- (b) Urban Land (all land within a townsite or within any other area subdivided for residential purposes).
  - (1) You shall—
    - (a) where the area of the land is one half of one acre or less remove all inflammable material on the land from the whole of the land, and
    - (b) where the area of the land exceeds one half of one acre, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least 6 feet wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings and/or haystacks or groups of buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 8th day of December, 1969, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Dumbleyung.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 1st day of November, 1969, or within fourteen days of the date of your becoming owner or occupier should this be after the 1st day of November, 1969, to remove from the land owned or occupied by you all inflammable material or to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following and thereafter to maintain the land or the firebreaks clear of the inflammable material up to and including the 31st day of March, 1970:—

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove infiammable material from land as required by this notice you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 15th October, 1969, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

"Infiammable Material" is defined for the purpose of this Order to include bush (as defined in the Bush Fires Act), timber boxes, cartons, paper like inflammable materials, rubbish and also any combustible matter but does not include green standing trees, or growing bushes and plants in gardens or lawns.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$200 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

- (5) In respect of land within any Townsite within the Shire you shall—
  - (a) where the area is one half acre or less, remove all inflammable material on the land from the whole of the land,
  - (b) where the area of land exceeds one half of one acre firebreaks, not less than SIX feet wide, shall be prepared inside and along the whole of the boundary of the land.

If for any reason it is considered impracticable to provide firebreaks in the position required by this Notice, the approval of the Shire Council must be obtained to construct such firebreaks in an alternative position. Approval to any variation will only be granted where a Bush Fire Control Officer has first signified his approval of the variation.

- 1 In respect of land owned or occupied by you within the Metropolitan Fire District (as defined hereunder) you shall, on or before the 14th day of December, 1969 or within fourteen days of the date. of your becoming owner or occupier, should this be after the 14th day of December 1969, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least 10 feet wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land, and thereafter maintain the firebreaks clear of all inflammable material up to and including the 14th day of March, 1970.
- 2. In respect of land owned or occupied by you outside the Metropolitan Fire District (as defined hereunder) you shall on or before the 14th day of November, 1969, or within fourteen days of the date of your becoming owner or occupier, should this be after the 14th day of November, 1969, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks in accordance with the following and thereafter maintain the firebreaks clear of all inflammable material up to and including the 31st day of March, 1970.
  - 2.1 Where the area of the land is one-half of one acre or less, clear of all infiammable material firebreaks at least 10 feet wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land; and
  - 2.2 where the area of the land exceeds one-half of one acre, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least 6 feet wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, owners and occupiers of land within the Shire of Plantagenet are required to remove from the land owned or occupied by them all inflammable material or to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following, and thereafter maintain the land or the firebreaks clear of all inflammable material up to and including the 31st day of May, 1970.

- (1) Rural Land: Owners and Occupiers of Land other than within a townsite shall:—
  - (a) Clear firebreaks, not less than six feet wide, inside and along and within one chain of the boundaries of all land owned or occupied by them, or inside and along and within one chain of the boundaries of the land being used for pasture and for crops, other than grain producing crops.
  - (b) Clear firebreaks, not less than ten feet wide, immediately adjacent to the perimeter of all grain producing crops; irrespective of whether such grain producing crops are to be harvested or not.

As an alternative to (a) and (b) above it is permissable to clear firebreaks not less than ten feet wide, inside and along and within one chain of the boundaries of all land owned or occupied by them or inside and along and within one chain of the boundaries of all land owned or occupied by them and used for pasture and for grain producing crops; irrespective of whether such grain producing crops are to be harvested or not.

(c) Clear firebreaks not less than six feet wide around and within five chains of all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps.

All firebreaks as designated above must be prepared on or before the 15th day of November, 1969 within that portion of the Shire lying generally east of the dividing line described in Schedule No. 10 (Government Gazette No. 72 of the 2nd August, 1968, page 2276) and on or before the 1st day of December, 1969 within that portion of the Shire lying generally west of the dividing line described in Schedule No. 10 (Government Gazette No. 72 of the 2nd August, 1968 page 2276).

(2) Townsite Land: Owners or Occupiers of land within the townsite of Mount Barker, Kendenup, Narrikup and Rocky Gully, shall on or before the 22nd day of December, 1969 remove from the land owned or occupied by them all inflammable material or in cases where such townsite lots are used for grazing purposes or agricultural pursuits, clear a firebreak of not less than six feet in width around and within the boundaries of such individual or combined lots used as one parcel of land for such grazing or agricultural purposes, and thereafter to maintain the land or the firebreak clear of inflammable material up to and including the 31st day of May, 1970.

"Infiammable Material" is defined for the purpose of the order relating to Townsite Lands to include bush (as defined in the Bush Fires Act) timber, boxes, cartons, paper, and like infiammable

materials, rubbish, and also any combustible matter, but does not include green standing trees, or growing bushes and plants in gardens, or lawns.

If for any reason it is considered impracticable to clear firebreaks in the positions required by this notice the approval of the Council must be obtained to provide them in an alternative situation.

Notice to Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Rockingham.

#### Townsites.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 15th day of November, 1969, to clear firebreaks 10 feet wide inside and along boundaries and thereafter to maintain such firebreaks clear of all inflammable material until the 15th day of March, 1970, in accordance with the following:—

- (1) Where the land is vacant and no buildings are erected on it, all bush and inflammable materials shall be removed from the whole of the land.
- (2) If buildings are erected on the land, then the building shall be immediately surrounded by a firebreak, cleared of all infiammable material to a width of 10 feet, or where the boundary of the land is closer to the building than 10 feet then for that lesser distance between that boundary and the building, and a firebreak, 10 feet wide, shall also be cleared inside and along the whole of the boundaries of the land.

If it is impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land as required by this notice, the approval of the Shire Council or its duly authorised officer must be obtained to provide firebreaks in alternative positions, or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land.

Attention is directed to the following provisions of the Bush Fires Act:—

The penalty for failing to comply with this order is a fine of not less than \$10 or more than \$200 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay to the Shire Council the cost of performing the work directed in this order if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

"Bush" is defined to include grass, leaves and twigs whether alive or dead.
