Cemeteries Act, 1897. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, BY TO WIT,

WHEREAS by section 5 of the Cemeteries Act, 1897, the Governor may appoint such place or places in each district as he shall deem expedient a reserve for the burial of the dead; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 29350, Nelson Location 12970 should be reserved for the burial of the dead: Now, therefore, the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth by this Proclamation appoint Reserve 29350, Nelson Location 12970 as a reserve for the burial of the dead, to be known as the Manjimup Lawn Cemetery.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said State, at Perth, this 5th day of February, 1969.

> Constitution Act, 1889. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889, whereby the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council, does not apply to minor appointments which by

Act of Legislature or by Order in Council may be vested in the heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State; and whereas it is desirable that the appointment of persons as it is desirable that the appointment of persons as employees of the Forests Department and its branches at a daily or weekly rate of wages should be vested in Noel Graham Ashcroft or any person appointed to temporarily act in place of such officer. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice of the Executive Council hereby vests in Noel Graham Ashcroft and any person appointed to temporarily act in place of such officer the appointment of persons as employees of the Forests Department and its branches ployees of the Forests Department and its branches at a daily or weekly rate of wages.

Constitution Act, 1889. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 59/65.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889, by which the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council, does not apply to minor appointments, which by Order in Council are vested in heads of Departments, or other officers or persons within the State; and whereas it is desirable that the minor appointments of persons who are exempt from the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1904, employed by the Department of Lands and Surveys should be vested in Charles Walter Connor (Accountant) and that the like powers vested in Frederick William Byfield by Order in Council dated 1st June, 1966, shall be cancelled: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council by and with the advice of the Executive Council hereby declares that the power of making such minor appointments shall vest and the same is hereby vested in Charles Walter Connor (Accountant), and that the like powers vested in Frederick William Byfield by Order in Council dated 1st June, 1966, shall be cancelled accordingly.

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1966. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by subsection (2) of section (5) of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1966, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, adjust the boundaries of a fire district; and whereas by an Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 3rd day of March, 1961, a portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Armadale-Kelmscott was constituted a fire district with the name Armadale Fire District; and whereas it is deemed expedient to adjust the boundaries of that fire district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby adjust the boundaries of the Armadale Fire District by substituting for the portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Armadale-Kelmscott described in the Schedule to the abovementioned Order in Council the portion of the municipal district of that Shire set out in the schedule to this Order in Council.

the eastern alignment of Derby Avenue; thence generally southerly along that alignment to the southwestern corner of location 1766 thence generally south-southeasterly and east-northeasterly along boundaries of lot 83 of Location 31 afore-said, as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 25678 to the westernmost western corner of lot 84 as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 30684; thence generally south-southeasterly along western boundaries of that lot to its southern corner; thence northeasterly and south easterly along boundaries of lot 7, as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 10028 to the northeastern boundaries. Onice Diagram 10028 to the northeastern boundary of lot 2, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 4995; thence generally southeasterly and southerly along boundaries of that lot and onwards to the southern side of Albany Highway (Road Number 6963); thence easterly along that side to the northernmost northeastern corner of part of least time 1 and 1 of location 31, as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 9324; thence southerly along the northernmost eastern boundary of that part and on-wards to the southern boundary; thence westerly along that boundary to the southernmost south-western corner of that part; thence south to a point situate east of the northeastern corner of Part of lot 195, as shown on Certificate of Titles Volume 1060, folio 380, thence west to that corner; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of that part and onwards to the southern alignment of Road Number 4592; thence generally easterly of Road Number 4592; thence generally easterly along that alignment to the northern corner of location 1792; thence generally southerly along western boundaries of that location to the eastern corner of lot 95, as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 26185; thence southwesterly along the southeastern boundary of that lot to its southeastern corner; thence southerly to and along eastern boundaries of lots 79 to 76 inclusive, and shown on Land Titles Office Plan 6723 and onwards to and along eastern boundaries of lots 73 and 72 to the southeastern corner of the lastmentioned lot; thence westerly along southern boundaries of that lot and lots 71 to 66 inclusive and lot 64 to the eastern side of the South Western Highway; thence generally northerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the southern boundary of location 1187; thence westerly to and along that boundary and onwards westerly to and along that boundary and onwards to the western side of the southwestern Railway Reserve aforesaid; thence southerly along that side Reserve aforesaid; thence southerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the southern boundary of lot 67 of location 31 aforesaid, as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 27225; thence westerly to and along that boundary and onwards to a point situate in prolongation southeasterly of the southwestern boundary of lot 10, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 2573; thence northwesterly along that prolongation to the southern corner of that lot; thence southwesterly along the northwestern boundary of lot 12 westerly along the northwestern boundary of lot 12, as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 26982 to the southwestern side of Eighth Road (Road to the southwestern side of Eighth Road (Road Number 5639); thence northwesterly along that side and onwards to a point situate in prolongation southwesterly of the northwestern boundary of lot 35, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 3400; thence northeasterly to and along that boundary and the northwestern boundary of lot 36 to the western corner of lot 121, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 4857; thence northeasterly along northwestern boundaries of that lot and lots 122 to 132 inclusive and onwards to and along northto 132 inclusive and onwards to and along north-western boundaries of lots 12 to 7 inclusive and lot 4 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 6867 to the southwestern side of Little John Road aforesaid and thence northwesterly along that side to the starting point.

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1966. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1966, that, subject to the provisions of that section, the municipal and road districts and parts thereof constituted as fire districts prior to the coming into

operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, as set out in the Second Schedule to the Act, are for the purposes of the Act fire districts under the respective names as set out in that Schedule; and whereas it is further enacted, inter alia, by subsection (2) of that section that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, adjust the boundaries of a fire district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby adjust the boundaries of the Kwinana Fire District as set forth in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act by substituting for the Road District of Kwinana referred to in that Part of the Schedule that portion of the Municipal District of the Shire of Kwinana set forth in the schedule to this Order in Council.

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1966.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1966, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, constitute as a fire district any portion of a district of a local authority which after the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, is not a fire district, assign a name to a fire district in Part IV of the Second Schedule

to the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby—

- (a) constitute that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Quairading, more particularly described in the schedule hereunder, a fire district;
- (b) assign the name Quairading Fire District to that district; and
- (c) include in column one of Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act, "Quairading Fire District", and in column two opposite that name the name of the local authority, "Shire of Quairading".

Land Act, 1933-1968. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres 4829/19.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of subleasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 29644 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Woodanilling, in trust for the purpose of Public Recreation: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Woodanilling, in trust for Public Recreation, with power to the said Shire of Woodanilling, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first

obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Land Act, 1933-1968. ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1968, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. 1857/67.—That Reserve No. 29307 should vest in and be held by the Minister for Works in trust for the purpose of a "School Site".

(The Order in Council dated 22nd August, 1968, is hereby superseded.)

Corres. 2569/68.—That Reserve No. 29584 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Koorda in trust for the purpose of "Aged Persons' Homes".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies, in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Land Act, 1933-1968. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 9658/99.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1968, it is inter alia, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Class "B" Reserve No. 6793 (Perth Lots B15 and B15½) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to the Public Trustee to be held in trust for "Public Buildings": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid body, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Supply Act, 1947-1964 (being an Act mentioned in the Schedule to the Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912-1950), and to vest in the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage.

I, JAMES FREDERICK CRAIG, being the Minister of the Crown for the time being charged with the administration of the Traffic Act, 1919-1968, acting pursuant to regulation 1101 (4) of the Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1965, and regulation 1610 of the Road Traffic Code, 1965, give the following general direction:—

- 1. The movement of overwidth and overlength agricultural implements on roads is authorised, subject to their being towed by licensed vehicles and to the following conditions, namely—
 - (a) the movement may be made by virtue of this direction, alone—
 - (i) where the combined length of the towing vehicle and the implement or implements being towed does not exceed 50 feet;
 - (ii) where the width of a towed implement exceeds 8 ft. 2½ in., but not 10 ft. if a warning fiag is affixed at each lateral extremity of the implement; or
 - (iii) where the width of a towed implement exceeds 10 ft. but not 16 ft., if a warning fiag is affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement and a warning sign, indicating that the tow is overwidth, is affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and to the rear of the implement;
 - (b) the movement may be made by virtue of a permit which a local authority is hereby authorised to issue, where the combined length of the towing vehicle and the implement or implements being towed exceeds 50 ft., but not 70 ft., and, or alternatively, where the width of a towed implement exceeds 16 ft., but not 22 ft., if—
 - (i) in the case of an overwidth implement or implements, warning flags are affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement or implements;
 - (ii) the movement is preceded by a pilot vehicle bearing a sign indicating that an overwidth, overlength or both overwidth and overlength vehicle follows it and the movement is followed by a pilot vehicle bearing a sign indicating that such a vehicle is ahead of it, unless the local authority, having regard to the topography of the area and environment in which the tow is to operate or any other factors likely to affect the safe movement of the tow, dispenses with the requirement of a following pilot vehicle;
 - (iii) a warning sign indicating that the tow is overwidth, overlength or both overwidth and overlength are affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and to the rear of the implement or the rearmost implement; and
 - (iv) the permit is carried on the towing vehicle.
 - (c) overwidth and overlength signs are to be covered or removed on the completion of the movement;
 - (d) a movement is not to be made during the hours of darkness and a tow is not to be parked on the made portion of a road;
 - (e) where the tow comprises an overwidth implement or two or more implements, the movement is not to be made at a speed exceeding 20 m.p.h.;
 - (f) where the tow comprises an implement exceeding 10 ft. in width, the movement is not to be made within 15 miles of the

General Post Office, Perth, without the approval in writing of the Commissioner of Police.

- The movement of agricultural implements exceeding 22 ft. in width or of a combined length exceeding 70 ft. may be made pursuant to a specific ministerial authority, in each case, and not other-
- A permit issued by a local authority pursuant to this direction shall be in accordance with regulation 12 of the Traffic (Licensing Authorities) Regulations, 1965, and may be issued in respect of a single movement or in respect of a number of movements, within a period not exceeding three months.
- 4. The directions published in Government Gazette No. 24, on the 10th March, 1967, are numbered and may be cited as follows:
 - appearing on page 696 of that Gazette-Direction No. 1;
 - (b) that firstly appearing on page 697 of that Gazette-Direction No. 2; and
 - (c) that secondly appearing on page 697, and continuing on page 698, of that Gazette-Direction No. 3.
 - 5. Direction No. 1 is rescinded.
 - 6. Direction No. 3 is amended, as to Clause 1-
 - (a) by substituting for the expression, "8 ft.", in line two of subparagraph (i) of paragraph (b), the expression, "8 ft. $2\frac{1}{2}$ in.";
 - (b) by adding after the word, "not", in line four of subparagraph (iv) of paragraph (b), the passage, ", without the approval in writing of the Commissioner of Police,"; and
 - (c) by substituting for the expression, "8 ft.", in line three of subparagraph (i) of paragraph (c), the expression, "8 ft. 2½ in.".

- 1. Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Bayswater Town Planning Scheme No. 14—Bunya Road Scheme (herinafter called "the Scheme").
- 2. Responsible Authority: The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Bayswater (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").
- 3. Maps: The following maps are attached to this text and form part of the Scheme:—

Map No. 1. Scheme Area.

Map No. 2. Existing Land Use.

Map No. 3. Scheme Proposals.

4. Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within the inner edge of a blue border on the Land Use Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area."

- 5. General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are:—
 - (a) To improve and develop the Scheme Area to the best possible advantage.
 - (b) To make provision for the better use of the land within the Scheme Area for building purposes.
 - (c) To make suitable provision for roads and traffic within the Scheme Area.
 - (d) To ensure the proper drainage of those parts of the Scheme Area that require drainage.
 - (e) To make provision for public open space within the Scheme Area.
 - within the Scheme Area.

 (f) All land within the Scheme Area is to be supplied with reticulated water.
- 6. Scheme Works: The following works shall be carried out within the Scheme Area:—
 - (a) The Scheme Area shall be surveyed in conformity with the design shown on the Scheme Proposals Map with such minor variations as may be determined from time to time by the Council.
 - (b) The lands shown as roads on the Scheme Proposals Map of which the carriageway is coloured yellow shall be constructed and drained and any necessary earth work undertaken.
 - (c) Levelling filling and drainage works shall be carried out where necessary or desirable.
 - (d) Those buildings and fences which in the opinion of the Council interfere with the proper development of the land within the Scheme Area according to the new subdivision will be demolished or otherwise removed and in cases considered desirable by the Council such fences and buildings may be re-erected.
 - (e) The reticulation of water to the new lots within the Scheme Area.
- 7. Acquisition of Land: The land within the Scheme Area or so much thereof as is in the opinion of the Council necessary to implement the Scheme shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council.
- 8. Closure of Roads: The roads and rights of way hatched diagonally on Map No. 3 will be closed and the land used for the purposes shown thereon.
- 9. Method of Dealing with New Lots in Scheme Area: The lots shown on the Scheme Proposals Map within the Scheme Area shall be dealt with as follows:—
 - (a) The new lots shown in Column No. 2 of the Schedule hereto shall be offered to the owners of the old lots on the Existing Land Use Map shown opposite in Column No. 1 of the Schedule. The offer shall be made on the basis that if accepted the owner shall accept the lot or lots so offered in full settlement of all claims for compensation in respect of the resumption from him of the lot or portion thereof on the Existing Land Use Map in respect of which the offer is made and otherwise in respect of the operation of this Scheme.
 - (b) The lots shown as Surplus Lots in the Schedule hereto shall be treated as surplus lots and may be dealt with by the Council as hereinafter appears.
 - (c) The land coloured green on the Scheme Proposals May shall be set aside for public open space.
 - (d) The land coloured pink situated on the eastern side of the Scheme Area shall remain vested in the Council and may be sold or otherwise vested as the Council shall think fit. If the Council shall sell or dispose of the whole or any portion of the said land coloured pink the proceeds of such sale shall not be credited to the Scheme but may be retained by the Council and shall be used for the development and improvement of Public Open Space within the Scheme Area or within a distance of 1 mile.

- 10. Nature of Offer: The offers mentioned in the preceding clause shall be made in writing to each of the said owners and shall be served by registered post on him at his address as appearing in the Rate Book of the Council, and shall specify the new lot on the Scheme Proposals Map, the subject of the offer and the old lot or part thereof on the Existing Land Use Map in respect of which the offer is made.
- 11. The offer shall specify a date not being less than twenty-eight (28) days after the posting of the said offer within which the offer may be accepted.
- 12. The offer may be accepted by notice in writing to the Council at any time before the date specified in the said offer or within such extended time as may be determined by the Council and if the offer shall not be accepted within such time or extended time the offer shall be deemed to have been rejected.
- 13. If any offer be accepted it shall be accepted by the owner in full settlement and satisfaction of all claims for compensation in respect of the resumption from him of the old lot in respect of which the offer was made and otherwise in respect of the operation of this Scheme.
- 14. An owner who accepts an offer shall be liable to pay to the Council all rates which would have been payable on the land acquired from such owner if such land had remained in the name of the owner until the transfer of the new lot to him.
- 15. Registration of Transfers: The Council shall cause to be prepared and sent to those owners entitled transfers in respect of each lot offered and which has been accepted by the owner in accordance with this Scheme. If an owner shall fail to complete the transfer in accordance with the Transfer of Land Act, 1893 (as amended) and return it to the Council for registration within twenty-eight (28) days after having been called upon to do so by notice served by registered post on the owner at his address last known to the Council (which notice may be served with the Transfer) the Council may rescind any agreement whereby such owner is entitled to have the land the subject of the Transfer transferred to him and thereupon such owner shall have a claim against the Council only for compensation for the resumption of the said land the subject of the Transfer and the said lot shall be treated as a rejected lot.
- 16. Rejected Lots: If an owner does not accept an offer made to him by the Council in accordance with this Scheme or fails to complete a Transfer of the said lot in manner aforesaid the Council may deal with the lots so affected as hereinafter appears.
- 17. Sale of Surplus Lots and Rejected Lots: The Council may sell any surplus lots and any rejected lots either by public auction tender or private contract as a whole or in separate lots and upon such terms and conditions as the Council shall think fit. In the event of a sale by private contract the price shall not be less than the price recommended by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia unless after submitting the land for sale by public auction or tender that price has not been obtained, in which case the Council may sell at a price not less than 10 per cent. below the price recommended by the Chief Valuer.
- 18. Valuation of Surplus Lots and Rejected Lots: The Council may instead of selling any of the surplus lots or rejected lots ascertain the value of them or those unsold from the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia and credit the Scheme with the value so ascertained and in that event the lots shall be the property of the Council and may be retained sold or otherwise dealt with in such manner as the Council shall think fit.
- 19. Costs of Scheme: The proceeds of the sale of surplus and rejected lots shall be applied towards the costs of the Scheme. The remainder of all costs of and incidental to the Scheme shall be paid by the Council.

- 20. Profits of Scheme: If the Scheme shall show a profit the amount of the profit shall be divided by the number of old lots on the Existing Land Use Map whose owners accept the offers made to them pursuant to the terms of this Scheme and shall be paid to such owners according to the number of old lots on the Existing Land Use Map in respect of which the offers were made.




