shops, be kept closed as provided in subsection (1) of that section, except that on Wednesday of each week the shop shall be closed from and after one o'clock in the afternoon and on Saturday of each week shall be closed from and after six o'clock in the afternoon, and whereas it is further enacted by subsection (3) of section 85 of the above Act that where the majority of shopkeepers of shops situate in a municipal district referred to in subsection (2) of that section, makes written application to the Minister to close their shops during the times referred to in subsection (1) of the section, the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister. by Order in Council direct accordingly, and on the making of the order, subsection (1) of the section shall apply, subject to the Act, to the shops situate in that municipal district; and whereas a majority of shopkeepers of shops situate in the

municipal district of the Shire of Yilgarn have made a written application to the Minister to close their shops during the times referred to in subsection (1) of the abovementioned section and the Minister has recommended accordingly to the Governor: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of Executive Council, doth direct that the shopkeepers of shops situate in the Shire of Yilgarn shall close their shops during the times referred to in subsection (1) of section 85 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1963-1965, instead of as provided in subsection (2) of that section.


