WHEREAS it is enacted, by section 2 of the Commonwealth Places (Administration of Laws) Act, 1970, that the Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby fix the date on which this proclamation is published in the Government Gazette as the date on which the Commonwealth Places (Administration of Laws) Act, 1970 shall come into operation.

Land Act, 1933-1969.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 4110/67.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1969, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of subleasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 28933 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Busselton in trust for the purpose of "Caravan Park": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Busselton in trust for "Caravan Park" with power to the said Shire of Busselton, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.


