AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber at Perth, this 18th day of November, 1970, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Local Government Act, 1960-1970.

Kalgoorlie Regional Traffic District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 884/62.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 329 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1970, that the Governor shall in an Order in Council constituting a county district or regional district specify the number of members to be allotted to the district and the numbers of members to be nominated by each constituent council; and whereas it is further enacted by that subsection that the Governor may from time to time by Order alter that number; and whereas the Kalgoorlie Regional Traffic District was constituted by an Order in Council under that section; and whereas by Order in Council dated the 19th December, 1968 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th December, 1968 seven members were allotted to the district, of whom three were nominated by the Kalgoorlie Town Council, three by the Kalgoorlie Shire Council and one by the Coolgardie Shire Council; and whereas by Order in Council dated the 12th November, 1969 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 12th December, 1969 the name of the Municipality of the Shire of Kalgoorlie was altered to that of the Shire of Boulder; and whereas it is considered expedient that an alteration should be made in the number of members allotted to the district by the addition of two more members from the Coolgardie Shire Council: Now, therefore His Excellency acting with the advice of the Executive Council doth hereby specify that nine members shall be allotted to the district, of whom three shall be nominated by the Kalgoorlie Town Council, three by the Boulder Shire Council and three by the Coolgardie Shire Council.

Alteration in Numbers of Offices of Councillor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 308/54.

WHEREAS it is provided (*inter alia*) by paragraph (j) of subsection (2) of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1970, that the Governor may, by Order made after effective presentation to him of a petition bearing the Common Seal of each municipality which will be directly affected by the Order, within the limits prescribed by the Local Government Act, 1960-1970, alter the number of offices of councillor assigned to a municipality; and whereas the Shire of Port Hedland has effectively presented to the Governor a petition praying that the number of offices of councillor assigned to that municipality be altered from seven to nine; and whereas it is considered expedient that the prayer of the petition should be granted; and whereas it is further provided (*inter alia*) by paragraph (d) of subsection (4) of the said section 12, that the Governor may, by Order made without a petition give such directions as he thinks necessary in order to give effect to an alteration in the number of the members of a council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter the number of offices of councillor assigned to the municipality of the Shire of Port Hedland from seven to nine and direct that the two additional councillors shall retire on the fourth Saturday in May, 1971 and the fourth Saturday in May, 1973, and that the order of retirement of those members shall be in inverse order to the order of their election.

FAUNA CONSERVATION ACT, 1950-1970.

Notice.

Department of Fisheries and Fauna,
Perth, 16th November, 1970.

F.D. 49/48.

PURSUANT to the powers vested in me by virtue of sections 14 and 17B of the Fauna Conservation Act, 1950-1970, I hereby declare as follows:—

- (1) That the period from six o'clock in the afternoon of Saturday, 19th December, 1970, to eight o'clock in the afternoon of Sunday, 10th January, 1971, shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild duck in the Second Schedule hereto in those parts of the State which lie within the boundaries of the South-West and Eucla Divisions as defined in section 28 of the Land Act, 1933, with the exception of those areas defined in the First Schedule hereto.

- (2) That a person shall not take any wild duck or the egg of any wild duck for the purpose of keeping it in captivity, or for the purpose of aviculture, or for the purpose of sale.
- (3) That a person shall not sell any wild duck.
- (4) That a person shall not take any wild duck by any means other than a shotgun licensed pursuant to the Firearms and Guns Act, 1931, and having a calibre less than thirty-one fortieths of an inch in internal diameter (ten gauge), provided that this restriction shall not prohibit a person who is a native within the meaning of the Native Welfare Act, 1905, from using any native artifact in the taking of wild ducks.
- (5) That a person shall not take or attempt to take wild ducks from any boat, raft, launch or other type of boat which is powered by any type of motor or engine or which is propelled or towed by any means other than by hand.
- (6) That a person shall not take or attempt to take more than eight wild ducks in any one day of the open season.
- (7) That a person shall not have under his control or in his possession or keep in any cool store or any freezing chamber or other premises at any one time—
- (a) on opening day more than eight wild ducks;
- (b) on any day other than opening day of the open season, more than sixteen wild ducks.
