

#### PART 1.—PRELIMINARY.

- 1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Mt. Marshall Town Planning Scheme No. 1 hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the Government Gazette.
- 1.2 The scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in Map No. 1 in the schedule hereto.
- 1.3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Mt. Marshall hereinafter called "the Council".
- $1.4\,$  Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme Text is divided into the following Parts:

Part 1—Preliminary.
Part 2—Reserved Land.
Part 3—Zones.
Part 4—Non-conforming Uses.

Part 5—General Provisions.
Part 6—Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are as follows:-

Map No. 1—Existing Land Use Map. Map No. 2—Scheme Map.

1.5 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations 1967, unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

# PART 2.—RESERVED LAND.

Reservation of Land and Development Thereof.

- 2.1 (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the approved planning Scheme Map.
- (b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.
- (c) In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve, and shall in the case of land reserved for the purpose of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.
- (d) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance, for which the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, of buildings and works lawfully existing on the land.

- (a) Where a Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes or grants approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant, the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.
- (b) Claims for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

#### PART 3.—ZONES.

3.1 The Scheme area is divided into eight types of zones set out hereunder:-

> Residential. Commercial. Hotel. Service Station. Private Clubs, Halls, Institutions. Industrial. Light Industrial. Civic Uses.

- 3.2 Table No. 1 appended to clause 3.3 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left hand side of the table and the list of "zones" on the top of the table.
- 3.3 The symbols used in the cross reference in the Table No. 1 appended to this clause the Table No. 1 appended have the following meanings:—
  - "P" A use that is permitted as of right provisions under the of Scheme.
  - "AA" A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by Council.
    - "X" A use that is not permitted.

# PART 4.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

- 4.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent-
  - (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
  - (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), and any other law authorising the development to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current. and was current.
- (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part 2 of the scheme a non-conforming use exists was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections altera-tions or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing;
- (b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part 3 of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, and provided the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.
- 4.3 Change of Non-conforming Use: The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of the Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use, or is in the opinion of the Council closer to the intended uses of the zone.
  - 4.4 Discontinuance of Non-conforming Use:
    - (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, except where a change of non-conforming use has been permitted by the Council under clause 4.3, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
    - (b) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property and may enter occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

# PART 5.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

- 5.1 Any application for approval made under the provisions clause 3.3 of this Scheme shall be in writing addressed to the Clerk at the Council of the Shire of Mt. Marshall and shall contain sufficient information of the nature and purpose of the proposal as to enable the Council to determine the application taking into account the following factors:
  - (a) General amenity of the area.
  - (b) Access and traffic considerations.
  - (c) Compatibility with adjoining uses.
- 5.2 The Council shall notify the applicant within a period of sixty days from the lodging of an application to develop, made under clause 2.2 of this Scheme, its determination of the application.
- 5.3 Where the applicant is aggrieved by a decision of the Council pursuant to clause 5.2 an appeal to the Minister for his determination may be made and the decision of the Minister shall be final.

## PART 6.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

- 6.1 Disposal of Land: The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such a purpose may make such agreements with the other owners as it deems fit.
- 6.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purpose of Part 2 shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the Government Gazette, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part 2 shall apply.
- 6.3 Entry to Premises: The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.
- 6.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

# VERMIN ACT, 1918-1965.

Agriculture Protection Board, South Perth, 31st January, 1969.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by subsection (1) of section 140 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1965, that the Agriculture Protection Board may, by declaration in the Government Gazette, declare any class or classes of animal, bird or insect, whether at large or not, or by reason of being at large, to be vermin, for the purposes of that Act, in respect of the whole or any part of the State and may, in like manner, vary or cancel any declaration so made: Now, therefore, the Agriculture Protection Board, acting under the provisions of the said subsection cancels the Declaration of Wedge-tailed Eagles (Aquila audax) as vermin throughout the whole of the State, and in its place declares Wedge-tailed Eagles (Aquila audax) to be vermin for that part of the State comprising the municipal districts of Ashburton, Broome, Carnarvon, Coolgardie, Cue, Kalgoorlie, Laverton, Leonora, Marble Bar, Meekatharra, Menzies, Murchison, Nullagine, Port Hedland, Roebourne, Sandstone, Tableland, Upper Gascoyne and Wiluna.
