WHEREAS it is provided (*inter alia*), by section 59 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1963-1965, that the occupier of a factory shall allow to any person employed in the factory a half holiday on any day proclaimed to be a half holiday in the district or locality in which the factory is situate and, by section 95 of that Act, that every shop, except an exempted shop, a privileged shop and a small shop, shall be closed, and a shopkeeper shall allow each shop assistant a half holiday on any day that is proclaimed to be a half holiday on any day that is proclaimed to be a half holiday that is applicable to the area in which the shop is situate; and whereas it appears to me, the Lieutenant Governor, expedient that a half holiday should be proclaimed for the day and place hereinafter appearing: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby proclaim the afternoon of Thursday the 12th day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seventy to be a half holiday within the municipal district of, and applicable to the area of, the Town of Bunbury.

Pig Industry Compensation Act, 1942-1969. PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Honourable Sir Albert Wolfr, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lleutenant Governor and Administrator in and over the State of Western Australia and Its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section 15 of the Pig Industry Compensation Act, 1942-1969, it is provided that in respect of every sale of any pig or carcass there shall be payable stamp duty of such amount as the Governor may by proclamation prescribe; and whereas by proclamation dated the 22nd December, 1965, and published in the Government Gazette on the 31st December, 1965, the stamp duty payable on every sale of any pig or carcass was prescribed to be one half-penny for every pound or part of a pound exceeding ten shillings until the 14th February, 1966, and after that date one-fifth of a cent for every dollar or part of a dollar exceeding fifty cents; and whereas it is deemed expedient to cancel that proclamation prescribing other provisions as hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim in lieu thereof that the stamp duty payable on every sale of any pig or carcass shall, on and after the 1st April, 1970, be three-tenths of a cent for every dollar or part of a dollar exceeding fifty cents—

- (a) of the amount of purchase money in respect of one pig or one carcass sold singly; or
- (b) of the total amount of the purchase money in respect of any number of pigs or carcasses, as the case may be, sold in one lot;

but so that the stamp duty in respect of the amount of the purchase money of any one pig or any one carcass, as the case may be, whether sold singly or as part of a lot, shall not exceed fifty cents.

- (e) each patio or terrace house shall have one of which spaces shall be protected a parking space for at least two cars, by an open sided carport of at least 18 feet in length and 8 feet in width set back a minimum of 18 feet from the front boundary. Development of land for the purpose of patio or terrace houses shall not be commenced until the Council has approved of the location of such parking spaces. In

arriving at its decision the Council shall have regard to the location of any public or private road, footpath, way or vehicle crossing and the effect the location of such spaces is likely to have on pedestrian and vehicle traffic in the area;

- (f) access to the carparking spaces provided pursuant to this clause may be provided from a street or right of way provided that any such right of way is not less than 25 feet in width;
- (g) every patio house shall have an open courtyard of not less than 500 square feet.
