PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas
TO WIT, Anthony Kendrew, Knight Commander of the
Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and
Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of the
Most Excellent Order of the British Empire,
Companion of the Distinguished Service Order,
Governor in and over the State of Western
Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section three of the Constitution Act, 1889-1963, it is lawful for the Governor to prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly, from time to time, and to dissolve the Legislative Assembly by proclamation or otherwise whenever he shall think fit: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, in the exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, do hereby declare and proclaim that the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly shall stand pro-rogued as from the 1st day of January, 1971, and that the Legislative Assembly shall be dissolved as from that date.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (1) of section 10 of the Shipping and Pilotage Act, 1967 section 10 of the Shipping and Pilotage Act, 1967 that every place that was, immediately prior to the coming into operation of that Act, a port or harbour for the purposes of the Shipping and Pilotage Act, 1855-1954 is, by force of that subsection, declared to be a port for the purposes of the Shipping and Pilotage Act, 1967, bounded in the manner in which that place was bounded as a port immediately prior to the coming into operation of the Shipping and Pilotage Act, 1967; and whereas, at that time, Port Walcott (Cossack) was a port or harbour for the purposes of the Shipping and Pilotage Act, 1855-1954 by virtue of a Proclamation issued under the Ports and Harbours Act, 1917 on the 14th day of November, 1917 and published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of November, 1917 and was bounded as a port in the manner described in that Proclamation; and whereas by subsection (2) of section 10 of the Shipping and Pilotage Act, 1967 it is, inter alia, provided that the Governor may by Proclamation vary the boundaries of any place declared to be a port by subsection (1) of that section: Now therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (2) of section 10 of the Shipping and Pilotage Act, 1967 do hereby vary the boundaries of Port Walcott (Cossack) by excluding therefrom the areas delineated and shaded brown on Plan P.W.D., W.A. the Shipping and Pilotage Act, 1967 it is, inter alia, delineated and shaded brown on Plan P.W.D., W.A.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 23rd day of December, 1970, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:-

Traffic Act. 1919-1970.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1970, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, empower a local authority to exercise within its district any power of making regulations that the Governor could exercise under Division 4 of Part IV of that Act and that the word "by-law" may be substituted for "regulation"; and whereas under the abovementioned Division and in particular by paragraph (c) of subsection (2) of section 47 the Governor may make regulations prescribing, inter alia, fares for passenger vehicles; and whereas it is desirable that each of the local authorities set forth in the schedule hereunder should be empowered to make by-laws prescribing fares for that class of passenger vehicles within the meaning of the Traffic Act, 1919-1970, defined by that Act as taxi-cars: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, doth hereby confer upon each of the local authorities set forth in the schedule hereunder the power to make a bylaw prescribing fares for taxi-cars.

Local Government Act, 1960-1970.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1970, it shall be lawful for the Governor on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the Government Gazette to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge of thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereto have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils. been reserved for streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets, and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

Alteration of Boundaries of Wards, Alteration of Representation of Wards, Directions Concerning Elections.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is, inter alia, provided by subsection (3) of section 10 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1970, that when a district of a shire is divided into wards the number of offices of member for each ward is such as from time to time is declared by Order, including the president when the mode of his election is by the council; and whereas the district of the Shire of Coolgardie is divided into three wards called Town Ward, Country Ward, and Kambalda Ward, respectively and the mode of the election of the president is by the council; and whereas it is interalia provided by subsection. and whereas it is, inter alia, provided by subsection (2) of section 12 of the said Act that the Governor by Order made after the effective presentation to him of a petition bearing the common seal of each municipality which will be directly affected by the Order may alter the boundaries of wards existing in a district; and whereas the Shire of Coolgardie, being the only municipality which will be directly affected by this Order, has made an effective presentation to the Governor of such a petition praying for the alteration of the boundaries of the existing Kambalda Ward and Country Ward; and whereas it is, inter alia provided by subsection (1) of section 20 of the said Act, that where the Governor exercises a power conferred by section 12 of the said Act he may direct who, if any, of the members whose district is affected by the exercise of the power shall go out of office, and when, and may direct the holding on a day appointed by the Order, being a day within a period of six months from the date of the Order, of an election of such members so affected, as the case requires and may order, settle, adjust and finally determine such within a likely likely supplied and made and relative to relative the such members. rights, liabilities, questions and matters relating to the representation of electors on the council of a municipality so affected and such other matters as he thinks necessary to be ordered, settled, adjusted or determined, and in such manner as he thinks fit: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in respect of the Shire of Coolgardie and its district—

(1) order that the number of offices of member for the respective wards including the president shall, from the 22nd May, 1971, be as follows:—

- (2) order that the boundaries of the Kambalda Ward are altered to those described in the Schedule hereto;
- (3) order that the boundaries of the Country Ward are altered by deletion therefrom of the area so incorporated into the Kambalda Ward, leaving the remaining portion as the Country Ward;
- (4) direct that all persons who are members for the Town Ward immediately before this Order takes effect shall go out of office as such members on the 22nd May, 1971;
- (5) direct that on the 22nd May, 1971 an election shall be held to elect four members for the Town Ward and one further member for the Kambalda Ward;

- (6) order that of the members elected on the 22nd May, 1971 for the Town Ward two shall retire on the fourth Saturday in May, 1972 and one on each of the fourth Saturdays in May of 1973 and 1974, the order of retirement being in accordance with the provisions of section 41 of the said Act;
- (7) order that the further member elected on the 22nd May, 1971 for the Kambalda Ward shall hold office, and retire, in accordance with the provisions of section 41 of the said Act;
- (8) order that the representation of electors on the council shall, until the 22nd May, 1971, be the same as it is immediately before this Order takes effect;
- (9) order that other than members for the Town Ward, the persons who are members of the council immediately before this Order takes effect shall as such members hold office for the same term, and retire at the same time, as they would, apart from this Order, have done so.

- (3) direct that, other than the member for the Campion Ward, all persons who are members immediately before this Order takes effect shall go out of office as member on the 22nd May, 1971;
- (4) direct that on the 22nd May, 1971, an election shall be held to elect a member for each of the wards other than the Campion Ward:
- (5) order that the members elected on the 22nd May, 1971, for the wards other than the Campion Ward shall hold office, and retire, in accordance with the provisions of section 41 of the said Act;
- (6) order that the constitution of, and representation of electors on, the council shall, until the 22nd May, 1971, be the same as it is immediately before this Order takes effect;
- (7) order that the person who is the member for the Campion Ward immediately before this Order takes effect shall, as that member, hold office for the same term, and retire at the same time, as he would, apart from this Order, have done

By-law Relating to Signs, Blinds, Awnings, Advertisement Hoardings and Bill-posting.

L.G. 263/58.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 23rd day of November, 1970, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following amendments to By-law No. 22:—

- 1. That clauses 25 to 31 both inclusive be deleted.
- 2. That the following new clauses be added after clause 24:
 - 25. In this Part of this by-law "hoarding" means advertisement hoarding.
 - $26.\,$ No new hoarding shall hereafter be erected within the Municipality of South Perth.
 - 27. No person shall maintain and no owner or occupier of premises shall permit to remain on such premises any hoarding without a written license issued for a hoarding other than the hoardings described in the First Schedule hereto.
 - 28. No alteration shall be made to a hoarding increasing the length, height or width thereof.
 - 29. The name of the licensee shall always be conspicuously shown on the front of a hoarding.
 - 30. If any paper, cloth or other material affixed to a hoarding becomes detached, dilapidated or otherwise unsightly it shall be forthwith removed by the licensee.
 - 31. Upon written notice so to do the licensee or the occupier of premises on which a hoarding is erected shall forthwith remove from the hoarding or obliterate anything attached to or painted on the hoarding which in the opinion of the Council is objectionable.
- 3. That the First Schedule be deleted and the following new Schedule be inserted in its place:—

Gazette on the time thereafter by notices published in the Government Gazette, are referred to as the principal regulations.

Reg. 2 amended.

- 2. Regulations 2 of the principal regulations is amended-
 - (a) by adding immediately after the interpretation "disease" the following interpretation:-
 - "percentage of colour characteristic", in relation to apples means the aggregate percentage of the surface of the fruit which has red colour of intensity characteristic of the variety when mature;
 - (b) by substituting for the passage "pear." in line four of the interpretation "sound" the passage "pear;"; and
 - (c) by adding after the interpretation "sound" the following interpretation-
 - "systematically packed", in relation to apples and pears means that the fruit in any one case shall be so placed as to form distinct layers and the fruit in each layer shall be arranged in well defined rows. .

Reg. 4 amended.

- 3. Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is amended—
 - (a) as to the table in subregulation (1)-
 - (i) by substituting for the grade "ORCHARD" above columns seven and eight the grade "LOOSE" and by inserting in the column headed "Minimum % of colour characteristic necessary" under that grade the figures set out in column 2 below so that each figure is respectively opposite the variety specified in column 1 below-

- (v) by substituting for the figure "10" in the column "Minimum % of colour characteristic necessary" under the grade "PLAIN", opposite the variety "YATES", the figure 20.
- (b) by substituting for the interpretation "Orchard" in subregulation (2) the following interpretation: —
 - "Loose" means a grade comprising apples of one variety that are fairly well formed, mature, clean, sound and of which the skin is unbroken, and includes apples that have—
 - (a) subject to regulation 5A, slight surface blemishes where the total area of the blemishes does not exceed the area of a circle of—
 - (i) $\frac{1}{4}$ inch diameter, in the case of fruit that is $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches or less in diameter; or
 - (ii) $\frac{3}{8}$ inch diameter, in the case of fruit that is greater than $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter:
 - (b) yellow sunburn marks where those marks-
 - (i) are not unsightly; and
 - (ii) do not cover more than 20% of the surface of the fruit;
 - (c) hail marks showing no material discolouration of the skin, where the total area of all defects (excluding sunburn marks) does not exceed a circle of—
 - (i) $\frac{1}{4}$ inch diameter, in the case of fruit that is $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches or less in diameter; and
 - (ii) ½ inch diameter in the case of fruit that is greater than 2½ inches in diameter; and
 - (d) smooth but not unsightly russet where the area of the surface affected does not exceed 30% or, in the case of apples of the Sturmer variety, 50%.; and
- (c) by deleting the interpretation "Domestic" in subregulation (2).

not exceed a circle of $\frac{1}{2}$ inch diameter; and

(c) smooth but not unsightly russet, where the area affected does not exceed 40% of the surface of the fruit in the case of the varieties known as Bartlett (Williams), Packham's Triumph and Comice.
