Corres. 2991/70.—That Reserve No. 30761 should vest in and be held by the Minister for Native Welfare in trust for the purpose of "Native Housing".

Corres. 2991/70.—That Reserve No. 30762 should vest in and be held by the Minister for Native Welfare in trust for the purpose of "Native Housing".

Corres. 1555/70.—That Reserve No. 30765 should vest in and be held by the Minister for Native Welfare in trust for the purpose of "Conventional Housing Sites (Native Welfare Department)".

Corres. 672/70.—That Reserve No. 30768 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Port Hedland in trust for the purpose of "Recreation".

Corres 139/71.—That Reserve No. 30773 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Donnybrook in trust for the purpose of "Rubbish Depot".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

- 5. A person shall not drive a vehicle within the grounds attached to the hospital or belonging thereto at a speed in excess of ten miles per hour.
- 6. A person shall not except with the prior approval of the Managing Secretary of the Hospital, drive within the grounds of the hospital, a vehicle the unladen weight of which exceeds two tons.
- 7. A person who contravenes any provision of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten dollars.

- 3. In order to effect an examination of any person the medical officer or other public health official may enter upon any land or into any house and may remove the person to be examined to any other place where the examination may be more conveniently made.
- 4. Any person who in any way hinders or prevents the medical officer or other public health official from making or completing an examination of any person commits an offence. Penalty: Twenty dollars.


