AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber at Perth this 7th day of May, 1969, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Local Government Act, 1960-1968. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided (*inter alia*) by section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended) that, where at least ten per centum of the number of the persons whose names appear on the municipal roll of a municipality of a district or fifty of them, whichever is the lesser number, have signed a petition praying for the exercise of the power of the abolition of the district and the dissolution of the municipality of the district and the petition has been prepared, verified and effectively presented in accordance with the appropriate provisions of Division 8 of Part III of the Act, the Governor may make an Order exercising the power and may, pursuant to section 20 of the Act, direct who, if any, of the members of the council whose district is affected by the exercise of that power shall go out of office and when; and whereas at least fifty of the persons whose names appear on the municipal roll of the municipality of the Town of Boulder have signed such a petition and the petition has been prepared, verified and effectively presented in accordance with the provisions abovementioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Town of Boulder and dissolve the municipality of the Town of Boulder and dissolve the municipality of that district and doth include that district in that of the municipality of the Shire of Kalgoorlie and direct that, on the date abovementioned, the members of the council of the municipality of the Town of Boulder shall go out of office.

Local Government Act, 1960-1968. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended) that the Governor may (*inter alia*), by Order—

- (a) give such directions as he thinks necessary to make the number of offices of member of a council conform to the limits imposed by the Act;
- (b) direct who, if any, of the members of the council whose district is affected by the exercise of a power under section 12 of the Act shall go out of office, and when;
- (c) direct the holding on a day appointed by the Order, being a day within a period of six months from the date of the Order, of an election of the members affected by a direction such as is mentioned in paragraph (b) hereof;
- (d) order, settle, adjust and finally determine questions and matters relating to the

representation of electors on the counci of a municipality affected as mentione(in paragraphs (b) and (c) hereof; and

(e) where a municipality has no council and the offices of all the members of the council become vacant appoint such person as he thinks fit to be a commissioner of the municipality;

And whereas by reason of the abolition of the district of the Town of Boulder, the dissolution of the municipality of that district and the inclusion of that district in that of the municipality of the Shire of Kalgoorlie it is expedient that the Governor do all of the things hereinbefore mentioned Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, doth by this Order, as regards the municipality of the Shire of Kalgoorlie.—

- (f) direct that the number of offices of member of the council, including the president and councillors, shall, after the 30th June 1969, be thirteen;
- (g) direct that all members of the council including the president, shall go out of office on the 30th June, 1969;
- (h) direct the holding, on the 12th July, 1969 of an election of the members of the council;
- (i) direct that for the purposes of the election to be held as required by paragraph (h) hereof the latest settled rolls of the municipality of the Town of Boulder and the municipality of the Shire of Kalgoorlie shall constitute the roll of electors; and
- (j) appoint John Salsbury Parrott to be commissioner of the municipality from the 1st July, 1969, until the election of the members of the council as provided by this Order.

LAKE MONGER TOWN PLANNING SCHEME.

Scheme Text.

The City of Perth Town Planning Scheme No. 4. THE Perth City Council, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) and the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act, 1959 (as amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

PART I.--PRELIMINARY.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the City of Perth Town Planning Scheme No 4 (Lake Monger area) hereinafter called "thu Scheme" and shall come into operation on thu publication of notice of the Minister's final approva thereof in the Government Gazette. 1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the maps forming part of the Scheme.

1.3 The Scheme is complementary to, and is not a substitute for, the Metropolitan Region Scheme, and the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Scheme, as amended from time to time, shall continue to have effect.

1.4 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the City of Perth (hereinafter referred to as the Council).

 $1.5\,$ Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme Text is divided into the following Parts:—

Part I.—Preliminary.

Part II.—Objects of the Scheme.

Part III.—Reserved Land.

Part IV.—Zones.

Part V.-Non-conforming Uses.

Part VI.—General Provisions.

Part VII.—Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are as follows:---

(1) Land Use Map.

(2) Scheme Map.

1.6 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "B" of the Town Planning Regulations, 1967, unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

PART II.—OBJECTS OF THE SCHEME.

The general objects of the Scheme are-

- (a) to provide for the orderly and optimum development of vacant land owned by the City of Perth in the Scheme Area;
- (b) to carry out a survey of land owned by the City of Perth and subdivide the same in accordance with the design shown on the Scheme Map and to sell any lot or lots so created to private developers;
- (c) to facilitate the development and use of land within the Scheme Area, owned by persons other than the City of Perth, for high density residential purposes;
- (d) to provide for a primary school site within the Scheme Area in accordance with the requirements of that area;
- (e) to provide for necessary amenities including children's playgrounds, public open spaces, a parking area and traffic free pedestrian and cycle path systems;
- (f) to make suitable provision for local roads within the Scheme Area, and to close Seabrook Street south of Britannia Street;
- (g) to acquire such land as may be necessary for the provision of pedestrian access way as shown on the Scheme Map;
- (h) to effect other matters authorised by the Enabling Act.

PART III.-RESERVED LAND.

3.1 (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the Scheme Map, and the reservations of the Metropolitan Region Scheme are shown in the Scheme in order to comply with the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act. (b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.

(c) In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.

(d) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme have the force of law, or the repair and maintenance, for which the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

3.2 An application to develop reserved land for cultural, educational or recreation purposes may be approved or refused by the Council. The Council may approve an application subject to such conditions as it thinks fit to impose.

3.3 (a) Where the Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant, the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.

(b) Claims for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

(c) In lieu of paying compensation the Council may purchase the land affected by such decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

PART IV .--- ZONES.

4.1 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Scheme and without affecting the generality of clause 1 of Part I, the Council may, with the consent of the Minister, or when required by the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority so to do, shall require that the development of any land within the District, however zoned, shall be subject to the provisions of clauses 10, 24 and 30 of the Metropolitan Region Scheme.

4.2 The Scheme Area with the exception of land reserved under Part III hereof is defined as a General Residential Zone and classified as class 6 (GR. 6) for the purposes of the Uniform General Building By-laws. For the purposes of the Scheme the land coloured brown is further defined and hereafter called GR. 6 and the land coloured pink is further defined and hereafter called GR. 6 Town Houses.

4.3 Subject to clause 5.1 hereof no building shall be erected and no land or building shall be used or adapted for use for any purpose other than a purpose permitted in the zone in which such land or building is situated.

4.4 Land in the areas defined as GR. 6 and GR. 6 Town Houses is classified for use for the purposes indicated in the second column of the Table to this clause. The abbreviation:---

- (a) "P" means that the land may be used for such purpose;
- (b) "AA" means that the land shall not be used for such purpose unless approval is granted by the Council;
- (c) "X" means that the land shall not be used for such purposes.

For the purposes of the Table to this clause use classes are categorised in groups having letters and numbers.

4.5 Where an application is made to the Council to use land for a purpose which, under the provisions of the foregoing Table, requires the Council's approval the Council shall, before granting such approval, give notice to owners and occupiers of land in the vicinity of the land in respect of which the application is made who, in the opinion of the Council, may be affected by such use if approval is granted.

4.6 No building erected on that area of land bounded by Oxford Street, Bourke Street, a line 340 feet west of Oxford Street and a line 860 feet north of Bourke Street, shall exceed three storeys in height.

PART V.-NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

5.1 (a) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Scheme if on the date when this Scheme comes into operation any land or building or part of a building is being lawfully used for a purpose other than is permitted under this Scheme it shall be lawful, subject to this clause and to any statute or by-law, to continue to use such land or building or part of a building and any land directly ancillary thereto for that identical purpose but no such building shall be altered or added to unless permission to do so is first specially granted by the Council.

(b) If premises cease for a period of twelve (12) months continuously to be used for a purpose authorised by this clause they shall not thereafter be used otherwise than in conformity with this Scheme.

(c) If a building which is, or of which any part is, being used for a non-conforming use under subclause (a) of this clause is demolished to an extent of more than three-quarters of its value or is damaged to more than three-quarters of its value neither that building nor any building erected in place thereof shall thereafter be used otherwise than in conformity with this Scheme unless by special permission of the Council.

5.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part III of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in Clause 5.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing;

(b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part IV of the Scheme, a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 5.1 of this Part on that land, the Council may permit, subject to conformity with its by-laws, such land to be built upon or building to be added to or altered so as to cover so much of the allotment or allotments on which the building stands as may be lawfully built upon and on or in which the nonconforming use is in fact being carried on.

5.3 Changes of Non-Conforming Use: The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of the Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use, or is in the opinion of the Council closer to the intended uses of the zone.

5.4 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:

(a) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

PART VI.-GENERAL PROVISIONS.

6.1 Building Lines, etc.: Use Classes A1 and A2 as shown in the Table to clause 4.4 of this Scheme shall have a minimum side building line of 15 ft. 0 inch, and car parking associated with these uses shall be as prescribed by Council.

6.2 Where a Town House is erected on a lot which abuts on two streets the side wall which is parallel to one of these streets shall not be less than 10 ft. from that street.

6.3 Where the side or rear boundary of a lot on which a Town House is erected abuts on a street or reserve such boundary shall be fenced in a manner and to a height sufficient to ensure that the lot is adequately screened from such street or reserve.

6.4 Where any fence on an allotment within the Scheme area adjoins a right-of-way or reserve an opening shall be provided in such fence to permit access to such right-of-way or reserve by pedestrians.

6.5 Where more than six Town Houses are erected on adjoining lots the distance between the Town Houses and the street shall vary by at least 10 ft. at intervals of not more than six of such Town Houses unless otherwise specially approved by Council.

6.6 No more than one outbuilding other than a car port shall be erected on the same lot as a Town House. Such outbuilding shall have a floor area of not more than 50 square feet and it shall be attached to the Town House and no part further than 10 ft. 0 in. distant from it.

6.7 On any let on which a Town House is erected there shall be parking space for at least one car and such space shall be provided within the Town House building. If more than one parking space is required a carport open on all sides may be erected so as to abut upon the street.

 $6.8\,$ A garage shall not be erected within 20 feet of a street.

6.9 Any additions or outbuildings to Town Houses must be in character with the overall design and with adjacent development.

6.10~ The maximum plot ratio permitted in GR.6 area within the Scheme area shall be 1.5.

6.11 All car parking within the GR.6 area shall be screened from view in a manner satisfactory to the Council both from sides and from above. Such screen shall not be included when calculating site coverage.

6.12 All high tension and low tension electricity transmission lines shall be installed underground. Street lighting shall be provided on steel poles to a design approved by the Council.

PART VII.-FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

7.1 Disposal of Land: The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purposes may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

7.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purpose of Part III shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part III shall apply.

7.3 Entry to Premises: The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

7.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

Scheme Text.

1. Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Esperance Town Planning Scheme No. 4—Corry-Warrington Streets Scheme (hereinafter called "the Scheme").

2. Responsible Authority: The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Esperance (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

3. Maps: The following maps are attached to the Scheme Text:—

(a) Land Use Map.

(b) Scheme Map.

4. Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".

5. General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are:—

- (a) To improve and develop the Scheme Area to the best possible advantage.
- (b) To make suitable provision for the better use of the land within the Scheme Area for building purposes.
- (c) To make suitable provision for a road within the Scheme Area.
- (d) To ensure proper drainage of those parts of the Scheme Area that require drainage.

6. Scheme Works: The following works shall be undertaken:----

- (a) The Scheme Area will be re-surveyed in conformity with the design shown on the Scheme Map with such minor variations as may be determined by the Council.
- (b) The roads of which the proposed carriageway is coloured yellow on the Scheme Map will be constructed and drained.
- (c) Those new lots that in the opinion of the Council require such treatment shall be filled or drained or both to make them suitable for residential use. Any drainage line required within the Scheme Area may if deemed necessary by the Council be connected by a pipe drain to a point of discharge outside the Scheme Area and the costs thereof debited to the Scheme.
- (d) The Council shall carry out earth-works and construct retaining walls where considered necessary or desirable.

7. Acquisition of Land: The land within the Scheme Area or so much thereof as is necessary to implement the Scheme shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council.

8. Closure of Road and Rights-of-Way: Those roads which are shown on the Land Use Map and which are hatched green on the Scheme Map will be closed and the land used for the purposes shown on the Scheme Map.

9. Method of Dealing with New Lots in Scheme Area: The lots shown on the Scheme Map will be dealt with as follows:—

(a) The new lots shown in Column No.2 of the Schedule hereto will be offered to the owners of the old lots on the Land Use Map shown opposite in Column No. 1 of the Schedule. The offer shall be made on the basis that the owner shall accept the lot or lots so offered in full satisfaction of all claims for compensation in respect of the resumption from him of the lot on the Land Use Map in respect of which the offer is made and otherwise in respect of the operations of the Scheme.

(b) Lot numbers 1, 9, 13 and 14 on the Scheme Map (hereinafter referred to as "Saleable Lots") may be sold by the Council for the purpose of paying the net costs of the Scheme and for acquiring or making improvements to the land used for public recreation.

10. Nature of Offers: The offers mentioned in Clause 9 hereof shall be made in writing to each of the said Owners and served by certified post on him at his address as appearing in the rate book of the Council and shall specify the New Lot on the Scheme Map the subject of the offer and the Old Lot or part thereof on the Land Use Map in respect of which the offer is made.

11. The offer shall specify a date not being less than twenty-eight days after the posting of the said offer within which the offer may be accepted.

12. The offer may be accepted by notice in writing to the Council at any time before the date specified in the said offer and if not accepted within such time shall unless the time shall have been rejected. If a person owns more than one old lot on the Land Use Map he shall not be obliged to accept or reject all offers made to him but may accept one or more only of the offers of replacement lots.

13. An owner who accepts an offer shall be liable to pay to the Council all rates which would otherwise have been payable on the land acquired from him in respect of which the offer was made as if such land had remained in the name of the owner until the transfer of the new lot to him.

14. If an offer be accepted it shall be accepted by the owner in full settlement and satisfaction of all claims for compensation in respect of the resumption from him of the old lot in respect of which the offer was made and otherwise in respect of the operation of this Scheme relating to such lot.

15. Registration of Transfers: The Council shall cause to be prepared and sent to those owners entitled transfers in respect of each lot offered and which has been accepted by the owner in accordance with this Scheme. If an owner shall fail to complete the transfer in accordance with the Transfer of Land Act 1893 (as amended) to make the payment of the amount (if any) payable by him and return the transfer to the Council for registration within twenty-eight days after having been called upon to do so by notice served by certified post on the owner at his address last known to the Council (which notice may be served with the transfer) the Council may rescind any agreement whereby such owner is entitled to have the land the subject of the transfer transferred to him and thereupon such owner shall have a claim against the Council only for compensation for the resumption of the land in respect of which the offer of the replacement lot or lots was made and the land the subject of the transfer shall be treated as a saleable lot.

16. Sale of Saleable Lots and Rejected Lots: The Council may sell all or any of the saleable lots or the rejected lots either by public auction or private contract as a whole or in separate lots or groups of lots upon such terms and conditions as the Council thinks fit. The Council may retain any lot not sold. The net proceeds of the sale of saleable lots shall be applied towards the net costs of the Scheme.

17. Valuation of Saleable or Rejected Lots: The Council may instead of selling all or any of the saleable or rejected lots ascertain the value of them or of those unsold from the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia and credit the Scheme with the value so ascertained and in that event the lots shall be the property of the Council and may be retained sold or otherwise dealt with in such manner as the Council thinks fit.

18. Expenses of Scheme: The expenses of the Scheme shall be paid by the Council.

19. Public Open Space: The surplus of money received by the Council from the sale of the saleable lots after the payment of the costs of the (2)-60669 Scheme shall be applied in the acquisition or improvement of land for public recreation in the vicinity of the Scheme Area.

20. Encumbrances on Title: In the event of any land in the Scheme Area being subject to a registered mortgage charge or lease or to a caveat to protect the interest of the purchaser mortgagee chargee or lessee the Council shall not transfer a new lot to the owner unless subject to similar encumbrances or with the consent of all persons entitled to the benefit of the encumbrance nor without such consent will the Council make any payment to such owner.

21. Powers of Council: The Council in the conduct and management of this Scheme shall have the following powers:—

- (a) To enter and inspect the land within the Scheme Area.
- (b) To enter into agreements or arrangements with the owners of any land within the Scheme Area.
- (c) To acquire by purchase resumption or otherwise any land within the Scheme Area.
- (d) To carry out road construction drainage improvements and other works within the Scheme Area.
- (e) To extend the time within which any offer of replacement lots may be accepted.
- (f) To extend the time within which payments shall be made to the Council.
- (g) To dispose of any saleable lots and any lots to which it becomes entitled upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition the buildings of a specified character shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specified purpose.
- (h) To enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers of land within the Scheme Area.
- (i) To transfer any land acquired by it in pursuance of this Scheme as compensation or part compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation.
- (j) With the consent of all owners affected thereby to alter the allocation of any replacement lots or saleable lots.
- (k) If an owner be offered more than one replacement lot and does not desire to accept all lots offered to enter into such agreements with the owner as seem to the Council to be equitable.
- (1) To demolish all or any of the buildings or fences within the Scheme Area which interfere with the carrying out of the Scheme.
- (m) To create drainage and other easements.
- (n) To make such minor variations to the subdivisional design as the Council considers necessary.

22. Time Limit for Claims for Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of this Scheme shall be made within six months of the coming into operation of this Scheme or the date of the issue of a notice of resumption or the issue of a notice of rescission under Clause 15 hereof whichever is the later.
