WHEREAS by clause 14 of the Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom constituting the Great Seal of the United Kingdom constituting the office of Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, bearing date the 29th October, 1900, it is provided that in the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent from the seat of Government or from the State, he may in every such case, by an instrument under the Public Seal of the State, constitute and appoint the Lieutenant Governor to be his Deputy during such absence, and in that capacity to exercise perform and execute for and capacity to exercise, perform and execute for and on behalf of the Governor, during such absence but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor by such Letters Patent as shall in and by such instrument be specified; and whereas I, the said Governor, propose to absent myself temporarily from the seat of Government: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, do by this instrument under the Public Seal of the State constitute and appoint you the said Sir Albert Wolff as from the date of my departure upon the said absence to be my Deputy, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute for and on my behalf, as such Governor, all the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent.

  - (a) where the area of the land is more than one-half of one acre, firebreaks at least six feet wide shall be cleared of all infiammable material immediately inside all boundaries of the land;

(b) where there are buildings or haystacks situated on the land, all inflammable material shall be cleared within one chain of the perimeter of all buildings and haystacks or groups of buildings and haystacks so as to completely surround the buildings or haystacks or groups of buildings and haystacks.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove infiammable material from land as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer, not later than the 15th day of November, 1970, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.
