Child Welfare Act, 1947-1968.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 19(2)(a) of the Child Welfare Act, 1947-1968, it is provided that the Governor may appoint such persons, male or female, as he may think fit, to be members of any particular Children's Court and may determine the respective seniorities of such members; and whereas by section 19(1)(b)(ii) of the said Act the Governor may amend, vary or revoke any such appointment: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby appoint the person named in the First Schedule hereto to be a Member of the Children's Court at the place mentioned and doth hereby revoke the appointments of the persons named in the Second Schedule hereto as Members of the Children's Courts at the places mentioned.

(n) Degree or Associateship in Mining Engineering from a recognised University, or School of Mines or other equivalent qualifications; must also possess a Western Australian Mine Manager's Certificate of Competency First Class or equivalent or sufficient experience to obtain this Certificate. Three years underground experience in hard rock mines is essential.

(o) Preferably a University degree, with a knowledge of medical administration and hospital procedures, and at least three years' experience in programming, investigation design and implementation of computer based services.

(p) University degree in social studies or a degree plus a post-graduate diploma of social studies with at least six years' relevant experience gained after attaining the professional qualification;

OR

University diploma of social studies (not post-graduate diploma) with at least nine years' relevant experience gained after attaining the professional qualification.

(q) University degree in Veterinary Science registrable in Western Australia. At least 10 years' experience including that of disease eradication required.

(r) Diploma in Mechanical Engineering or substantial progress towards this qualification, or an approved equivalent academic qualification in Engineering. Applicants must be qualified tradesmen in fitting.

(s) Junior Certificate including English and a unit of Mathematics with science subjects desirable.

(t) Junior Certificate or its equivalent in at least five subjects, including English, Shorthand and Typewriting.

Applicants must have had extensive experience in general secretarial duties and be proficient in shorthand and typewriting.

(v) Fellowship or Associateship of the Australian Institute of Medical Laboratory Technology or acceptable equivalent qualification.

(b) If, after that month has expired, the objections lodged are not sufficient to require approval to be withheld and provided other requirements of the Act have been complied with, the Governor may make an Order, to be notified in the *Government Gazette*, empowering the Board to undertake the construction of the proposed works.
