WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 46 of the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1964 that the Governor may, by proclamation, inter alia, declare that such portions of Western Australia as he thinks fit shall form circuit districts, and shall assign a name to each of such districts, and define the boundaries of the same respectively; and whereas it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (3) of section 10 of the Juries Act, 1957-1961, that where a circuit district is declared after the coming into operation of that Act pursuant to the powers conferred by section 46 of the Supreme Court Act, 1935, the Governor may by proclamation declaring the circuit district declare what Assembly District or Districts or part or parts of an Assembly District or Districts shall constitute the jury district for the Circuit Court of the circuit district so proclaimed: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, in exercise of the foregoing powers and acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby declare that the portions of Western Australia comprised within the boundaries of the magisterial districts as constituted at the date hereof and mentioned in the second column of the first Schedule hereto shall form a circuit district to which is assigned the name appearing in the corresponding opposite position in the first column thereof, and do hereby further declare that the jury district for the Circuit Court named in the first column of the Second Schedule to this pro-clamation shall respectively consist of such part of such Assembly District as is set out in the second column of that Schedule opposite to the Court mentioned in that first column.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 27 of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1964, that the Governor, without constituting any irrigation district under Part IV of the said Act, may, on the recommendation of the Minister and acting with the advice of the Commissioners appointed under subsection (4) of section 3 of the Act, at any time

and from time to time by Proclamation declare that Part III of the said Act shall extend to and have effect in and throughout any portion of the State to be defined in the proclamation, and shall apply to and have effect in relation to all rivers, streams, watercourses, lagoons, lakes, swamps or marshes situated within that portion of the State specified and defined aforesaid, but that no such declaration shall be made until after the expiration of thirty days after notice of intention to make such declaration has been given to local authority or local authorities in or through whose district or districts such rivers, streams, watercourses, lagoons, swamps, lakes or marshes run or are situate to the extent that before the making of such declaration any objection by such local authority or local authorities may be considered: And whereas the Minister has recommended and the Commissioners have advised the Governor by Proclamation to declare that Part III of the said Act shall extend to and have effect in relation to that portion of the State that is defined in the Schedule to this Proclamation and shall apply to and have effect in relation to all rivers, streams, watercourses, lagoons, lakes, swamps, and marshes situated within that portion of the State; and whereas after due notice given the local authority or local authorities concerned have not made any objection to the proposed declaration; Now, therefore, I the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister and with the advice of the Com-missioners and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare that Part III of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1964, shall extend to and have effect in and throughout the portion of the State as defined in the Schedule hereto and shall apply to and have effect in relation to all rivers streams watercourses effect in relation to all rivers, streams, watercourses, lakes, swamps and marshes situated within that portion of the State.

APPROVAL OF ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES.

NOTICE is hereby given that, as from the 1st March, 1971, the notice published in the Government Gazette on the 7th May, 1965, and amended by notices published in the Government Gazette on the 29th October, 1965, 31st December, 1965, 6th May, 1966, 3rd June, 1966, 5th May, 1967 and 9th May, 1969, specifying the various classes or types of electrical appliances prescribed by The State Electricity Commission of Western Australia that shall not be sold, hired or exposed for sale or hire or advertised for sale or hire unless approved by the Commission and stamped and labelled as prescribed, and setting out the respective published specifications listed against those prescribed classes of electrical appliances, shall be amended by addition, alteration or substitution as set forth in the schedule below.

Notice is also given that the specifications quoted in respect to the classes or types of the electrical appliances prescribed shall be the published specifications in respect to such classes or types of prescribed electrical appliances.

1. Storage Water Heaters: Storage Water Heater means an unvented water heater incorporating an electric heating unit or units for operation at low or medium voltage and intended for the heating and storage of water at a pressure equivalent to more than seven feet head of water in a container of not less than one or more than one hundred and fifty gallons. The definition does not include electric water heaters specially designed for industrial application, electric steam generators or electric sterilizers.

The term Houshold Electric Range includes a cooking hob fitted with one or more heating units which are intended or may be used to heat a cooking vessel or vessels standing thereon, or any combination of one or more cooking compartments and one or more such cooking hobs.

The term does not include any equipment which employs high-frequency radiated energy for heating or cooking

 - (1) Subject to the other general provisions of this regulation and notwithstanding the provisions of Regulations 148 and 149 of these regulations all cargoes shipped on any ship to interstate or overseas ports (other than Darwin in the Northern Territory of the Commonwealth) on which the port charges are paid by the master of the ship to the Port Authority and which cargoes are so shipped either in containers or in any other manner at a Basic Service Rate shall (subject to the proviso hereof) pay wharfage at the rate of \$0.40 a ton provided however that firstly there shall be lodged with the Port Authority either notification in writing or an endorsement made on either the cart-note or the ship's manifest to the effect that a Basic Service Rate is being charged in respect of the cargo and which rate includes a component for port charges but notwithstanding same the Port Authority may in its discretion and according to the circumstances of each case either accept or reject such notification in writing or endorsement and in the event of the Port Authority rejecting same then the provisions of this subregulation shall not apply.

For the purpose hereof the expression "Basic Service Rate" shall mean the Basic Service Rate as is from time to time adopted varied or quoted by the international consortium known as the Australia to Europe Shipping Conference for cargo shipped from Australia.
