- (4) Clear of all infiammable matter, firebreaks of not less than six feet in width around the boundaries of townsite lots used for grazing purposes or in agricultural pursuits.

Firebreaks: It is hereby notified for general information:—

(1) Variations: If for any reason it is considered impracticable to provide firebreaks in the position required by the above notice, the approval of the Shire Council must be obtained to construct such firebreaks in an alternative position. Approval to any such variation will only be granted where a bushfire control officer has first signified his approval to the variation.

(2) Developmental Areas: By 1972-73, all sandplain blocks will be required to have a minimum thirty foot firebreak on the boundaries of all scrub country.

- (3) Programmed Burning:
 - (a) Permits—Persons wishing to carry out a developmental clearing burn, should apply to the Shire Council, prior to the 1st December, 1970. Failure to observe this requirement, could preclude inclusion in the 1970-71 programme.
 - (b) Fire Break Widths—Unless otherwise instructed by a fire control officer, the minimum firebreak width for developmental clearing burns shall be sixty feet.

Zone 2—On or before September 30th, 1970, and thereafter maintained clear of all inflammable material until 1st February, 1971.

Zone 4—On or before October 21, 1970, and thereafter maintained clear of all inflammable material until 15th February, 1971.

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Corrigin.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act. you are hereby required, on or before the 15th October, 1970, so far as rural land is concerned and the 30th October, 1970, so far as townsite land is concerned, to remove from the land owned or occupied by you all inflammable material or to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following and thereafter to maintain the land or the firebreaks clear of all inflammable material up to and including the 31st day of March, 1971.

 - 2.2 Where the area of the land exceeds onehalf of one acre you shall clear of all inflammable material firebreaks not less than eight feet wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps situated on the

land and also immediately surrounding any drum or drums situated on the land which are normally used for the storage of fuel whether they contain fuel or not.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or remove inflammable material as required by notice you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer, not later that the 1st October, 1970, so far as rural land is concerned and the 15th October, 1970, so far as townsite land is concerned, for permission to provide firebreaks in an alternative position on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$200 and a person in default is liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirement of this notice is carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

 - (b) where the area of the land exceeds 4 acres clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least 6 feet wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land.

If it is considered to be impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised Officer not later than the 31st day of October, 1970,

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Northam.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the dates referred to below to clear firebreaks on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the following and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of all infiammable material up to and including the 15th day of April, 1971:—

- (1) you shall on or before 15th day of October, 1970, clear of all infiammable material firebreaks of at least six feet in width immediately inside and along all external boundaries of the land; and

- (6) you shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1970, clear of all inflammable material (including standing and fallen trees, branches and undergrowth) firebreaks of at least ten feet in width along and as close as possible to all external boundaries of each separate area of undeveloped land and in such extra positions so as areas of undeveloped land of more than 500 acres are divided into areas of no more than 500 acres completely surrounded by a firebreak;
- (7) you shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1970, completely clear of all infiammable material all separate townsite lots where the lot is one acre or less in area.

Dividing Line:

An imaginary line commencing at the north-eastern corner of Avon Location 1779; thence running south and southeast along the western boundaries of Buckland Road (No. 25) and Irishtown Road (No. 109) to the northwestern boundary of the Town of Northam; thence northeast along the said boundary, along the northeastern and southeastern boundaries of the said town to its intersection of the Avon River; thence south along the said Avon River to the southeastern boundary of the Shire.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer, not later than the 7th October, 1970, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this Order is a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$200, and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this Order if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

Definitions and Clarification.

For purpose of correct interpretation of this notice please note that:— $\,$

- (1) Cropped Land:
 - (a) If several paddocks of standing crop or standing crop and pasture total no more than 250 acres then a firebreak completely surrounding the several paddocks is sufficient.
 - (b) If a single paddock comprises several areas of standing crop divided by pasture, timbered, stony or other areas and the total

- area of the paddock is no more than 250 acres, then a firebreak surrounding the paddock is sufficient.
- (c) If a single paddock of standing crop or standing crop and pasture combined is more than 250 acres in area, then additional firebreaks would have to be provided so as to divide the paddock into separate areas of no more than 250 acres, with each separate area being surrounded by a firebreak.

(2) Undeveloped Land:

- (a) Undeveloped land should be regarded as land which is virtually still in its virgin state and includes land on which development has commenced but has not been completed to any final stage. The term is not intended to apply to areas of bush or semi bush which have been left uncleared within a developed property because of the nature of the terrain or for shelter or similar purposes. Land which is developed to a "Parkland" state should be considered as developed land.
- (b) An area of undeveloped land means an area, irrespective of shape or size which is not completely or partially divided by developed land. This means if two undeveloped areas, whether of the same location number or not, are separated by developed land, they must be regarded as separate areas and should be treated accordingly.
- (3) Owner or Occupier: An owner or occupier is considered by this Office to be the person registered in Council's ratebook as such, irrespective of whether the land concerned is subject of Conditional Purchase Agreement, Contract of Sale, Mortgage, etc.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 6th day of November, 1970, to plough, cultivate, scarify or otherwise clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks not less than six (6) feet wide in the following position on all land owned or occupied by you and thereafter to maintain such firebreaks until the 1st day of April, 1971.

- (a) Rural Land:
 - (1) Inside and within one (1) chain of the boundaries of all land used for pasture.
 - (2) Within one (1) chain of the boundary of all land under crop.
 - (3) Within five (5) chains of the perimeter of all buildings on the land.

Firebreaks in the situation described hereunder will be acceptable as complying with the requirements of the notice as far as it applies to the common boundary between the lands of any owners and occupiers and the abutting lands referred to hereunder:—

- (1) Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts on a Public road and the owner or occupier has burned or cleared the bush between the road formation and the common boundary. (NOTE: Ploughing of road sides is prohibited by the Pingelly Shire Council.)
- (2) Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts on Crown Land or Reserves and the owner or occupier has cleared a firebreak not less than six (6) feet wide on the Crown Land Reserves along the Common Boundary.

- (b) Townsite Land:
 - (1) All vacant Lots are required to be cleared of all debris and inflammable material.
 - (2) Material constituting a fire hazard to be cleared from all other Townsite Lots.

If for any reason it is considered impracticable to comply with any provision of this notice a written application for a variation may be made to the Shire Council and must reach the Shire Clerk by the 30th day of October, 1970.

Townsite Land.

All lots within the Townsites of Harrismith, Tincurrin, Toolibin, Wickepin and Yealering are required to be totally cleared of all debris of infiammable material.

If it is considered impracticable, for any reason, to clear firebreaks in the position required by this notice, or to otherwise comply with this Order, the approval of the Council must be obtained before the Fourteenth day of October, 1970, to provide them in an alternative situation.

Failure to comply with these requirements renders the owner or occupier liable to a penalty of not less than 10 nor more than 200.

If for any reason it is considered impracticable to provide firebreaks in the position required by this notice, the approval of the Shire Council must be obtained to prepare such firebreaks in an alternative position. Approval to any such variation will only be granted where the Bush Fire Control Officer for the area has first signified his approval to the variation.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$200 and a person in default is also liable,

whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

The passenger shall be provided with a sleeping berth or reserved seat ticket showing the car and berth or seat number and the date of travel.
- (b) Every passenger travelling on a pass which includes sleeping accommodation shall reserve such accommodation and receive a certificate showing the car and berth or seat numbers and date of travel.
- (c) All berth or seat tickets and certificate showing berth allotments shall be shown on demand.
- (d) Limited allotments are provided for return journey bookings at Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide and Perth. Passengers holding return tickets shall secure the necessary sleeping berth, or reserved seat allotments, either at the original booking station, or before commencing the return journey.
