Land Act, 1933-1969.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 1919/94.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1969, it is inter alia, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said Section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 30653 should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to The Commissioners of the Presbyterian Church in Western Australia to be held in trust for "Ecclesiastical Purposes": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid body, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Local Government Act, 1960-1970.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

LG 1350/52.

WHEREAS it is, inter alia, provided in subsection (2) of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1970 that the Governor by Order made after effective presentation to him of a petition bearing the common seal of each municipality which will be directly affected by the Order may declare a shire to be a town; and whereas the Shire of Canning, being the only municipality which will be directly affected by this Order, has made an effective presentation to the Governor of such petition; and whereas it is further provided, *inter alia*, in paragraphs (g), (h) and (j) of subsection (2) of the said section that on presentation of an effective petition, the Governor may alter the boundaries of, or abolish wholly or in part, wards existing in a district, create new wards in a district and determine and alter the number of offices of councillor assigned to a municipality; and whereas it is further provided, inter alia; by paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 10 of the said Act that on the petition of the Council the Governor may determine that the number of councillors for any ward may be more or less than three and the number of councillors for each ward need not be equal; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (d) of subsection (4) of section 12 of the

the said Act that the Governor may give such directions as he thinks necessary in order to give effect to an alteration in the number of the members of a Council or to make the number of offices of member of a Council conform to the limits imposed by the said Act, or to give effect otherwise to the provisions of Part III of an order made under that Part; and whereas the Shire of Canning is divided into four Wards and has allotted to it eleven members; and whereas the Shire of Canning has presented a petition praying that the number of Wards should be increased to six and that the number of Councillors should be increased to seventeen; and whereas it is considered desirable to grant the petition of the Council of the municipality; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 20 of the said Act, that where the Governor exercises a power conferred by section 12 of the said Act he may direct who, if any, of the members, whose district is affected by the exercise of the power, shall go out of office and when, and may direct the holding, on a day appointed by the order, of an election of such members so effected and may order, settle, adjust and finally determine such rights, liabilities, questions and matters relating to the representation of electors on the Council of a municipality so affected, the constitution of the council the audit of the municipal accounts and such other matters as he thinks necessary to be ordered, settled, adjusted or determined, and in such manner as he thinks fit: now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby-

- (1) declare the Shire of Canning to be a town under the name of the Town of Canning;
- (2) abolish the existing wards of the Shire of Canning and create new wards as designated in the Schedule hereto;
- (3) order that the number of offices of councillor representing the respective wards shall be as follows—

- (4) order that the persons who were councillors of the municipality of the Shire of Canning immediately before this Order takes effect shall be the councillors of the Town of Canning but shall retire from office on the 22nd May, 1971, on which day an election shall be held to return seventeen councillors to the Council representing the respective wards in the manner provided by paragraph (3) of this Order:
- (5) order that the person who was, immediately before this Order takes effect, the President of the Shire of Canning shall be Mayor of the Town of Canning for such time as he would, but for this Order, have been that President;
- (6) order that in the municipality of the Town of Canning the system of audit of municipal accounts shall be the same as it is in the municipality of the Shire of Canning immediately before this Order takes effect; and
- (7) direct that this Order shall take effect on and from the 24th January, 1971.

WARDS OF THE TOWN OF CANNING.

West Ward:

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the northeastern boundary of Canning Location 65 with the centre line of Manning Road, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Canning, and extending generally easterly along that centre line to its intersection with the prolongation southwesterly of the centre line of Hamilton Street; thence northeasterly to and generally northeasterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Welshpool Road; thence westerly about 1 chain along that centre line; thence 10 degrees 0 minutes, about 20 chains 80 links, to the prolongation southwesterly of the centre line of Kewdale Road, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 9521, sheet 2; thence northeasterly along that prolongation to the southern boundary of the Kewdale Freight Terminal, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 7258 sheet 3, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Canning aforesaid, and thence generally southwesterly along boundaries of that Shire to the starting point.

North Ward:

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the northwestern boundary of Canning Location 316, as shown on Original Plan Canning 141, with the centre line of the South-Western Railway, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Canning, and extending generally northwesterly along that centre line to the centre line of Hamilton Street; thence northeasterly along that centre line, and onwards to the centre line of Welshpool Road; thence westerly about 1 chain along that centre line; thence 10 degrees 0 minutes, about 20 chains 80 links, to the prolongation southwesterly of the centre line of Kewdale Road, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 9521 sheet 2; thence northeasterly along that prolongation to the southern boundary of the Kewdale Freight Terminal, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 7258 sheet 3, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Canning aforesaid, and thence generally easterly and generally southwesterly along boundaries of that shire to the starting point.

Central Ward:

All that portion of land bounded by line starting at the intersection of other northeastern boundary of Canning Location 65 with the centre line of Manning Road, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Canning, and extending generally easterly along that centre line to its intersection with the prolongation southwesterly of the centre line of Hamilton Street; thence northeasterly to and generally northeasterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of the South-Western Railway; thence generally southeasterly along that centre line to its intersection with the northwestern boundary of Location 316, as shown on Original Plan Canning 141, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Canning aforesaid, and thence southwesterly along boundaries of that shire to the starting point.

River Ward:

All that portion of land bounded by line starting at the intersection of the western boundary of Canning Location 25, as shown on Original Plan Canning 56, with the centre line of Apsley Road, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Canning, and extending generally easterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Riley Road; thence northerly along that centre line and onwards to the left bank of the Canning River, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Canning aforesaid, and thence generally westerly, generally southerly and generally easterly along boundaries of that shire to the starting point. East Ward:

All that portion of land bounded by line starting at the intersection of the centre line of Nicholson Road with the centre line of the Roe Freeway, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Canning, and extending generally westerly along the centre line of the Roe Freeway to the centre line of Riley Road; thence generally northerly along that centre line and onwards to the left bank of the Canning River, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Canning aforesaid, and thence generally easterly and generally southsouthwesterly along boundaries of that shire to the starting point.

South Ward:

All that portion of land bounded by line starting at the intersection of the western boundary of Canning Location 25, as shown on Original Plan Canning 56, with the centre line of Apsley Road, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Canning, and extending generally easterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Riley Road; thence generally southerly along that centre line to the centre line of the Roe Freeway; thence generally easterly along that centre line to the centre line of Nicholson Road, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Canning aforesaid, and thence generally southerly, generally northwesterly and northerly along boundaries of that shire to the starting point.

Local Government Act, 1960-1970.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1970, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the Government Gazette to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereto have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets, and such lands shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.


