BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954.

Suspension of Prohibited Burning Times.

Bush Fires Board, West Perth, 31st October, 1969.

Corres. 605.

IT is hereby notified that the Hon. Minister administering the Bush Fires Act, 1954, has approved for the districts of the municipalities mentioned and for the periods stated in the Schedule hereunder, of the following:—

(a) Acting under the powers conferred by section 17 subsection (3) (i) of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, of the suspension of all declarations of prohibited burning times under section 17 of the Act, so far as such declarations extend to any land used for Railway purposes; and

(b) Acting under the powers conferred by section 17 subsection (3) (iv) of the Act of the suspension of all declarations for prohibited burning times under section 17 of the Act so far as such declarations extend to all land on those parts of roads having a common boundary with land used for Railway purposes, as is situated between the road formation and the said common boundary.

Any burning undertaken under the provision of this suspension shall be subject to the following conditions:—

- (1) No burning shall be undertaken on any day on which the local authority or an officer nominated by it prohibits burning on the land effected by these suspensions.
- (2) No burning shall be undertaken on days when the fire hazard forecast issued by the Bureau of Meteorology for the area concerned is "dangerous" except in accordance with the provisions of the Bush Fires Act.
- (3) At least three men shall be constantly in attendance at every fire until it has been completely extinguished including all smouldering logs, timber, disused sleepers and other inflammable material.
- (4) Each man shall be provide with a heavy fire rake and each three men with at least one knapsack spray with sufficient water for its operation.
- (5) Any burning carried out under the provisions of this suspension shall comply with section 18 and all other relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1954.

PART 1.—PRELIMINARY.

- 1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Northampton Town Planning Scheme No. 1 hereinafter called "The Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval in the Gov-ernment Gazette.
- 1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land within the boundaries of the Shire of Northampton.
- 1.3 The Responsible Authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Northampton hereinafter referred to as "the Council".
- Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme Text is divided into the following parts:

Part 1.—Preliminary.
Part 2.—Reserved Land.
Part 3.—Zones.
Part 4.—Non-conforming Uses.

Part 5.—General Provisions.
Part 6.—Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are as follows:

- (1) Land Use Map.
- (2) Scheme Map.
- 1.5 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix D of the Town Planning Regulations 1967 unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

PART 2.—RESERVED LAND.

- 2.1. (a) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.
- (b) In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.
- (c) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance, for which the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.
- 2.2. (a) Where a Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.
- (b) Claims for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.
- (c) In lieu of paying compensation the Council may purchase the land affected by such decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

PART 4.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

- 4.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent-
 - (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
 - (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), and any other law authorising the development to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current.
- 4.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part 2 of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing:
- (b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part 3 of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, and provided the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-Laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.
- 4.3 Change of Non-Conforming Use: The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of the Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use, or is in the opinion of the Council closer to the intended uses of the zone.

- 4.4 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:
 - (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, except where a change of non-conforming use has been permitted by the Council under Clause 4.3, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme the Scheme.
 - (b) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

PART 5.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

- 5.1 Any approval for development required under any provision of the Scheme shall be in writing addressed to the Shire Clerk of the Shire of Northampton and may be approved by the Council or approved subject to conditions.
- 5.2 Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Council under the terms of Clause 5.1 may appeal to the Hon. Minister for Town Planning seeking a variation of the Council's decision.

PART 6.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

- 6.1 Disposal of Land: The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.
- 6.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purpose of Part 2 shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the Government Gazette, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part 2 shall apply.



Reg. 157 2. Regulation 15 revoked and remade as follows:— 2. Regulation 157 of the principal regulations is revoked and

Cream Mixture or Thickened Cream.

(1) Cream Mixture or Thickened Cream is cream with 157. or without the addition of sugar and containing gelatine, modifying agents as set out in subregulation (2) of this regulation, sucrate of lime, or any preparation of rennin, singly or in combination, in total proportion not exceeding one part per centum.

Modifying

Modifying agents for the purposes of subregulation (1) of this regulation are Gum Acacia, Gum benzoin, Gum tragacanth, Gum karaya, Gum guar, Gum locust bean, Agar agar, Irish Moss, Pectin and Alginates (excluding Propylene Glycol derivatives).

Devonshire or Clotted

(3) Devonshire Cream or Clotted Cream is that portion of the milk of cows which has been produced by the scalding, cooling and skimming of milk or cream.

No foreign substanče

(4) Cream other than Cream Mixture or Thickened Cream shall not contain any foreign substance.

Limited foreign substances in Cream Mixture or Thickened Cream.

(5) Cream Mixture or Thickened Cream shall not contain any foreign substance other than those mentioned in sugregulations (1) and (2) of this regulation.

Cream to be sold according to content.

(6) Cream shall be sold under one or other of the type designations set out in subregulation (7) of this regulation and shall contain not less than the number of parts per centum of milk fat set out opposite the designation in that subregulation.

Cream types and milk fat contents.

- (7) Cream types and their respective minimum parts per centum of milk fat content are as follows:-
 - "Rich Cream"-48;
 - "Whipping Cream"-
 - "Cream"—35;
 - "Reduced Cream"-25;
 - "Light Cream"—18;
 - "Cream Mixture" or "Thickened Cream"-35; and
 - "Devonshire Cream" or "Clotted Cream"—48.

pH value.

(8) The pH value of any type of cream shall be not greater than 7.0 .

Bacterial standard for Devonshire, Clotted and Pasteurised

(9) Devonshire or Clotted Cream and pasteurised cream shall contain not more than 50,000 micro organisms per millilitre and not more than 10 coliform micro organisms per millilitre.

Bacterial standard for unpastuer-ised cream other than Devonshire or Clotted Cream.

(10) Unpasteurised cream other than Devonshire or Clotted Cream shall contain not more than 500,000 organisms per millilitre and not more than 100 coliform organisms per millilitre.

 - (a) as to subregulation (a), by deleting the passage beginning with the word "and", being the last word in line five, and ending with the word "therein" in line ten; and

Particulars on container of cream for sale.

- (1) When a container of cream is packed for sale the holder of the Treatment License at whose premises the cream was packed shall, subject to subregulations (2) and (3) of this regulation, show or cause to be shown on the container, the label attached to it, or the disc, cap, or device for sealing, as the case may be-
 - (a) the type of cream;
 - (b) where the cream has not been pasteurised or scalded, the word "Unpasteurised", preceding the type name;

- (c) where the cream is Cream Mixture or Thickened Cream, the name of the modifying agent and the word "Added", both following the type name;
- (d) the number of parts per centum of milk fat content of the cream;
- (e) figures or letters in accordance with a code approved by the Board signifying the date on which the cream was packed; and
- (f) the name of the holder of that Treatment License.
- (2) In respect of a bottle of cream packed for sale the particulars required to be shown pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation—
 - (a) shall be legibly embossed on the bottle with particulars(a), (b) and (c) in twenty-four point lettering and particulars (d), (e) and (f) in eight point lettering; or
 - (b) shall be legibly written or embossed on the disc, cap, or device for sealing the bottle with all particulars in eight point lettering.
- (3) In respect of a container of cream, other than a bottle, packed for sale the particulars required to be shown pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation shall be legibly written on the container or label attached to it with particulars (a), (b) and (c) in twenty-four point lettering and the other particulars in eight point lettering.
- (4) Where a person proposes to sell cream in a bottle sealed by a disc, cap, or other device the Board may give him permission in writing to include on the disc, cap, or other device words or markings in addition to those required under subregulation (1) of this regulation but may at any time withdraw the permission by notice in writing to that person.
- (5) A word or marking other than those required by subregulation (1) of this regulation or permitted pursuant to subregulation (4) of this regulation shall not be placed on a disc, cap, or device used for sealing a bottle of cream for sale.
- (6) The word "Rich" or any similar word shall not be conjoined with the word "Cream" or be embossed on any bottle containing cream for sale or written or embossed on the disc, cap, or device used for sealing such a bottle or written on any container containing cream for sale or on the label attached to such container unless the cream contains not less than 48 parts per centum of milk fat.
