## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L. &amp; S. Corres. 4146/68 (R.3132).

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1969, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Town of Bunbury has requested that certain lands named and described in the schedule hereunder, which have been reserved for a street within its municipal district be declared a public street: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be a public street, and such land shall, from the date of this Order be absolutely dedicated to the public as a street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1969, it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 17841 for the purpose of water at Nairibin Estate should be placed under the control of William James O'Brien, Robert Herbert Jones and Roy William Porteous as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of William James O'Brien, Robert Herbert Jones and Roy William Porteous as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case \$10 for any breach thereof, and \$4 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than \$40 in the aggregate.

**SHIRE OF PERTH TOWN PLANNING SCHEME  
No. 25—NORTHERN SPECIAL INDUSTRIAL  
SCHEME.**

THE Shire of Perth under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

**SCHEME TEXT.**

1. Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Perth Town Planning Scheme No. 25—Northern Special Industrial Scheme (hereinafter called "the Scheme").

2. Responsible Authority: The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Perth (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

3. Maps: The following Maps are attached to this Text and form part of the Scheme:—

Land Use Map.  
Scheme Map.

4. Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within the inner edge of a broken black border on the Land Use Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".

5. General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are:—

- (a) To improve and develop the Scheme Area to the best possible advantage.
- (b) To plan suitable roads within the Scheme Area.
- (c) To make provision for arterial and main roads.
- (d) To ensure the proper drainage of the roads and of those parts of the Scheme Area which require drainage or other works.
- (e) To facilitate and co-ordinate progressive subdivision and development of land within the Scheme Area.
- (f) Where necessary or desirable, to plan the subdivision of land within the Scheme Area.
- (g) To establish standards for the development of land within the Scheme Area.
- (h) To assist in the development of the Scheme Area for industrial purposes in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme and in order to ensure that a high standard of industrial development be carried out within the Scheme Area.
- (i) To provide for the planting of trees and shrubs in roads, reserves and along the boundaries of land and for such other improvements as shall be for the general benefit of the Scheme Area and for the general benefit of the owners and occupiers of land therein.
- (j) To make provisions for land to be used for Public Open Space Local Authority and Scheme purposes.

6. Method of Carrying out of Objects: It is intended that as and when owners desire to subdivide their land such subdivision shall be according to the Scheme Map.

7. It is intended that when owners of land develop their land, they do so not only in accordance with the Scheme Map and the standards laid down in the Scheme, but also, so far as is practicable, in a manner that will not only be consistent with a high standard of development but also will be in harmony with other buildings and other developments in the Scheme Area.

8. Subdivision: The Scheme Map forms a basis for the subdivision of the Scheme Area, but the Council may permit alterations or variations to the Scheme Map where circumstances justify such action, provided that no alteration or variation shall be permitted if in the opinion of the Council, such alteration or variation will impede the subdivision and development of the Scheme Area as a whole.

9. New Roads: Subject to the following clauses all new roads within the Scheme Area shall be constructed and drained at the expense of the owners of land therein, and each owner shall, when subdividing his land, make the land available for the roads and pay the costs of the construction and drainage of the roads within the land owned by him.

10. The road pavement on subdivisional roads shall be 24 feet wide and shall be kerbed. Those roads which are shown on the Scheme Map as being wider than 66 feet shall be constructed with a kerbed pavement 48 feet wide. Such pavement

may, if the Council considers desirable, be constructed as two carriageways each 24 feet wide. The additional cost of the construction of a road with a pavement of 48 feet wide shall form part of the Scheme Costs.

11. If an owner when subdividing his land shall make more land available for a road exceeding 66 feet wide than he would have been required to do if the road had been 66 feet in width, he shall be compensated by the Council in respect of the value of such additional land, but from such compensation shall be deducted any amounts due by the owner to the Council pursuant to the Scheme.

12. In cases where the situation of a new road within the Scheme Area is such that it would be fair and equitable that the owners of adjoining land should each contribute to the cost of the construction or drainage of that road and such owners are unable to agree upon the proportion of the costs payable by each of them, the amount (if any) payable by each such owner shall be determined by the Council.

13. The Council may construct and drain any new roads within the Scheme Area and acquire the land necessary for that purpose. If the Council shall do so prior to the subdivision of the land adjoining such road, the costs of the construction and drainage of the said road and all compensation and other costs consequent upon the acquisition of the land shall be paid to the Council by the respective owners of land in accordance with the foregoing provisions, as and when they subdivide their land.

14. If an owner shall claim compensation for the resumption from him of land to be used as a road, there shall be set off against the amount of compensation payable to him the amount by which the value of the remainder of his land has been or will be increased by the construction of the roads within the Scheme Area and by the operation of the Scheme.

15. If an owner shall subdivide his land and if he or his predecessors in title shall have claimed or shall have been paid compensation by reason of the resumption by the Council of the land for a new road within the Scheme Area, he shall before the approval of his plan of subdivision, release the Council from the payment of compensation or repay to the Council the compensation paid by it to him or his predecessor in title as the case may be.

16. Closure of Roads: Surveyed roads within the Scheme Area that are not shown as new roads on the Scheme Map shall be deemed to have been closed as from the date on which the Council shall resolve to close each such road respectively.

17. Drainage: The Council shall at the appropriate time or times carry out such drainage works as in its opinion are necessary for the proper drainage of the Scheme Area and may acquire land for that purpose and may set aside land for drainage sumps and compensating basins.

18. Public Open Space: It is intended that the land coloured green on the Scheme Map shall be reserved for Public Recreation, Local Authority and Scheme purposes.

19. The Council may, if it shall from time to time decide so to do, acquire the said lands coloured green or any parts thereof, either by purchase or resumption, or partly by one method and partly by the other.

20. Each owner of land within the Scheme Area shall, prior to the final approval by the Town Planning Board to the subdivision of his land, and subject as hereinafter provided, transfer to the Council an area of land equal to one-tenth of the total area of land being subdivided or developed by him or such other areas as the Town Planning Board shall upon approval of the Plan of Subdivision require.

21. If within a portion of the Scheme Area the subject of subdivision and development, it is in the opinion of the Council desirable that no land or an area of land less than one-tenth of the total area of land being subdivided by the owner be

transferred to the Council, the owner shall make a cash payment to the Council so that the value of the land (if any) to be transferred together with the cash payment by way of adjustment, equals one-tenth of the value of land the subject of the subdivision as at the date of the approval of the subdivision.

22. If within a portion of the Scheme Area the subject of subdivision and development, more than one-tenth is required by the Council for Public Recreation, Local Authority and Scheme purposes the owner shall transfer to the Council the land required by it for that purpose and the Council shall pay to the Owner by way of compensation the value (as at the date of the approval of the subdivision) of the land exceeding the said one-tenth as shall be required by the Council. If the Council so agrees the Council may transfer to the said owner other land in or near the Scheme Area either owned by the Council or acquired by it for that purpose to compensate him for the land in excess of the said one-tenth required by the Council, in which case the amount payable by the Council to the owner shall be reduced accordingly.

23. The Council may sell or otherwise dispose of any land transferred to or acquired by it for the purpose of Public Recreation, Local Authority and Scheme purposes, provided that all moneys received by the Council in respect of such sales and all moneys received by the Council under Clause 21 hereof shall, after making all necessary payments to owners and paying the costs of land (if any) acquired for transfer to owners under Clause 22 hereof, be expended by the Council in the acquisition or improvement of land for Public Recreation, Local Authority and Scheme purposes in or near the Scheme Area concerned.

24. If the Council shall have acquired land for Public Recreation, Local Authority or Scheme purposes, or for roads, it shall be reimbursed all compensation and costs paid by it from moneys received by it from the sale of land or under the preceding clauses hereof, and upon the owner from whom the land was acquired subdividing his land, the value of one-tenth of his land to be made available for Public Recreation, Local Authority or Scheme purposes hereunder, shall be assessed on the basis that such land had not been acquired.

25. Scheme Costs: The costs or estimated costs of the following items are hereinafter referred to as Scheme Costs:—

- (a) The acquisition of the land for roads exceeding 66 feet in width and the payment of any compensation in respect thereof;
- (b) The construction and drainage of additional road pavements or an additional carriageway of a dual carriageway on roads exceeding 66 feet in width;
- (c) The drainage works necessary for the proper drainage of the Scheme Area including the costs of the acquisition of land for compensating basins and drainage sumps whether such works are undertaken and such land acquired before or after the coming into operation of the Scheme;
- (d) The extension of the water mains to the Scheme Area;
- (e) All compensation which the Council shall pay or become liable to pay by reason of any building or other improvement being affected by the proposals contained in the Scheme Map or the use and enjoyment of any land building or improvement being adversely affected by the Scheme.

26. Payment of Scheme Costs: Each owner shall, prior to the final approval by the Town Planning Board to the subdivision of his land, or after having received not less than three calendar months' notice from the Council, whichever shall first happen, pay to the Council an amount which bears the same proportion of the Scheme Costs as the area of the owners land bears to the whole of the land within the Scheme Area that is privately owned at the date of the coming into operation of the Scheme.

27. The Council may from time to time give to owners three calendar months' notice to pay such items of the Scheme Costs or parts thereof as it then requires to be paid and such costs shall be paid by the owners in the proportions specified above at the expiration of the said notice, notwithstanding that the owners may not have then subdivided their land.

28. Estimate of Scheme Costs: If any of the items of Scheme Costs have not been paid or ascertained at the time of a subdivision or of the giving of a notice, they may be estimated by the Council. An estimate may be revised from time to time.

29. All Scheme Costs shall be paid within two years from the Scheme coming into operation or by such time as the Council may agree in a particular case.

30. Valuations: If it is necessary for the purpose of this Scheme to ascertain the value of any land, such value shall be determined by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia or some person recommended by him. If an owner shall object to the value so determined, he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty-eight days after having been informed of the said value or the revised value. If the valuer does not agree to change the value to a figure acceptable to the owner, the value shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained.

31. If a valuation made by the valuer shall be changed as the result of an objection, the valuer may reconsider the values placed on other lands and make such re-valuations as he considers just and equitable.

32. Zoning: It is intended that the privately owned land and other land to be made available for industrial use within the Scheme Area be classified as a Special Industrial Zone in which land and buildings may be used for such industrial purposes as are not noxious and which will not cause injury to or prejudicially affect the amenity of the locality by reason of the emission of noise, vibration, smell, fumes, smoke, vapour, steam, soot, ash, dust, waste water, waste products, grit, oil or otherwise.

33. Change of Zoning: Nothing herein shall prevent the subsequent change of zoning of any land in the Scheme Area if the proper procedure for such change be followed.

34. Buildings Set back from Street Alignment: Except as hereinafter provided no person shall erect or cause or permit to be erected a building or any portion of a building nearer to a street alignment than fifty feet.

35. Where a lot has a frontage to more than one street the Council may at its discretion permit the construction of buildings nearer to the street alignment of the other street or streets nominated by the Council but not nearer than thirty feet from the street alignment of such other street or streets.

36. Where by reason of the size or shape of a lot it would in the opinion of the Council be unreasonable to insist on a setback of 50 feet from a street alignment, the Council may reduce the required setback to a distance specified by it.

37. No person shall erect or cause to be erected a building or any portion of a building nearer than 116 feet from the present street alignment of Delawney Street.

38. Use of Land Adjacent to Street Alignment: (1) Except as provided in sub-clauses (3) (4) and (5) hereof and in Clause 39 no person shall use or permit to be used the land within twenty feet from the street alignment except for one or more of the following purposes:—

- (i) A means of access.
- (ii) Lawns, gardens or the planting of trees or shrubs.

(2) Subject to Clause 35 and except as provided in sub-clauses (3) (4) and (5) hereof and Clause 39 no person shall use or permit to be used the

land between twenty feet and fifty feet from the street alignment except for one or more of the following purposes:—

- (i) A means of access.
- (ii) The loading or unloading of vehicles.
- (iii) Lawns, gardens or the planting of trees or shrubs.
- (iv) If special permission of the Council shall be given thereto: trade display.

(3) In the case of a parcel of land situated on a street corner and having a frontage to more than one street, the provisions of sub-clauses (1) and (2) hereof shall not apply to so much of the parcel of land as has a frontage to the less important of the streets but which is more than 50 feet from the more important of the streets.

(4) No person shall use the land within ten feet of the street alignment of the less important of the two streets of a corner lot except for one or more of the following purposes:—

- (i) A means of access.
- (ii) Lawns, gardens or the planting of trees or shrubs.

(5) No person shall use the land situated between ten feet and thirty feet from the street alignment of the less important of the two streets of a corner lot except for one or more of the following purposes:—

- (i) A means of access.
- (ii) As to not more than one-half of the land within 30 feet of the street alignment, parking of vehicles used by employees or customers provided that no vehicle shall be parked within 50 feet of the more important of the streets.
- (iii) The loading or unloading of vehicles.
- (iv) Lawns, gardens or the planting of trees or shrubs.
- (v) If special permission of the Council shall be given thereto: trade display.

And the Council shall in each case determine which is or are the more or the less important street or streets having regard not only to the existing subdivision of land but also to the future planning or projected planning.

39. Where by reason of the size or shape of a lot it would in the opinion of the Council be unreasonable to insist on the requirements of Clause 38 the Council may relax those requirements in a manner specified by it.

40. (1) In this Clause the term 'land adjoining a street' shall mean that portion of the parcel of land which lies within twenty feet of the street alignment: Provided that if the parcel of land has a frontage to more than one street the term shall in respect of the less important street or streets (as determined by the Council) mean that portion of the parcel of land which lies within ten feet of the street alignment of such less important street or streets.

(2) The occupier of land shall within eighteen months from the issue of a Building Licence to construct a building upon such land—

- (a) plant and thereafter maintain lawns or gardens on so much of the land adjoining the street as is situated between a building and a street alignment but with the exception of such part thereof as is used or set aside as a means of access;
- (b) On so much of the land adjoining the street as is not situated between a building and a street alignment either plant and thereafter maintain lawns or gardens, or plant and thereafter maintain trees or shrubs not more than fifty feet apart; and
- (c) Plant and thereafter maintain lawns or gardens of not less than one-sixth of the area of the parcel of land upon which the buildings are constructed or which are used as part of the industrial purpose.

41. The occupier of land on which there is stored stacked or allowed to remain any rusty materials or any materials which by their unsightliness detract from the amenity of the area or are untidy shall screen the said area by means of a wall, fence, trees or shrubs of not less than six feet in height and of such a nature as to screen the area from the street and from the adjoining properties.

42. Native Trees: So far as is practicable and consistent with the economic development of land, native trees and shrubs are to be retained.

43. Provision for the parking of vehicles: In Clauses 43 to 46 the term 'parking space' means an area of not less than 140 square feet and in such a condition and position and with all necessary access ways as to permit its use for the parking of a motor car.

44. Subject to Clauses 45 and 46 the owner of a parcel of land on which a building is erected or which is used for industrial purposes shall on the parcel of land—

Either—

- (a) Set aside not less than one third of the total area of the parcel of land for the purpose of parking spaces and necessary access ways or future parking requirements;

Or—

- (b) Provide such number of parking spaces as is in the ratio of one parking space for every two persons employed on the parcel of land or in the buildings thereon together with such additional parking spaces as is the nearest whole number to twenty-five per cent. of the said number;

whichever provides the greater number of parking spaces.

Provided that in respect of paragraph (b) hereof—

- (i) If no sales are made from the parcel of land or buildings thereon the requirement of the additional 25 per cent may at the discretion of the Council be reduced to an additional ten per cent;
- (ii) If there be a showroom attached to a factory on the parcel of land there shall in addition to the requirements of paragraph (b) hereof be provided one parking space for every 100 square feet of showroom floor space.

45. Where by reason of the size of a lot it would in the opinion of the Council be unreasonable to insist on the requirements of Clause 44 the Council may relax those requirements in a manner specified by it.

46. If the Council shall have provided public parking areas the Council may relax the requirements of Clause 44 for land in the vicinity of such a public parking area.

47. Application for Building Licences: Applicants for building licences or for permission to develop land shall in addition to the submission of plans and specifications indicate proposals for parking facilities, tree planting and landscaping and the number of persons likely to be employed in the factory.

48. Position of Buildings: Buildings may not be constructed in such a position that they would prevent the subdivision of land in accordance with the design shown on the Scheme Map, or after such subdivision, be in a position not permitted by the Scheme.

49. Subdivisions: Except in cases where in the opinion of the Council the requirement of this Clause would be impracticable or cause hardship, no subdivision shall be permitted if a lot is created having an area of less than one acre or a frontage of less than two and one-half chains.

50. Land Owned or Acquired by Council: If the Council shall be the owner of, or acquire any land within the Scheme Area, except for the purpose of roads, drainage works, or public open

space, the Council may use the land for any purpose which will in the opinion of the Council enhance the amenity of the Scheme Area, or sell the land upon such terms and conditions as it thinks fit.

51. Moneys Received by Council: All moneys received by the Council pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, or from the sale of land acquired by it in the Scheme Area, shall, except in so far as such moneys are required to pay the costs of the Scheme, the works to be carried out and the cost of acquisition of land, be applied towards the cost of—

- (a) Additional tree planting;
- (b) Underground power lines;
- (c) Additional road improvements;
- (d) Improvements to public open space;
- (e) The provision of amenities for persons working in the Scheme Area;
- (f) The improvement of public transport including subsidies; or
- (g) Any other purpose which in the opinion of the Council will enhance the amenity of the Scheme Area.

52. Arbitration: Any dispute or difference between the owners as to their respective rights under the Scheme or as to the value of any land or in respect of any matter which pursuant to this Scheme may be determined by Arbitration in the manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895 or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force.

53. Powers and Authorities of Council: In carrying out the provisions of this Scheme the Council shall have the following powers and authorities:—

- (a) To enter into agreements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the Scheme Area.
- (b) To enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of land within the Scheme Area.
- (c) If any owner of land within the Scheme Area does not proceed with the subdivision or development of his land in accordance with the terms of the Scheme or by reason of the nature of his land, is unable to subdivide or develop it, and his failure to do so, in the opinion of the Council will unduly delay the completion of the Scheme the Council may resume the land of such owner or owners and proceed with the subdivision and development of the said land in accordance with the provisions of this Scheme.
- (d) In the event of the Council exercising its powers under Clause (c), it shall have all the powers of an owner in the subdivision, development and disposal of the said land, but before selling the land so subdivided and developed it shall offer the new lots to the original owner upon his paying to the Council all costs and expenses consequent upon the resumption subdivision, or development of the said land, and upon his releasing the Council from all claims for compensation in respect of such resumption. The Council may make it a condition of the offer that the owner shall use or make the land available for use for industrial purposes. The said offer shall be made in writing and if not accepted within one calendar month of the service thereof, the Council may proceed with the sale of the subdivided lots. All moneys received by it from such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of all costs and expenses consequent upon such subdivision and secondly in payment of all compensation in respect of the resumption of the said land. The balance, if any, of such moneys may be retained by the Council and the Council shall make good any deficit.

- (e) If the offer mentioned in Clause (d) hereof be not accepted the Council may retain all or any part of the said land, but if it does so it shall be responsible to pay such costs of subdivision of the said land and compensation for its resumption as are then unpaid.
- (f) The Council may resume any land within the Scheme Area for public or local authority purposes, or in order to make it available for industrial purposes in cases where the owner thereof will not agree to make the land available for that purpose in accordance with the provisions of this Scheme.
- (g) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled whether under Clause (c) or (f) hereof or otherwise upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit and without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition that buildings of a specified character with specified parking or other facilities shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specified purpose.
- (h) To enter into agreements with any person or Government instrumentality for the purpose of carrying out any of the Scheme works or otherwise for the purpose of the Scheme.
- (i) From time to time make minor variations to the design on the Scheme Map where necessary or desirable.
- (j) Extend the time within which payments have to be made to the Council and agree to the securing of such payments.

- (k) To enter and inspect any land within the Scheme Area.

54. Twenty-eight days' written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to Section 10 of the Act. Any expenses incurred by the Council under the said section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in such Court of Civil Jurisdiction as is competent to deal with the amount of the claim.

55. The Council may at any time exercise the powers conferred by Section 13 of the Act.

56. Claims for Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of this Scheme may be made within six months of the Scheme coming into operation.
