LIQUOR ACT, 1970.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the Liquor Act, 1970, and by virtue of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1970, has been pleased to—

- (a) revoke all regulations made under the Licensing Act, 1911-1969; and
- (b) make the regulations set out in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

LIQUOR REGULATIONS, 1970.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Liquor Regulations, 1970.
2. In these regulations, "the Act" means the Liquor Act, 1970.
3. (1) Where a licence is to be transferred, the licensee shall, as transferor, complete and sign the form of application for transfer prescribed by the rules and cause it to be delivered to the proposed transferee.
(2) A licensee proposing to transfer his licence shall not cease to occupy the licensed premises until the application for the transfer has been granted or the Court, by authority in writing, sooner authorises the licensee to leave the premises. Penalty—Forty Dollars.
(3) A proposed transferee shall sign the application delivered to him pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation and lodge it in accordance with, and comply with, the provisions of section 85 of the Act.
4. (1) The holder of a licence in respect of premises that have been graded pursuant to Division 2 of Part V of the Act shall keep a record of—
 - (a) the number of—
 - (i) single rooms;
 - (ii) other rooms; and
 - (iii) beds,
 occupied by lodgers; and
 - (b) the number of meals supplied—
 - (i) to lodgers, other than the licensee, his family and servants; and
 - (ii) to persons other than lodgers,
 in each month; and shall, on or before the 14th April and the 14th October, in every year, render a return to the Court, in a form supplied by it, setting

out the particulars mentioned in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subregulation, for the previous six months ending, respectively, on the 31st March and the 30th September, immediately prior to the rendering of the return.

(2) A licensee shall include in the return, rendered pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation, a statement of the number of persons employed on the licensed premises, at the conclusion of the month prior to the rendering of the return, showing the nature of the employment in which each person is engaged.

5. (1) A licensee who is required, by section 121 of the Act, to keep a register of lodgers, shall—

- (a) keep the register in the form prescribed by the rules;
- (b) require a lodger to sign the register at the time of the lodger's first taking up accommodation; and
- (c) cause all entries to be made in the register, daily.

(2) All signatures and entries in a register of lodgers shall be made in ink or in some other medium of equivalent permanence.

6. The Court may, on the informal application of a licensee issue a duplicate licence in place of any lost or destroyed.

7. The several fees set out in the Schedule to these regulations are those to be taken by the Court.

8. The parts of the State to which paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section 24 of the Act applies are those set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations.

Second Schedule.

1. All that part of the State, bounded by lines, starting at the intersection of the centre line of the Murchison River and the High Water Mark of the Indian Ocean in Gantheaume Bay and extending generally easterly along the centre line of the Murchison River aforesaid and the Sandford River to a point situate north from the summit of Murdanna; thence southerly through that summit and onwards to the former Number Three Rabbit Proof Fence; thence south-westerly and generally westerly along that former fence and generally southerly along the Number Two Rabbit Proof Fence and part of the former fence to a point situate west from the summit of Mt. Churchman; thence east to the former Number One Rabbit Proof Fence; thence generally southerly along that former fence to an east-west line passing through the north-eastern corner of Avon Location 3831 (Part of Reserve 10463); thence east along that line to a point situate north of survey mark HK 154; thence south passing through that survey mark to an east-west line passing through the eastern corner of Location 11439; thence west along that line to the former Number One Rabbit Proof Fence aforesaid; thence generally south-easterly along that former fence to a point on an east-west line passing through the south-western corner of former Location 1118, as shown on superseded Lands and Surveys Diagram 57/24; thence west along that line to a point situate north of the 186 mile post on the former Number Two Rabbit Proof Fence aforesaid; thence south to that mile post; thence generally south-easterly along that former fence and onwards to the High Water Mark of the Southern Ocean; thence generally easterly along that High Water Mark to the 129 meridian of east longitude; thence north along that meridian to the High Water Mark of the Timor Sea in Joseph Bonaparte Gulf and thence generally south-westerly and generally southerly along that High Water Mark and the High Water Mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid to the starting point.
