Magnet: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby suspend the operation of subsections (1) and (2) of section 36 of the Act, in the district of the municipality of the Shire of Mt. Magnet for a period commencing on the date on which this proclamation is published in the *Government Gazette* and ending on the 31st December, 1971.

Change of Status.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 39/66.

WHEREAS it is, *inter alia*, provided by subsection (2) of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1970 that the Governor by Order made after the effective presentation to him of a petition bearing the common seal of each municipality which will be directly affected by the Order may declare a shire to be a town; and whereas it is, *inter alia*, provided by subsection (1) of section 10 of the said Act that where the district of a town is divided into wards, on the petition of the council, the Governor may, if he thinks the circumstances referred to in the petition warrant it, determine that the number of councillors for any ward may be more or less than three and the number of councillors for each ward need not be equal; and whereas it is, *inter alia*, provided by subsection (1) of section 20 of the said Act, that when the Governor exercises a power conferred by section 12 of the said Act, the Governor having regard to the provisions of this Act relating to the number of offices of member of a council, by Order may order, settle, adjust and finally determine such rights, liabilities, questions and matters relating to the representation of electors on the council of the municipality so affected, the constitution of the council, the audit of the municipal accounts and such other matters as he thinks necessary to be ordered, settled, adjusted or determined, and in such manner as he thinks fit; and whereas eleven councillors, including the President, constitute the council of the Shire of Cockburn the district of which is divided into four wards called North, Central, South, and East that are respectively represented by four, three, two, and two councillors; and whereas that shire being the only municipality which will be directly affected by this Order has made an effective presentation to the Governor of a petition, bearing the common seal of the municipality, praying for the Governor to declare the shire a town and also praying for the Governor to determine that the number of councillors for any ward of the town may be more or less than three and the number of councillors for each ward need not be equal: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby—

- (1) declare the Shire of Cockburn to be a town under the name of the Town of Cockburn;
- (2) order that in the municipality of the Town of Cockburn the wards, the constitution of the council, the representation of electors on the council, the date of retirement of councillors, and the system of audit of the municipal accounts shall be the same as they are in the municipality of the Shire of Cockburn immediately before this Order takes effect;
- (3) order that the persons who are, immediately before this Order takes effect, the President and Deputy President, respectively, of the Shire of Cockburn shall be the Mayor and Deputy Mayor, respectively, of the Town of Cockburn for such time as they would, but for this Order, have been the President and Deputy President respectively;
- (4) direct that this Order shall take effect on and from the 24th January, 1971.

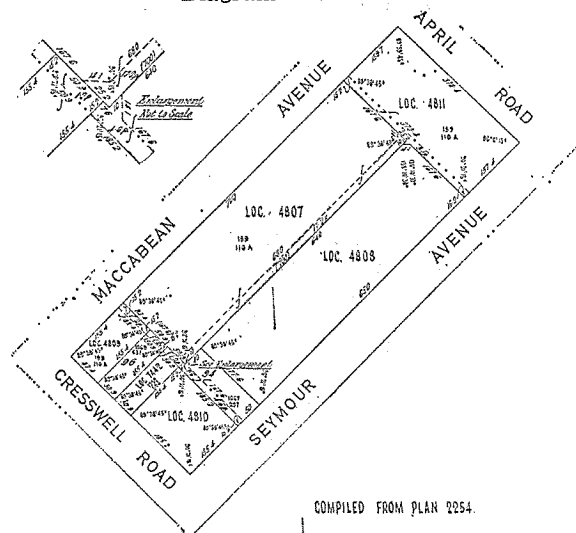

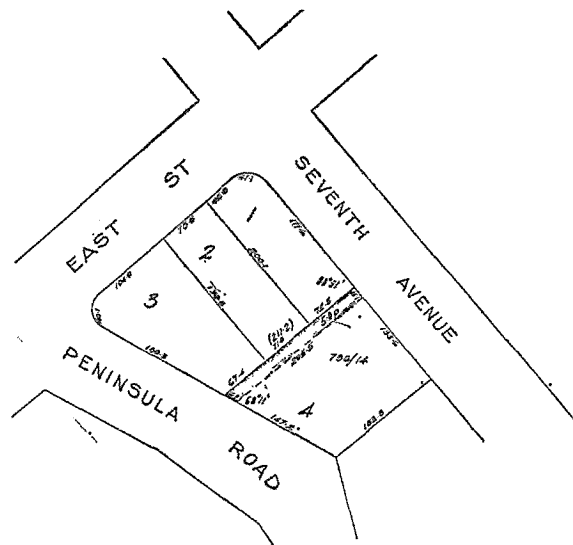

## SCHOOL BOUNDARIES.

## 1. Balga Junior Primary School:

The boundaries for the above school are as follows:—

From Mirrabooka Avenue west along Balga Avenue to Princess Road, southwest and south along Princess Road to the corner of Etchingham Road and Wilmington Crescent, east along Wilmington Crescent and Curlington Crescent and its continuation to Mirrabooka Avenue.

Children living in the boundary streets of Balga Avenue (south side) between Mirrabooka Avenue and Princess Road, Princess Road (east side) between Balga Avenue and Wilmington Crescent, and in Wilmington Crescent and Curlington Crescent, shall attend the Balga Junior Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Grades 1 and 2 in 1971 and living within the boundaries for the Balga Junior Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Balga Junior Primary School.

## 2. Gibbs Street Primary School:

The boundaries for the above school are as follows:—

From the junction of the extension of Lacey Street and Luyer Avenue, southwest along Lacey Street to the Railway Line, then northwest along the Railway Line to Thomas Street, and thence northeast along Thomas Street to Welshpool Road.

The boundary streets of Lacey Street and Thomas Street (both sides) are to be included in the area for the Gibbs Street School.

Children attending the Queens Park Primary School in 1970, and their younger siblings, and living in the Gibbs Street School area, shall have the option of attending either the Queens Park Primary School or the Gibbs Street Primary School from 1971.

Children attending Government schools and in Grades 1 to 5 inclusive in 1971 and living within the boundaries for the Gibbs Street Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Gibbs Street Primary School, irrespective of whether elder siblings are then attending the Beckenham or Cannington Schools, except for those children living in the optional area designated above.

## 3. Glendale Primary School:

The boundaries for the above school are as follows:—

From the junction of Balcatta Road with Duffy Road, east along Balcatta Road to Wanneroo Road, thence north along Wanneroo Road to the northern side of Beach Road.

The boundary street of Balcatta Road (both sides) is to be excluded from the area for the above school, and the boundary part of Wanneroo Road (west side only) is to be included in the area for the above school.

Children in Grade 7 only in 1971 and living in the Glendale School area shall have the option of remaining at their present (1970) school or of transferring to the Glendale School.

Children attending Government schools and in Grades 1 to 7 inclusive in 1971 and living

within the boundaries for the Glendale Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Glendale Primary School, except that children in Grade 7 in 1971 may remain at their present (1970) school or may transfer to the Glendale Primary School.

## 4. Lockridge Primary School:

The boundary for the above school is as follows:—

From the junction of Morley Drive and Lord Street, west along Morley Drive to the western side of Altone Road.

Children living on the north side of Morley Drive shall attend the Lockridge School, and children living on the south side of Morley Drive shall attend the Eden Hill School.

Children attending Government schools and in Grades 1 to 5 inclusive in 1971 and living within the boundaries for the Lockridge Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Lockridge Primary School, irrespective of whether elder siblings are attending the Eden Hill Primary School.

Children living in the boundary part of Sulphur Road (north side) shall attend the Orelia School, while those on the south side shall attend the North Parmelia School. Children living in the boundary part of Hennessy Avenue (west side) shall attend the Orelia School, while those on the east side shall attend the North Parmelia School. Children living in Wiggins Road (west side) shall attend the Orelia School, while those living on the east side shall attend the North Parmelia School.

Children in Grade 7 only in 1971 and living in the North Parmelia School area shall have the option of remaining at their present (1970) school or of transferring to the North Parmelia School.

Children attending Government schools and in Grades 1 to 7 inclusive in 1971 and living within the boundaries for the North Parmelia Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the North Parmelia Primary School, except that children in Grade 7 in 1971 may remain at their present (1970) school or may transfer to the North Parmelia Primary School.

## 7. North Beach and Marmion Primary Schools:

The following has been approved as an optional area:—

The area bounded on the north by Margaret Street and on the south by Castle Street, with both boundary streets being included in the optional area. Children living in this area may attend either the North Beach Primary School or the Marmion Primary School.

## 8. Rockingham Beach and Safety Bay Primary Schools:

The boundary between the above schools is as follows:—

**Boundary Road.**

Children living in Boundary Road (both sides) and south thereof shall attend the Safety Bay School.

Children living outside of the boundary of the school attended (in 1970) may complete their primary education at their present school if the parents so desire. Also Grade 1 sibilings (in 1971) may be admitted to the school which elder sibilings are already attending although resident outside of that particular school boundary.

**9. Cooinda, Carey Park, Bunbury and South Bunbury Primary Schools:**

The boundary between Cooinda Primary School and the three schools, Carey Park Primary School, Bunbury Primary School and South Bunbury Primary School is as follows:—

The Railway Line from Koombana Bay to Stevens Street, thence northeast along Stevens Street to Atkins Street, and thence along Atkins Street to the Preston River.

Children living in the boundary streets of Stevens and Atkins Streets (both sides) shall attend the Cooinda School.

The optional area in Wollaston will remain unchanged other than in the definition relating to Stevens Street and Atkins Street above.

The rights of the families already established at schools are protected. The boundary changes will apply to families sending a child to school for the first time, to families transferred to Bunbury and to families who move house within Bunbury and elect to transfer their children to the local school at that time or at the beginning of the next school year.

**10. Capel and Geelorup bus children:**

As from the beginning of the 1971 school year, the boundary across Bussell Highway will apply to the Capel and Geelorup bus services entering Bunbury from the south so that primary pupils carried on them are in the Adam Road Primary School zone.

This direction, however, shall also apply to all families sending a child to school for the first time and to families who transfer into the area.

Families with children in Grades 1, 2 and 3 are to be informed of the future intention that their children will attend the Newton Moore High School, and the offer is to be made that these children may transfer to the Adam Road School at the beginning of the 1971 school year, if the parents desire to do so.

**11. Adam Road and Carey Park Primary Schools:**

The boundary between Adam Road Primary School and Carey Park Primary School should be altered as follows:—

Deleting that section along the Bussell Highway south of Brittain Road and Underwood Street to the by-pass road.

Children living in Underwood Street (both sides) shall attend the Carey Park School, while children who may live in Brittain Road (both sides), when it is made, shall attend the Adam Road School.

The rights of families already established at schools are protected. The boundary changes will apply to families sending a child to school for the first time, the families transferred to Bunbury and to families who move house within Bunbury and elect to transfer their children to the local school at that time or at the beginning of the next school year.

**12. Camboon Primary School:**

The boundaries for the above school are as follows:—

From Widgee Road a line due south, parallel to and on the eastern side of Logan Way, to Gordon Road, east along Gordon Road to a point due north of the eastern extremity of Ranmore Way, south to Wolseley Road, east

along Wolseley Road to Camboon Road, south along Camboon Road to Lincoln Road, east along Lincoln Road and its extension to Napier Road, continuing east along Egham Place and Puttenham Street and its extension to Crimea Street, and then north along Crimea Street and its extension to Widgee Road.

The boundary parts of Gordon Road, Wolseley Road and Logan Way, and the boundary street of Lincoln Road are to be excluded from the area for the above school, while Camboon Road, Egham Place and Puttenham Street (both sides) and Crimea Street (western side only) are to be included in the area for the above school.

Children attending the North Morley Primary School in 1970, and their younger sibilings, living in the area bounded on the west by Camboon Road, on the north by Gordon Road, on the east by Cooper Street, and on the south by Lincoln Road (the first three boundary streets being included in the optional area but Lincoln Road being excluded) shall have the option of attending either the North Morley Primary School or the Camboon Primary School from 1971.

Children attending Government schools and in Grades 1 to 3 inclusive in 1971 and living within the boundaries for the Camboon Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Camboon Primary School, irrespective of whether elder sibilings are then attending either the North Morley Primary School or Morley Primary School, except for those children living in the optional area designated above.

**13. Neerigen Brook and Armadale Primary Schools:**

The present part boundary between the Armadale and Neerigen Brook Primary School, namely, "the old Railway Line westward from Dale Road", is hereby cancelled and a new boundary is substituted as follows: "and a line drawn northwest from Dale Road to Eighth Avenue, thence along Eighth Avenue to the Railway Line; children living in the boundary part of Eighth Avenue (both sides) shall attend the Armadale School".

From the beginning of the 1971 school year, the Neerigen Brook School will accommodate children in Grades 1 to 7 inclusive.

The present (1970) Grade 5 and 6 children attending the Armadale School and living within the area for the Neerigen Brook School shall be given the option, in 1971, of attending either the Armadale School or the Neerigen Brook School. However, once the option has been decided, no future option will be allowed.

**EDUCATION ACT, 1928-1969.**

- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Electoral Act Regulations, 1949, as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th August, 1949, and reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th February, 1968, and subsequently amended on the 6th March, 1968 by a notice so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 8 amended. 2. Regulation 8 of the principal regulations is amended by—  
(a) deleting the passage "print, or a written copy, of the" in lines two and three of subregulation (1);  
(b) substituting for the passage "1907-1967" in line seven of the certificate to subregulation (1) the passage "1907 (as amended)"; and  
(c) deleting the words "printed or written copy of the" in line one of subregulation (2).
- Reg. 15 amended. 3. Regulation 15 of the principal regulations is amended by substituting for paragraph (a) of subregulation (5), a paragraph as follows—  
(a) imposing on that person a penalty not exceeding \$2.00 for a first offence, or not exceeding \$10.00, for a second or subsequent offence; .
- Reg. 27E amended. 4. Regulation 27E of the principal regulations is amended by substituting for paragraph (b) a paragraph as follows:—  
(b) if the particulars are not already printed thereon insert in the ballot paper the name of the province or district for which the voter declares he is enrolled and the surnames of all the candidates for that province or district, arranged in the order determined by the Returning Officer in accordance with section 86 of the Act as appearing on the list of candidates issued by the Chief Electoral Officer.
- Reg. 27L amended. 5. Regulation 27L of the principal regulations is amended by substituting for paragraphs (a) and (b) of subregulation (1), paragraphs as follows:—  
(a) endorse on the envelope the polling place at which it is received, insert a consecutive number on the envelope, and sign and date the endorsement;  
(b) enter on the prescribed Form 27A the consecutive number shown on the envelope and the province or district for which the vote was recorded, if shown; .
- Reg. 31 revoked and remade. 6. The principal regulations are amended by revoking and re-making regulation 31 as follows:—  
31. Before handing the ballot paper to the voter the Presiding Officer shall endorse on it, in the space provided, the name of the province or district for which the voter declares he is enrolled, insert the surnames of all the candidates for that province or district arranged in the order determined by the Returning Officer in accordance with section 86 of the Act as appearing on the list of candidates issued by the Chief Electoral Officer, and shall initial the back of the ballot paper.



7. Regulation 32 of the principal regulations is amended by substituting for the word "or", in line six of subregulation (2), the word "and". Reg. 32 amended.
8. Regulation 33 of the principal regulations is amended by substituting for the word "centre", in line four of paragraph (b) of subregulation (3), the word "place". Reg. 33 amended.
9. Regulation 44 of the principal regulations is amended by inserting after the word "sealed", in line nine, the word "ballot". Reg. 44 amended.
10. Regulation 53 of the principal regulations is amended by substituting for the words "close of election", in line four of subregulation (1), the words "date fixed for the return of the writ". Reg. 53 amended.
11. Regulations 61, 62, 63 and 64 of the principal regulations are revoked and remade, as follows:— Regs. 61, 62, 63 and 64 revoked and remade.

61. (a) Every person who is an officer within the meaning of that expression as used in the Public Service Act, 1904, may be required by the Governor to act, and when so required, shall act in the capacity of Returning Officer, Deputy or Assistant Returning Officer, Presiding Officer, Assistant Presiding Officer, Poll Clerk or Doorkeeper, pursuant to the provisions of the Act.

(b) Those persons when so acting, and all officers appointed pursuant to the provisions of the Act, shall be entitled to receive and retain the appropriate fees or allowances prescribed in these regulations.

(c) (i) The fees payable to Returning Officers, Deputy Returning Officers, Presiding Officers, Assistant Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks, Doorkeepers and other officials shall be as follows:—

(ii) Where, in any district, more than twenty polling places have been appointed for a Council or an Assembly Election, the Returning Officer or Deputy Returning Officer, as the case may be, shall be paid in addition to the fee prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph a further fee of \$1.60 for every polling place in excess of twenty.

(iii) Except as provided in sub-paragraph (vii) and (viii) of this paragraph, where an officer simultaneously holds more than one position under the Act in respect of each of which fees by way of remuneration are prescribed, he shall be entitled only to the fee for that position for which the highest fee is prescribed, where the duties of all of the positions can be performed simultaneously.

(iv) The fees prescribed in sub-paragraph (i) of this paragraph for Presiding Officers, Assistant Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks and Doorkeepers shall cover all services performed between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 8.30 p.m. on polling day.

(v) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (e) of this regulation, the fees prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for Returning Officers and Deputy Returning Officers shall cover all services required by the Act or by regulation, to be performed by the officer in connection with an election and includes subsistence for polling day and for an Assistant Returning Officer all services required on polling day.

(vi) Where an officer does not reside in the district for which he has been appointed as Returning Officer, Deputy Returning Officer or Assistant Returning Officer, if he is required to travel to the district to which he has been appointed prior to the day of the election for the purpose of performing his duties, he shall be paid a travelling allowance in accordance with regulation 64 for the whole period of his absence from his residence in connection with those duties.

(vii) When an election for the Legislative Council is held on the same day as an election for the Legislative Assembly, and the Returning Officer for the Legislative Assembly District is also Returning Officer or Deputy Returning Officer for the Legislative Council Province for the purposes of those elections, and he carries out duties in relation to both elections, the following provisions apply:—

(a) If both elections are contested or uncontested he is entitled to be paid the appropriate higher fee prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for a Returning Officer for the Legislative Assembly or Returning Officer or Deputy Returning Officer for the Legislative Council and 5 per cent. of the appropriate fee prescribed for his office in relation to the other election.

(b) If one of the elections is contested and the other is uncontested, he is entitled to be paid the fee prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for his office in relation to the contested election and 5 per cent. of the appropriate fee prescribed for his office in relation to the uncontested election.

(viii) Where a Returning Officer or Deputy Returning Officer for a Legislative Council Province carries out duties in relation to two Legislative Council elections in the same day in respect of the same province:—

- (a) If both elections are contested or uncontested he is entitled to be paid the appropriate fee prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for his office in relation to one of the elections and 5 per cent. of that fee in relation to the other election.
- (b) If one of the elections is contested and the other is uncontested, he is entitled to be paid the fee prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for his office in relation to the contested election and 5 per cent. of the appropriate fee prescribed for his office in relation to the uncontested election.
- (d) The fees payable to officers engaged on the scrutiny and count of votes shall be as follows—

Returning Officers, Deputy Returning Officers and Assistant Returning Officers—for every 100 votes counted or part thereof .....	0.25
Assistant Returning Officers appointed under section 142A of the Act (but excluding officers of the State Electoral Department who are paid overtime in accordance with regulation 62) in addition to the fee prescribed in paragraph (c) of this regulation for every 100 votes counted or part thereof .....	0.25

Where preference votes are counted they shall be regarded as additional votes for the purpose of assessing the fee to be paid.

(ii) Where officers are required prior or subsequent to the day of an election to perform in relation to the election, any authorised service referred to in this paragraph, those officers shall be entitled for the service to a special fee in accordance with the following scale:—

(f) Persons who are officers within the meaning of that expression as used in the Public Service Act, 1904, when acting as Returning Officers, Deputy Returning Officers, Assistant Returning Officers, Presiding Officers, Assistant Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks, or Doorkeepers on the day of an election shall be deemed to be absent from their public service offices on leave of absence with payment of salary in respect of those officers.

62. When on the day of an election or on any Sunday next following the election, or after the ordinary working hours as provided by Public Service Regulations on any subsequent day, until the result of the election has been ascertained any member of the staff of the State Electoral Department is instructed by the Chief Electoral Officer to be and remain at the State Electoral Department to carry out his normal duties, or such other duties in connection with the election that may be allotted to him, he shall be paid overtime or granted time off in lieu, as the case may be, as prescribed under the industrial agreement for the time being in force, or from time to time in force, between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) and the Public Service Commissioner of Western Australia.

In all other cases, when any person is engaged on the staff of the State Electoral Department on the day of an election, he shall, with the approval of the Chief Electoral Officer, be paid the same fees as prescribed by paragraph (c) of the last preceding regulation as those to which he would have been entitled if he had in fact been specially appointed as Presiding Officer, Assistant Presiding Officer, Poll Clerk, or Doorkeeper, for the election.

63. Where in accordance with the provisions of section 156 Returning Officers are required after an election to prepare a list of the electors who failed to vote at the election contrary to the requirements of that section, the Returning Officers shall be entitled to receive and retain for preparing the list a special fee calculated at the rate of \$3.00 for every 500 or portion of 500 votes polled.

64. Officers who are required to travel outside the metropolitan area for the purpose of performing their duties as Electoral Officers shall be entitled to such travelling allowance as is prescribed under the industrial agreement for the time being in force or from time to time in force between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) and the Public Service Commissioner of Western Australia.

Provided, subject to subparagraph (v) of paragraph (c) of regulation 61, that no transport or meal allowance shall be paid to any officer in respect of the day of the election, but if approved by the Chief Electoral Officer, any expense necessarily incurred by an officer for transport on the day of the election may be recouped to the officer.
