- (b) Having completed those inquiries to make your report to me in writing, making such recommendations as to the feasibility of the Plan, or recommending such alterations and amendments, as are considered to be desirable in the interests of planning the metropolitan region;

and I hereby appoint you the said FREDERICK RICHARD WHITE to be the Chairman of the said Royal Commission.

And I hereby declare that by virtue of this Commission you may, in the execution of this Commission, do all such acts, matters and things and exercise all such powers as a Royal Commission or members of a Royal Commission may lawfully do and exercise whether under or pursuant to the Royal Commissions Act, 1968, or otherwise.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Perth Gas Company's Act, 1886-1937 it is enacted that the limits of that Act shall extend to and include the City of Perth, and every place being within a circle of five miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth and every other place outside the circle of five miles to which the Governor may from time to time by proclamation declare that the Act shall extend; and whereas it is also provided by that section that the Governor shall not make or issue any proclamation under that section to extend the limits of that Act to any place situated within the district of any municipal council or of any road board outside the said circle of five miles unless and until the municipal council or the road board concerned (as the case may be) has by resolution consented thereto; and whereas the Mundaring Shire Council has by resolution passed on the 16th day of December, 1971 consented to the extension of the limits of the Act to the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Mundaring: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power in this behalf so enabling, do hereby proclaim and declare that the limits of the Act shall extend to and include the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Mundaring being an area outside a circle of five miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Sandblasting Operations Regulations.
2. In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
 - “a dry sandblasting operation” means a sandblasting operation performed without the addition of such quantities of water as would be necessary to prevent the emission of dust from the operation;
 - “a wet sandblasting operation” means a sandblasting operation performed with the addition of such quantities of water as are necessary to prevent the emission of dust from the operation;
 - “permit holder” means a person who holds a permit issued under section 39B of the Act.
3. A permit holder shall not commence any wet sandblasting operation unless he has advised the Council, not less than three days prior to his commencing that operation of his intention to carry out that operation.
4. (1) A permit holder shall not commence any dry sandblasting operation unless he has first obtained the consent of the Council for that dry sandblasting operation.
 - (2) Where a permit holder has obtained the consent of the Council for the carrying out of any dry sandblasting operation, the permit holder shall not commence to carry out that operation unless he has advised the Council, not less than three days prior to his commencing that operation, of his intention to carry out that operation.
5. A person who wishes to obtain the consent of the Council under regulation 4 of these regulations to the carrying out of any dry sandblasting operation shall apply in writing to the Council for that consent and shall at the time of making the application pay to the Council a fee of five dollars.
6. A person who makes any false or misleading statement or representation to the Council or to any officer assisting the Council in the administration of these regulations in connection with any application for a permit under section 39B of the Act, the giving of any notice pursuant to these regulations or any application for the consent of the Council to the carrying out of a dry sandblasting operation, commits an offence.

Suspension of Prohibited Burning Times.

- (a) setting aside land for future public use as reserves;
- (b) controlling land development;
- (c) other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

Part 1.—Preliminary.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Capel Town Planning Scheme No. 1 hereinafter called "The Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the maps forming part of the Scheme.

1.3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Capel (hereinafter referred to as the Council).

1.4 Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme Text is divided into the following Parts:—

- Part 1.—Preliminary.
- Part 2.—Reserved Land.
- Part 3.—Zones.
- Part 4.—Non-Conforming Uses.
- Part 5.—General Provisions.
- Part 6.—Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are as follows:

- (1) Land Use Map.
- (2) Scheme Map.

1.5 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations 1967, unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

1.6 Within this Scheme the term 'Roadhouse' shall be deemed to mean a service station as defined in the Town Planning Regulations 1967 together with a restaurant and such other facilities as may be considered by Council to be of benefit to the travelling public. Sufficient on site parking facilities shall be provided to the satisfaction of the Council for the use of patrons.

Part 2.—Reserved Land.

Reservation of Land and Development Thereof.

2.1 (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purpose of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the Scheme Map.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.

(c) In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.

(d) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance, for which the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

2.2 (a) Where a Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.

(b) Claims for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

(c) In lieu of paying compensation the Council may purchase the land affected by such decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

Part 3.—Zones.

3.1 The Scheme area is divided into three types of zones set out hereunder:—

- Residential 1.
- Highway.
- Rural.

3.2 Table No. 1 appended to Clause 3.3 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the lefthand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on the top of that Table.

3.3 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 appended to this clause have the following meanings:—

"P"—A use that is permitted under this Scheme.

"AA"—A use that is not permitted unless the approval of the Council is granted in respect of such use provided however such approval may not be granted by the Council until,

(a) the Council has advertised its intention to grant approval for such use at least once in a newspaper circulating in the district of the Shire of Capel.

(b) after the Council has considered all objections to the granting of such approval received by the Council under 14 days of the publication of the advertisement hereinbefore referred to

"IP"—A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Council.

"X"—A use that is not permitted.

3.4 Residential 1 Zone.—Within the area zoned Residential 1, the Council shall recommend to the Board that the minimum permitted lot size within subdivisions shall be not less than 1 acre in area.

3.5 Rural Zone.—Within the area zoned Rural the Council shall impose conditions on mining or extractive industries.

These conditions shall be applicable:—

- (a) to existing development at the time of the coming into effect of this Scheme.
- (b) to proposed development, which shall be the subject of an application to develop for mining or extractive industry, after the coming into effect of this Scheme.
- (c) to those lands previously engaged in but no longer required for mining or extractive industrial development, at the discretion of the Council.

3.6 Pursuant to clause 3.5 above, the conditions to be imposed by the Council shall have regard to the following:—

- (i) Restoration of soil, top soil, grass, vegetation and tree cover to the satisfaction of Council.
- (ii) The processes carried on the machinery used, and the goods and commodities carried to and from the land, which will cause any injury to or prejudicially affect the amenity of the locality by reason of the emission of noise, vibration, smell, fumes, smoke, vapour, grit, oil or otherwise, and
- (iii) Any other condition which Council deems necessary.

Part 4.—Non-Conforming Use of Land.

4.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or

- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) and any other law authorising the development to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part 2 of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections alterations or extension of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing;

(b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part 3 of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, and provided the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform General Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the scheme.

4.3 Change of Non-Conforming Use:—The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of the Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use, or is in the opinion of the Council closer to the intended uses of the zone.

4.4 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:—

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, except where a change of non-conforming use has been permitted by the Council under clause 4.3, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

Part 5.—General Provisions.

General.

5.1 Unless otherwise stated in this Scheme or subsequent amendments to the Scheme the building lines and other site requirements of the Uniform General Building By-Laws 1965 (as amended) shall be applicable to the building of the occupancy class concerned.

5.2 Any application for approval for development required under any provision of the Scheme shall be in writing addressed to the Shire Clerk of the Capel Shire Council and may be approved by the Council or approved subject to conditions.

5.3 Any aggrieved by a decision of the Council under the terms of clause 5.3 may appeal to the Hon. Minister for Town Planning seeking a variation of the Council's decision.

5.4 Highway Zone: Within the Highway zone the following provisions will apply:—

- (a) Within the Highway zone shown on the Scheme Map no public sign, advertisement boarding, or notice shall be erected within 5 chains of the centre line of the major road without the approval of the Council.
- (b) The Council will not approve the erection of any advertisement for a service or commodity which is not produced or sold on the lot on which the advertisement is erected.

- (c) The Council will not approve the erection of an advertisement for the sale of land other than the lot on which the advertisement is erected.
- (d) The Council may remove any public sign, advertisement, boarding, or notice which has been erected contrary to subclause 5.4 (a) of the clause.

5.5 In exercising its discretion under clause 5.4 the Council will consider the need to preserve the scenic attractions and general amenity of the area.

Part 6—Finance and Administration.

6.1 Disposal of Land:—The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

6.2 Compensation:—Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than the purpose of Part 2 shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part 2 shall apply.

6.3 Entry to Premises:—The Council in the conduct and management of the Scheme may by an authorised officer enter and inspect with or without agents at all reasonable times any land or building within the area the subjects of the Scheme.

6.4 Penalties:—Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

6.5 Enforcement of Provisions:

- (a) If any person contravenes or fails or neglects to comply with any of the provisions of this Scheme the Council may, by notice in the manner set out in Clause 6.6 hereof, order such person to discontinue forthwith any such contravention and within thirty (30) clear days after the service of such notice to remove, pull down, take up, alter or otherwise make good any work which contravenes the Scheme, or carry into effect any provisions of the Scheme which are not being complied with and at the same time it may pursuant to subsection 1 of section 10 of the Act advise such person that in the event of him failing to comply with the provisions thereof in the time limited for compliance then the Council by its agents will enter such person's property and cause to be done such works and things as shall be specified in such notice.
- (b) Any expense incurred by the Council in doing any works pursuant to any default under paragraph (a) hereof may be recovered from the person in default by action for a civil debt recoverable summarily in any court having jurisdiction in respect of the amount involved.

6.6 Notices:—Any notice under Clause 6.5 thereof—

- (a) shall be addressed to the owner, occupier or lessee of the land in question;
- (b) shall describe in general terms the manner in which the Scheme has been contravened, and
- (c) shall require the owner, occupier or lessee as the case may be, within 30 clear days after the service of such notice, to discontinue such contravention of the Scheme and take such action as the Council may direct to cause a compliance with the provisions of the Scheme; and
- (d) shall where necessary advise the person to whom it is addressed that in default of his compliance with such notice the Council will enter such land and carry out the requirements of such notice itself at the expense of such person.

- (e) Any notice required to be made given hereunder may be served at his address as shown in the rate book of the Council if he shall be a rate payer or at his last known address (whether he is a rate payer or not) and such notice shall be deemed to be served in due course of post.

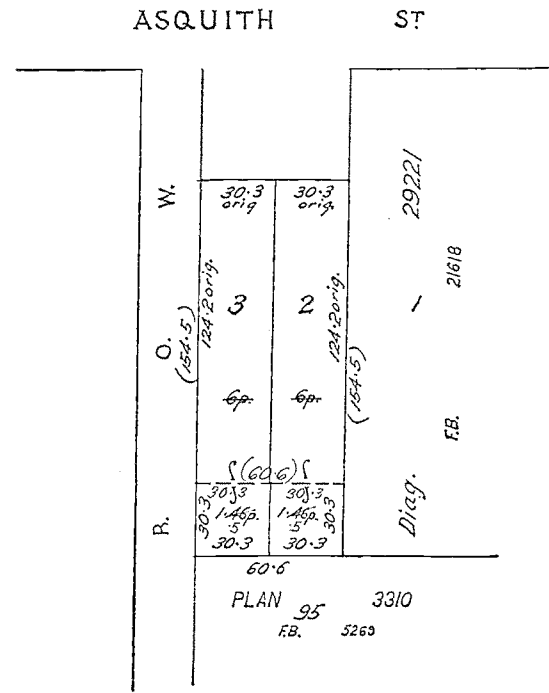

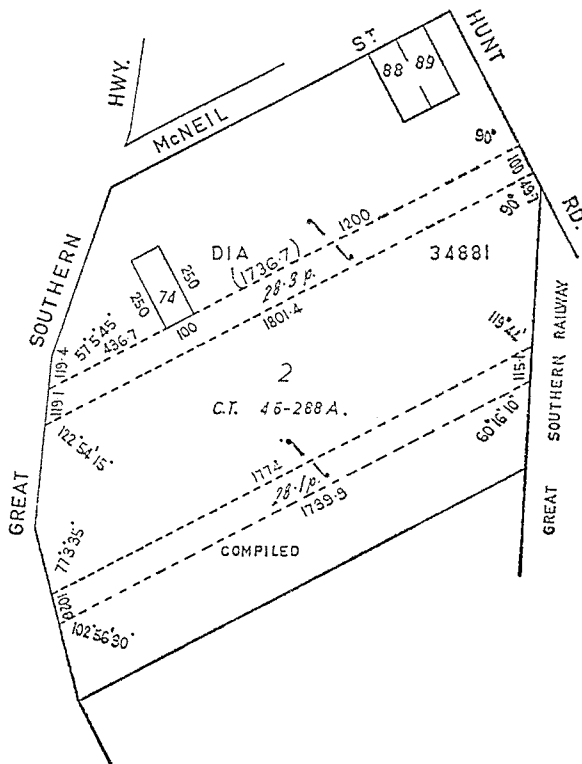

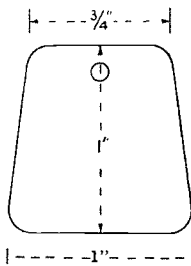
