Reserve for Natives.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas TO WIT, DOUGLAS KENDREW, Governor.

[L.S.] Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourber of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the British Empire, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 18 of the Native Welfare Act, 1963, that the Governor may by proclamation declare any Crown Lands to be Re-serves for Natives and abolish any Reserve so declared; and whereas by proclamation issued under the Native Welfare Act, and published in the Government Gazette on the 19th September, 1935, the Governor declared an area at Admiralty Gulf more particularly described and defined in the schedule to such proclamation to be a Reserve for Natives; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to abolish that section of the native reserve as described in the schedule hereto: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred by section 18 of the Native Welfare Act, 1963, do hereby abolish that section of the Reserve for Natives as declared and described and defined in the hereinbefore mentioned proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 19th September, 1935, as aforesaid.

Schedule.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the easternmost southern boundary of the Admiralty Gulf Temporary Native Reserve situate in prolongation north of the west boundary of Pastoral Lease 398/443 and extending east along the firstmentioned boundary about 960 chains to the low water mark of a western arm of Admiralty Gulf; thence generally northeasterly, generally northwesterly and generally southerly, along that low water mark and the low water mark of Admiralty Gulf to a point situate in prolongation north of the west boundary of Pastoral Lease 398/443 aforesaid and thence south along that prolongation to the starting point.

Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1964.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas TO WIT, Anthony Kendrew, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 27 of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1964, that the Governor, without constituting any irrigation district under Part IV of the said Act, may, on the recommendation of the Minister and acting with the advice of the Commissioners appointed under subsection (4) of section 3 of the Act, at any time and from time to time by Proclamation declare that Part III of the said Act shall extend to and have effect in and throughout any portion of the State to be defined in the proclamation, and shall apply to and have effect in relation to all rivers, streams, watercourses, leaguest labels are applied to the state of th streams, watercourses, lagoons, lakes, swamps or marshes situated within that portion of the State specified and defined aforesaid, but that no such

declaration shall be made until after the expiration of thirty days after notice of intention to make such declaration has been given to the local authority or local authorities in or through whose authority or local authorities in or through whose district or districts such river, streams, water-courses, lagoons, swamps, lakes or marshes run or are situate to the intent that before the making of such declaration any objection by such local authority or local authorities may be considered; and whereas the Minister has recommended and the Commissioners have advised the Governor by Proclamation to declare that Part III of the said Act shall extend to and have effect in relation to that portion of the State that is defined in the Schedule to this Proclamation and shall apply to and have effect in relation to all rivers, streams. and have effect in relation to all rivers, streams, watercourses, lagoons, lakes, swamps, and marshes situated within that portion of the State; and whereas after due notice given the local authority or local authorities concerned have not made any objection to the proposed declaration: Now, therefore, I the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister and with the advice of the Commissioners and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare that Part III of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1964, shall extend to and have effect in and throughout the portion of the State as defined in the Schedule hereto and shall apply to and have effect in relation to all rivers, streams, watercourses. lagoons, lakes, swamps and marshes situated within that portion of the State.




