FREMANTLE PORT AUTHORITY ACT, 1902-1965.

THE Fremantle Port Authority, acting pursuant to the provisions of the Fremantle Port Authority Act, 1902-1965, hereby makes the regulations set forth in the schedule hereunder.

Principal Regulations.

1. In these regulations, the regulations made by the Fremantle Port Authority, under the Fremantle Port Authority Act, 1902-1965, reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, and published as so reprinted in the Government Gazette on the 14th September, 1967, with all amendments up to and including the 14th February, 1966, and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.

Outward Cargo.

The rates of wharfage and handling charges on Outward Cargo shall be as under, provided that in order to qualify for the rates of Wharfage provided therefore in the Schedule of this regulation goods wholly manufactured within the State and products of the soil of the State, as prescribed in Regulation No. 147, must be declared as such in such manner as the Authority may from time to time require, at the time of delivery for shipment.
