PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas
TO WIT, } Anthony Kendrew, Knight Commander of the

Australia and its Dependencies in the Com-
monwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided, *inter alia*, by subsection (1a) of section 11 of the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1967 that where a local authority in whose district a sewerage area is situate, undertakes any works in that sewerage area and it appears after inquiry that—

- (a) the maximum general rate that the local authority may impose under the Local Government Act, 1960 will not permit a sufficient amount to be provided for the construction, alteration, repair or maintenance of the works, and for payment of the instalments of capital debt and interest on any of the works with respect to which any debt is owing; and

(b) the local authority should be permitted to levy a general rate beyond the limits prescribed by the Local Government Act, 1960, the Governor may, by proclamation, grant to the local authority such permission and may in the proclamation specify new limits of the maximum general rate that the local authority may impose under the Local Government Act, 1960; and whereas the Dumbleyung Sewerage Area constituted under section 4 of the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1967 by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 12th November, 1971, is within the district of the Municipality of the Shire of Dumbleyung and the Shire has undertaken works within that area; and whereas it appears after inquiry that the maximum general rate that the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Dumbleyung may impose will not permit a sufficient amount to be provided for the construction, alteration, repair or maintenance of the works, and for payments of the instalments of capital debt and interest on the works to which any debt is owing and that the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Dumbleyung should be permitted to levy a general rate beyond the limits prescribed by the Local Government Act, 1960: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with

the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred under subsection (1a) of section 11 of the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1967 do hereby grant to the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Dumbleyung permission to levy a general rate of thirty point two eight cents (30.28 cents) for each dollar of the annual value of the rateable property in its district that is within the Dumbleyung Sewerage Area aforesaid.

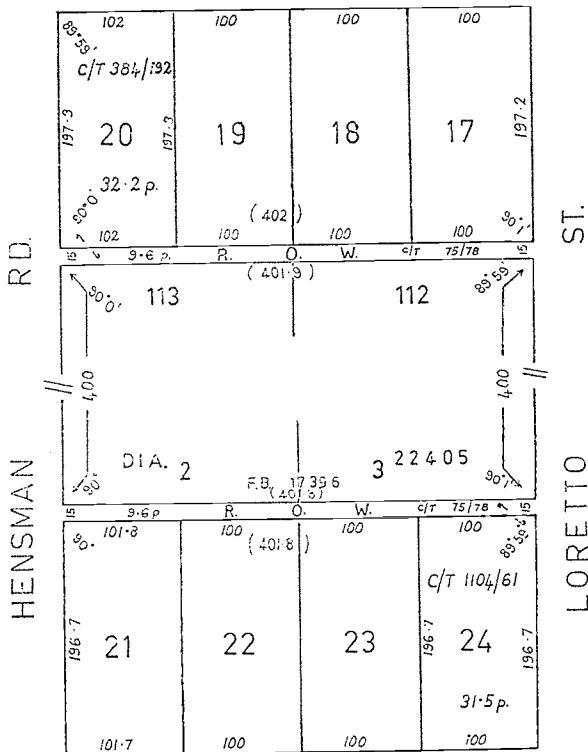
