IT is hereby notified for public information, in accordance with section 7 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) that the Hon. Minister for Town Planning approved the Shire of Waroona—Lake Preston Town Planning Scheme on the 1st March, 1972—the Scheme Text of which is published hereunder.

Shire of Waroona.

LAKE PRESTON TOWN PLANNING SCHEME.

THE Council of the Shire of Waroona under and by virtue of the power conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of—

- (a) setting aside land for future public use as reserves;
- (b) controlling land development;
- (c) other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

PART 1.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 Scheme Title: The Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Lake Preston Town Planning Scheme and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land enclosed within the broken black line shown on the Land Use Map forming part of this Scheme.

1.3 General Intent: The intent of this Scheme is to direct and control the development of the Scheme Area in such a way as shall promote and safeguard the health, safety and convenience of residents within the Scheme Area and the public at large and secure the orderly and efficient use of the land and its associated coastal resources. In this regard the Scheme Map shows a system of land use designed to secure pleasant and appropriate development of an area between Lake Preston and the Indian Ocean for holiday and leisure time activities. The Scheme Map is not intended to be absolutely definitive in its description of zones and uses but rather to indicate the nature and scale of development which is permitted under the provisions of the Scheme Text. To enable minor amendments to be made to the provisions of the Scheme the Council may permit departures from the Scheme providing Town Planning Board approval is given to any such minor amendments.

1.4 Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme Text divided into the following parts:

- Part 1.—Preliminary.
- Part 2.—Reserved Land.
- Part 3.—Zones.
- Part 4.—Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are as follows:

1. Land Use Map.
2. Scheme Map.

1.5 General Obligations: Subject to the provisions of the Act and all regulations made thereunder, no persons shall depart or permit or suffer any departure from the requirements and provisions of the Scheme, nor shall any person use or permit the use of any land or building or undertake or permit any new work if the use, new work, reconstruction, alteration or modification does not conform with the Scheme or would tend to delay the effective operation of the Scheme.

1.6 Relationship of Scheme to By-laws: The provisions of this Scheme shall have effect, notwithstanding any by-law for the time being in force in the District and where the provisions of the Scheme are inconsistent with the provisions of any by-law, the provisions of this Scheme shall prevail.

1.7 Appeal Rights: The procedure for the lodgement and determination of appeals shall be as laid down in Part V of the Town Planning and Development Act and the Regulations made under that Act.

1.8 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations 1967 unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

Definitions.

Effective frontage:

Shall be calculated for lots having parallel side boundaries as the length of a line drawn perpendicular from one side boundary so as to bisect the opposite side boundary and, in the case of other lots, as the length of a line drawn parallel to the street frontage between the two side boundaries at one third of the mean depth of the lot measured from the main street frontage.

Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the Council from deciding by other means, the effective frontage of lots of such irregular proportions that it considers the above formulae cannot be applied.

Plot Ratio:

Shall be calculated in accordance with the provisions of the Uniform General Building By-laws.

Site Coverage:

Shall be calculated in accordance with the provisions of the Uniform General Building By-laws.

Setbacks for lots with multiple street frontages:

Shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Uniform General Building By-laws.

2.1 Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the approved Planning Scheme Map.

2.2 Development on Reserved Land: Except as otherwise provided in this Part, a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.

2.3 Approval of Development on Reserved Land: In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserves, and shall in the case of land reserved for the purpose of a public authority confer with that Authority before giving its approval.

## PART 3.—ZONES.

3.1 Zones Specified in Scheme: The following use zonings are specified and described in this Scheme and more particularly in Table 1 Zoning Table.

- Residential A.
- Residential B.
- Caravan Park.
- Resort Centre.
- Recreation.

3.2 Residential Development Control Code: Development within Residential A, Residential B and Caravan Park Zones shall be in accordance with the controls and standards set out hereunder.

3.2.1 Residential A Zone: Within this Zone the Council may permit single family detached dwellings and duplex buildings subject to:

\* With the approval of the adjoining owner Council may approve a single family detached dwelling without a setback from one side boundary providing the dwelling is built in compliance with the Uniform Building By-laws relating to parapet wall construction.

3.2.2 Residential B Zone: Within this zone the Council may permit Chalets and Cabins and multi-unit residential accommodation including flats, Row Houses, Town Houses, Patio Houses and single ownership motel units. Chalets and Cabins shall be built in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Model By-Laws (Holiday Cabins and Chalets) No. 18. Multiple unit residential accommodation including flats, Row Houses, Town Houses, Patio Houses and motel units shall be built in accordance with the appropriate provisions of the Uniform Building By-Laws and for this purpose, this zone shall be construed as a General Residential Zone.

Ancillary buildings such as a Caretaker's or Manager's residence and recreation buildings may be constructed within this zone with the approval of Council provided that such buildings comply with relevant provisions of this Scheme and the Uniform Building By-Laws.

Before giving its approval to any application to develop within this zone the Council may require satisfaction from the developer that land and buildings will be kept and maintained in good order and repair and that dwelling units will be occupied for holiday and for retirement purposes.

The development shall provide for a minimum of 6 acres of land within this zone to be developed and operated solely for the purpose of providing accommodation for itinerant travellers and holiday makers.

3.2.3 Caravan Park Zone: The only use permitted within this zone shall be for caravan park purposes including ancillary uses such as restaurant, petrol filling, caretaking and camping

ground functions. Development shall comply with the requirements of the Uniform General Building By-Laws and with the Caravan and Camps Regulations 1970 as laid down in the Health Act 1911-1968.

3.3 Resort Centre: Within this zone the Council may approve development of commercial, residential and recreational uses associated with coastal resort developments including a hotel, shops, motel, service station and other related activities. Before giving approval to any use within the zone the Council shall require submissions showing how it is proposed to develop and maintain the whole of the zone and how the proposed development relates to adjoining uses and reserves.

3.4 Recreation Zone: Within this zone the Council may approve recreational uses to be established and operated including the erection of necessary buildings such as clubhouses, recreation halls and shelters.

The Council may require legal agreements to be entered into prior to granting use approval whereby recreational facilities will be kept and maintained by the owner, or by the lessee or by any other person for the time being responsible for the care, maintenance and/or management of property within the zone, to the satisfaction of the Council.

## PART 4.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

4.1 Entry to Premises: The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

4.2 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

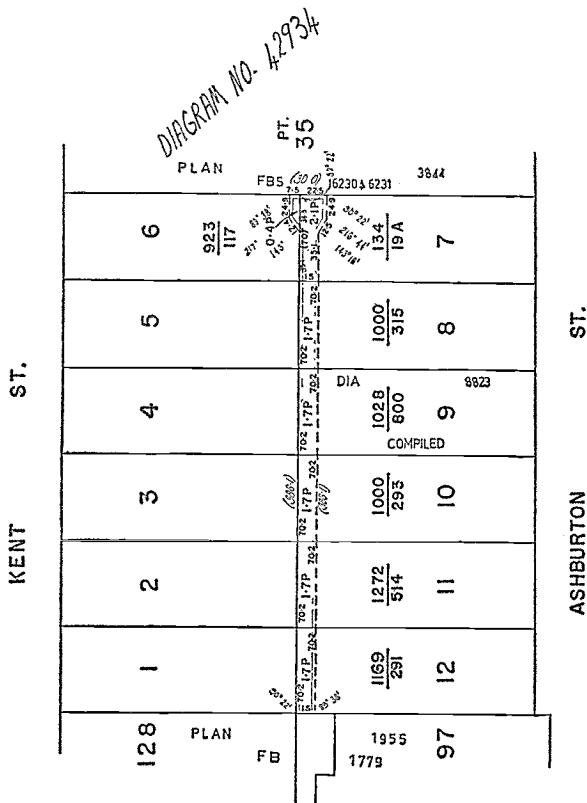
