PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas
TO WIT, Santhony Kendrew, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1969, it is enacted, inter alia, the Governor may by proclamation—

- (a) revoke any proclamation made under the Act; and
- (b) prohibit, either absolutely, or except in accordance with regulations the bringing

any specified portion of the State from the rest of the State generally or from any specified portion thereof, of any specified kind of plant, fruit, or other thing which would in his opinion introduce any diseases into the specified portion thereof; and whereas I, the Governor, am of the opinion that the bringing into the portion of the State specified as Area No. 2 and described in the Schedule hereto, from the rest of the State generally, of fruit of any kind whatsoever, would introduce the disease of fruit fly into that portion: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1969, do by this proclamation-

(a) revoke the proclamation made under that Act on the 2nd July, 1969, and published in the Government Gazette on the 18th July, 1969; and

(b) prohibit, except in accordance with the Plant Diseases (Fruit Movement) Regulations, 1970, the bringing into the portion of the State specified as Area No. 2 and described in the Schedule hereto, from the rest of the State generally, of fruit of any kind whatsoever.

Schedule.

Area No. 2.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the Low Water Mark of the Indian Ocean at 32 degrees 50 minutes South Latitude and extending east along that parallel to a point situate 15 miles east of the centre line of the Great Southern Railway Reserve; thence southeasterly to a point situate on the 33 degree 42 minute parallel of Southern Latitude, 15 miles east of the centre line of the Great Southern Railway Reserve aforesaid; thence east along that parallel to the late Rabbit Proof Fence Number Two; thence south to the Low Water Mark of the Southern Ocean and thence generally westerly along that Low Water Mark and generally northerly along the Low Water Mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid to the starting point.
