WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of section 17 of the Charitable Collections Act, 1946-1949, all of the moneys, securities for moneys or goods collected or held for a charitable purpose by the Trustees of the Wooroloo Hospital Appeal established under the Charitable Collections Act, 1946-1949, are vested in Robert Henry Claude Stubbs as the Minister of the Crown to whom for the time being the administration of the said Act is committed and are held by him upon the trusts upon which they were held prior to their being so vested; and whereas under the provisions of subsection (2) of section 17 of the Act the Governor may by proclamation vary the trusts and may by the same proclamation vest the said moneys, securities and goods or part thereof in such persons and for such charitable purposes as the Governor shall specify: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting under the provisions of subsection (2) of section 17 of the said Act and with the advice and consent of Executive Council, do hereby vest in the Tuberculosis and Chest Association of Western Australia an association incorporated under the Associations Incorporation Act, 1895-1962, all of the moneys, securities for moneys or goods hereinbefore described and vested as aforesaid, and specify that they be applied by the association for the charitable purposes of—

- (1) Assist the Tuberculosis Control and other authorities in measures calculated to stamp out tuberculosis in Australia.
- (2) Bring to the attention of the appropriate authorities such matters regarding tuberculosis and other chest diseases as the Association may consider necessary for the furtherance of its aims.
- (3) Provide sheltered workshop and rehabilitation facilities for sufferers from tuberculosis and other chest diseases.
- (4) Help in the rehabilitation and re-employment of sufferers from tuberculosis and other chest diseases.

- (5) Render assistance where required to patients suffering from tuberculosis and other chest diseases and their dependants.
- (6) Liaise and co-operate with allied associations.
- (7) Affiliate with other Tuberculosis Associations with similar aims in other States and abroad.
- (8) Be an active supporting member of the national body, at present known as the National Tuberculosis and Chest Association.
- (9) Establish Women's Auxiliaries of the Association.
- (10) Raise funds in such manner as the Council may think fit, and to make such financial and other arrangements as the Council may deem necessary for carrying out the foregoing objects.

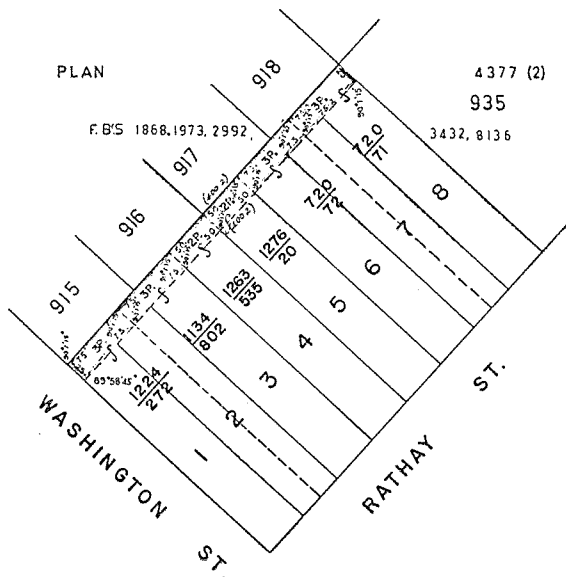

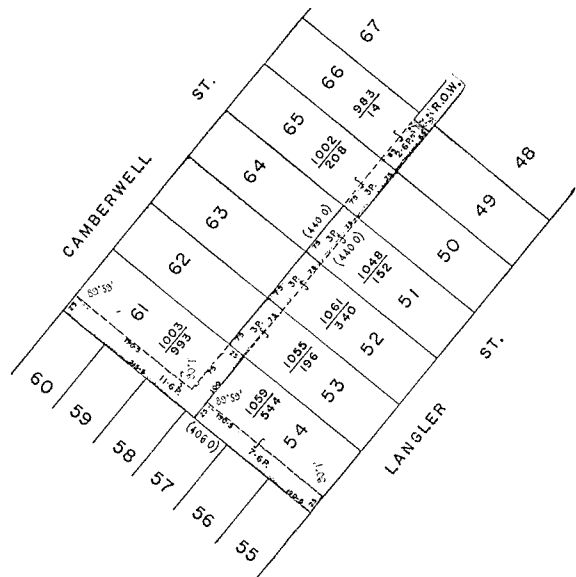

accordingly. Where the estimated value only is shown, a certificate from the assayer or other documentary evidence approved by the Commission shall subsequently be produced. The Commission may, if desired, dispense with the necessity to provide assay or other certificates. The time allowed for supply of such certificates shall be as follows:—

- (a) If treated in Western Australia—six weeks.

3. The Commission shall have the right to have an assay made to determine the value of ores, concentrates or minerals or to purchase such ores, concentrates or minerals at the values declared on the consignment note.

4. Rates for the carriage of ores, concentrates and minerals, N.O.S. shall be:—

- (i) Exceeding \$150 per ton in value—B.
- (ii) Exceeding \$100 but not \$150 per ton in value—A.
- (iii) Not exceeding \$100 per ton in value—M.

5. With effect from the 1st January, 1972, the rate for the carriage of low grade ores, concentrates and minerals (P.O.C.) not exceeding in value \$16 per ton "free on rail" shall be M class. Subject to individual application by the mine owner, approval may be given by the Commission for a concession rate under the following conditions:—

- (a) Consignments for local consumption or export, a rebate of freight for a maximum period of five years, the first two years at 10 per cent. of the M class rate followed by three years at 5 per cent. of the M class rate.\*
- (b) The concession shall not be allowed on annual tonnages in excess of 50,000 tons.
- (c) The concession shall apply only in respect of each mining project, it shall not apply generally to any person or company and its five years duration shall not be extended by any change in ownership or control of the project.

6. The above rates cover conveyances at the Owner's Risk only. By special arrangement with the Commercial Manager, ores, concentrates or minerals when contained in drums, bags or cases may be accepted for conveyance at Commission's risk upon payment of insurance rates as laid down in Clause 2 of this Schedule.
