AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers at Perth, this 17th day of September, 1969, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Land Act, 1933-1969.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 1084/68.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1969, it is inter alia, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said Section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 30014 (Kumunurra Lot 991) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to The Boy Scouts Association W.A. Section Incorporated to be held in trust for "Hall Site (Boy Scouts Association)": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the simple to the aforesaid body, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies, in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

(c) All properties exceeding 5,000 acres— Where the total area of a property exceeds 5,000 acres additional firebreaks not less than 10 feet in width must be provided in such positions as to divide the property into areas not exceeding 5,000 acres, each area being completely surrounded by a firebreak.

# 2. Townsites:

- (a) Rural Zone—Inside and along the whole of any portion of the external boundaries of the property a firebreak of not less than 10 feet in width.
- (b) All other Zones—Inside and along the whole of any portion of the external boundaries of the property, a firebreak of not less than six feet in width.
- (c) All Zones—The area immediately surrounding all buildings to a width of not less than six feet must be kept cleared of all infiammable material.
- Where a boundary adjoins a road, not less than 2 chains wide, a firebreak not exceeding 10 feet in width from the property boundary may be made on the road reserve.

If for any reason it is considered impracticable to provide firebreaks in the position required by this notice, the approval of the Shire Council must be obtained to construct such firebreaks in an alternative position. 




