ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 498/63.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (3) of section 614 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1970, that where in accordance with subsection (1) of that section a Council has determined and included a different amount in the general rate to be imposed under Section 548 of that Act, the Governor, may, notwithstanding that subsection by Order direct (inter alia) that the Council may be relieved from the obligation to determine and include a different amount in the general rate; and whereas the Council of the Shire of Donnybrook-Balingup did impose differential rating in respect of Loans raised by it for the purpose of providing works and undertakings in the two

(c) A firebreak of not less than 6 feet width within 5 chains of the perimeter of each building or haystack or group thereof and enclosing the same.

And further must remove on or before the 1st day of October, 1970, all inflammable material within 6 feet of any building or haystack on such land.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or remove inflammable material as required by this notice you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 15th October, 1970, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. - (ii) unless the building, screen or structure onto which it is proposed to project such sign or signs is specified in the application for such licence;
- (iii) in respect of any such sign which when projected onto a building, screen or structure is more than forty (40) feet in width or forty (40) feet in height;
- (iv) unless the licence specifies the building, screen or structure onto which such sign or signs may be projected.

(c) Where it is proposed to project such signs onto a building, screen or structure in a series Council may issue one licence in respect of all the signs in that series provided that no sign or signs other than that or those in respect of which a licence has been issued shall be projected.

(d) Where a licence has been issued by the Council pursuant to this clause the sign or signs in respect of which it has been issued shall not be projected onto any building, screen or structure not specified in such licence.

(e) The owner or occupier of any building, screen or structure shall not permit any sign or signs to be projected onto the same unless a licence has been issued pursuant to this clause.

By-laws Relating to Fencing.

L.G. 413/70.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 24th day of February, 1970, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following By-law.

By-law No. 76.

1. These by-laws are made for the general control of fences within the boundaries of the Municipality of the Town of Northam.

2. In these by-laws, unless the context requires otherwise—

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Northam;

“Dangerous fence” means any fence or wall certified by the Surveyor to be dangerous by reason of its faulty design, construction deterioration of constituent materials, damage by termites, change in ground level, or other cause subsequent to construction;

“Dividing fence” means any fence that separates the lands of different owners whether the fence is on the common boundary of adjoining lands or on a line other than the common boundary;

“Fence” means any fence or wall and includes a retaining wall;

“Residential Area” means the area which is zoned in the Town of Northam as residential;

“Rural Area” means the area which is zoned in the Town of Northam as rural;

“Surveyor” means the Building Surveyor to the Municipality.

3. A person shall not commence to erect, proceed with the erection, rebuild, reconstruct, or alter any fence, pergola or hood attached to any gateway or fence if it is situated within 30 feet of a street alignment and exceeds four feet in height unless and until he has lodged with the Council two copies of the plan and specification of the proposed fence or the proposed rebuilding, reconstruction, or alteration, and the Council has approved a copy of the plan and specifications.

4. A person shall not commence to erect, proceed with the erection, rebuild, reconstruct, or alter any fence exceeding 6 feet in height on the boundary of an allotment unless and until he has lodged with the Council two copies of the plan and specification of the proposed fence or the proposed rebuilding, reconstruction, or alteration, and the Council has approved a copy of the plan and specifications.

5. A person shall not erect a fence exceeding four feet in height on any frontage of an allotment which is situated at the intersection of two or more streets within a distance of 30 feet from the point of intersection of the lines obtained by producing the streets alignments fronting the allotment provided however that on an allotment being lawfully used for industrial purposes the Council may permit a link mesh fence to be erected to a greater height than four feet if the Council is satisfied that any such fence would not materially affect the visibility of drivers of vehicles approaching the intersection.

6. A person shall not erect or affix or allow to remain on any fence bounding an allotment owned or occupied by him in a residential or business area any barbed or other wire with spiked or jagged projections nor shall any persons erect or affix or allow to remain on any fence bounding an allotment owned or occupied by him in an industrial area any barbed or other wire with spiked or jagged projections unless the wire is carried on posts bent back into the allotment from the boundary at an angle of 45 degrees, nor unless the bottom row of wire is set back 6 inches from the face of the fence and is not nearer than 7 feet to the ground.

7. A person shall not affix to or allow to remain upon any fence on an allotment owned or occupied by him in a residential or business area any broken glass nor shall a person affix to or allow to remain upon any fence which is erected upon an allotment owned or occupied by him and which abuts on to any street or public place any broken glass.

8. A person shall not construct any fence with second hand galvanised iron or other second hand material unless he shall previously have obtained the written consent of the Council which consent the Council may in its absolute discretion refuse to grant upon such terms and conditions as it deems fit.

9. A person may construct a fence of brick, concrete, masonry, wrought iron, tubular steel, link mesh or timber sheathed with pickets, palings, boarding or asbestos, new galvanised iron or other materials approved by the Council, but no galvanised iron may be used within 30 feet of a street in any residential area. In Rural Areas, in addition to the foregoing materials, a fence may be erected of posts and wire or posts and rails.

10. The owner and occupier of each allotment within the Municipality of the Town of Northam shall maintain all fences erected thereon in good condition and so as to prevent them from becoming dilapidated, dangerous, unsightly, or prejudicial to the property in, or the inhabitants of the neighbourhood.

11. A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications set out in the schedules hereto is hereby prescribed to be a sufficient fence for the purposes of the Dividing Fences Act, 1961.

12. Any person who does anything in contravention of any of the provisions of this By-law or who fails to carry out any duty or requirement imposed upon him by this By-law commits an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a maximum penalty of \$100 and in addition to a maximum daily penalty of \$10 per day during which the offence continues.

First Schedule.

Fences in Residential Areas.

Across a frontage and for a distance of 30 feet from the street alignment along a side boundary except in clause 3 hereof a fence shall not exceed 4 feet in height and shall be constituted of the materials permitted by clause 9 hereof. Thereafter along the side boundary and along the rear boundary the fence shall be constructed as follows:—

First posts and rear corner posts shall not be less than 5 in. x 5 in. x 7 ft. and intermediate posts shall not be less than 5 in. x 3 in. x 7 ft. all spaced at not more than 9 ft. centres.

All posts shall be sunk at least 2 feet into the ground.

Corner posts shall be strutted two ways with 4 in. x 2 in. soles and 3 in. x 2 in. struts.

Intermediate posts shall be double yankee strutted with 6 in. x 1 in. x 18 in. struts.

Posts shall be checked for not less than 2 rows of rails.

Rails shall be not less than 3 in. x 2 in. each rail spanning 2 bays of fencing with joints staggered.

The fence shall be covered with not less than 3 in. x $\frac{3}{4}$ in. x 6 ft. sawn pickets or palings, cut square on top.

All pickets or palings shall be placed not more than 3 in. apart and shall be double nailed to each rail.

Second Schedule.

Rural Areas.

The dividing boundary fencing shall be constructed of sawn, split or round wooden, steel or reinforced concrete posts set not less than 18 in. in the ground and not less than 48 in. out of the ground. Posts shall be placed not more than 12 ft. apart unless droppers, of a type approved by the Council, are used with a wooden post fence and then the wooden posts may be placed at not more than 30 ft. centres with droppers every 10 ft. Strainers shall be placed 3 ft. in the ground, suitably and securely strutted at all corners, gateways and fence angle lines, but not exceeding 10 chn. apart except where an all steel post fence is erected and then the strainers shall be not more than 8 chn. apart. All gates to be of a type which can be swung, or alternatively gates made of wire to at least the same standard as the fencing.

The retaining material of the fence shall be of sheep-proof type, consisting of ringlock, mesh or rabbit netting or such other product as the Council may from time to time approve, or alternatively 6 plain (not less than 10 gauge) or barbed galvanised wires, securely fastened or threaded to wooden posts. If steel posts are used, 7 plain or barbed galvanised wires may be used.

At least two wires, either or alternatively plain or barbed, shall be fitted. All wire shall be wrapped around strainer posts and strained tight. Where fences are on the road boundaries, barbed wires must be placed on the property side of the posts.

The fencing design and construction shall be in accordance with accepted good farming practices.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Canning hereby records having resolved on the 22nd day of June, 1970, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

The By-laws prescribing what constitutes a sufficient fence and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 13th day of June, 1962, as amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of January, 1966, are hereby repealed.

1. In these By-laws unless the context requires otherwise—

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Canning.

“Dangerous Fence” means a fence in a dangerous condition by reason of faulty design, location, construction, deterioration of materials, damage by termites, decay, changes in ground levels or any other cause.

“Fence” means a fence abutting a road or a fence on a boundary line of an allotment of land and includes a wall.

“Industrial and Commercial Zone” means any portion of the Shire of Canning that is classified as District Shopping, Local Shopping, Office, Showrooms, Warehouse, Service Station, Drive-In Cinemas, Motel, Hotel, Light Industry, General Industry, Caravan Park, Other Commercial Business and Special Business.

“Residential Zone” means any portion of the Shire of Canning from time to time classified as a residential zone.

2. A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications set out in the First Schedule hereto is hereby prescribed as a Sufficient Fence for the purposes of the Dividing Fences Act, 1961, within those portions of the Shire of Canning as are classified as Residential Zones.

3. A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications set out in the Second Schedule hereto is hereby prescribed as a Sufficient Fence for the purposes of the Dividing Fences Act, 1961, within an Industrial and Commercial Zone.

4. A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications set out in the Third Schedule hereto is hereby prescribed as a Sufficient Fence for the purposes of the Dividing Fences Act, 1961, within those portions of the Shire of Canning as are classified as Rural Zones.

5. Where a fence is erected on the boundary between differing zones, a Sufficient Fence shall be that prescribed for Residential Zone.

6. No person shall erect a fence of second hand material without the written consent of the Council, which consent the Council may in its absolute discretion grant on condition that the material is in the opinion of the Building Surveyor, of a quality and appearance comparable with new material.

7. Minimum Specifications for Fencing: No person shall construct a fence or any other structure in front of the building line in a Residential Zone greater than 3 feet 6 inches in height without first having made written application to and obtained the approval of the Council.

8. No person shall on an allotment of land situated at the corner of two streets erect a fence or any other structure on or adjacent to the street boundary greater than 3 feet 6 inches in height within 30 feet of the street corner.

9. No person shall erect a dividing fence, behind a building line in a Residential Zone greater than 6 feet in height, without first having made written application to and obtained the approval of the Council.

10. No person shall erect a fence wholly or partly of barbed wire except in accordance with these By-laws. A fence may be erected wholly or partly of barbed wire:—

- (1) In a Rural Zone;
- (2) In an Industrial and Commercial Zone if no barbed wire is used below six feet from the ground;
- (3) In any other part of the Shire of Canning with the permission of the Council and only if no barbed wire is used below six feet from the ground.

11. No person shall erect a fence which is dangerous.

12. The owner and occupier of land on which a fence is erected shall maintain the fence in good condition and in such manner as to prevent it from becoming dangerous, in bad condition and repair, dilapidated, unsightly or prejudicial to the property in, or the inhabitants of the neighbourhood.

13. The Council may give notice in writing to the owner or the occupier of any land upon which is erected a fence which is dangerous, in bad condition and repair, dilapidated, unsightly or prejudicial to the amenity or value of property in or the inhabitants of the neighbourhood or is contrary to the provisions of By-laws, requiring such owner or occupier to pull down, remove, repair, paint or maintain such fence within the time stipulated in the notice.

14. Where the owner or occupier of land who has been given notice under By-law 13 of these By-laws fails to comply therewith the Council may enter upon such land and carry out the works specified in the notice and costs and expenses incurred by the Council in so doing may be recovered from such owner or occupier in a Court of competent jurisdiction.

15. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of these By-laws or shall be guilty of an offence shall be liable to:—

- (1) A maximum penalty of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) and
- (2) In addition a maximum daily penalty of Ten Dollars (\$10) for each day during which the offence continues.

First Schedule.

Residential Zone.

(a) Dividing Fence along side boundary:

Front corner posts shall be 5 in. x 5 in. x 5 ft. 6in. and rear corner posts shall be 5 in. x 5 in. x 7 ft and intermediate posts for the first 27 feet from the front shall be 5. in. x 3 in. x 5 ft. 6 in. and thereafter 5 in. x 3 in. x 7ft. all spaced at not more than nine feet centres.

All posts shall have tops with 2½ in. weather and shall be sunk at least two feet into the ground.

Corner posts shall be strutted two ways with 4 in x 2 in. soles and 3 in. x 2 in. struts.

Intermediate posts shall be double yankee strutted with 6 in. x 1 in. x 18 in. struts.

Posts shall be checked for two rows of nails.

Rails shall be 3 in. x 2 in. each rail spanning two bays of fencing with joints staggered.

Fences shall be covered for the first three bays with Cyclone Mesh and for the next bay by 3 in. x ¾ in. sawn pickets of graduated length rising from 3 ft. 6 in. to 5 ft. Thereafter fence shall be covered with 3 in. x ¾ in. x 5 ft. sawn pickets placed 3 ins. apart double nailed to each rail.

(b) Dividing fence along rear boundary:

Corner posts shall be 5 in. x 5 in. x 7 ft. and intermediate posts shall be 5 in. x 3 in. x 7 ft. spaced at not more than nine feet centres.

All posts shall have tops with 2½ in. weather and shall be sunk at least two feet into the ground.

Corner posts shall be strutted two ways with 4 in. x 2 in. soles plates and 3 in. x 2 in. struts.

Intermediate posts shall be double yankee strutted with 6 in. x 1 in. x 18 in. struts.

Posts shall be checked for two rows of rails.

Rails shall be 3 in. x 2 in. each rail spanning two bays of fencing with joints staggered.

Fence shall be covered with 3 in. x ¾ in. x 5 ft. sawn pickets placed three inches apart, double nailed to each rail.

Second Schedule.

Industrial and Commercial Zones.

A fence consisting of railless links mesh to a height of 6 feet on top of which are three strands of barbed wire carrying the fence to height of not less than 7 feet supported by galvanised iron posts of a minimum diameter of 1½ ins. and sunk in the ground a minimum of 2 ft. encased in concrete.

Third Schedule.

Rural Zones.

The fence shall be erected from sawn, split or round wooden posts set not less than 24 inches in the ground and not less than 48 inches out of the ground and spaced not more than 12 feet apart with strainer posts set 3 ft. 6 in. in the ground and suitably and securely strutted at all corners, gateways and fence line angles but not exceeding 10 chains apart. Each fence post shall be bored with not less than five half-inch suitably spaced holes to be threaded with not less than five plain galvanised wires. Wire shall be wrapped around strainer and strained tight.

The following materials shall be used:—

- (a) Wire—Shall not be less than 12½ gauge.
- (b) Posts—If of jam, white gum, jarrah or other indigenous timber, be cut not less than six feet long by four inches diameter at small end if round or 5 in. x 2½ in. if split or sawn.
- (c) Strainer Posts—Not less than seven feet six inches long and six inches diameter at small end shall be cut from indigenous timbers.

By-laws Relating to Parking in the Commercial Area.

L.G. 376/70.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 23rd day of March, 1970, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. These by-laws shall apply to the area within the District of the Council bounded by Stirk Street, Railway Road, Mead Street and Canning Road and to Lots 13, 14, 15, 16, 22 and 23 Canning Road between Heath Road and Kalamunda Road (all of which are hereinafter referred to as "the Commercial Area").

2. After the date upon which these by-laws shall come into operation no person shall—

- (a) construct or erect any building or buildings within the Commercial Area; or
- (b) alter amend add to or extend any existing building or buildings within the Commercial Area,

unless provision shall be made for car parking space in the following ratios that is to say—

- (i) In the ratio of three square feet of car parking space for every one square foot of gross developed commercial or retail floor area.
- (ii) In the ratio of one square foot of car parking space for every one square foot of gross developed office or professional floor area.

Provided that it shall not be necessary for such car parking spaces to be provided in or upon the lot or lots upon which the building is or the buildings are situated or to be constructed or erected but the said car parking spaces may with the consent of the Council be provided in or upon another lot or lots but such lot or lots shall be within the limits of the Commercial Area.

3. Car parking spaces shall be paved and drained and paved access ways thereto shall be constructed to the satisfaction of the Council and the owner of the land upon which such car parking spaces shall be provided shall plant and thereafter maintain such trees and shrubs as may be required by the Council.

4. If the owner of any premises to which these by-laws apply shall fail to keep or maintain such trees or shrubs as may be required by the Council the Council may serve on the owner a notice requiring him to comply with the provisions of these by-laws and if he shall fail or neglect to do so within the period specified in the notice (not being less than fourteen days) the Council shall have power to enter upon the land upon which the car parking spaces shall be situated with or without workmen agents servants and contractors and to carry out such works as may be necessary to bring the said land and car parking spaces into conformity with the provisions of these by-laws and all costs and expenses paid or incurred by the Council in so doing may be recovered from the owner in a Court of competent jurisdiction provided that the Council may enter into agreements with the owners of land within the Commercial Area for the planting and maintaining of such trees or shrubs upon such terms and conditions as the Council may think fit.

5. No person shall without the approval in writing of the Council erect or construct or cause to be erected or constructed any boundary dividing or other fence upon any land upon which car parking spaces shall have been provided as required by these by-laws.

6. The filling shall not be higher than a level nominated by the Council, and shall be fixed all over and at the extremities of the filling in such a manner so as to provide adequate surface runoff without detriment to adjoining properties.

3. Every owner or occupier of land upon whom a notice is served under By-law 2 of these by-laws shall comply with such notice within the time therein specified.

4. Where the owner or occupier does not clear the land or remove the refuse, rubbish or disused material as required by the notice given by the Council, the Council may, without payment of any compensation in respect thereof, clear or remove it, and dispose of it at the expense of, and recover in a court of competent jurisdiction the amount of the expense, from the owner or occupier to whom the notice was given.

5. Any person who fails to comply with any notice served under By-law 2 of these by-laws commits an offence against these by-laws and on conviction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty (40 dollars).
