Factories and Shops Act, 1963-1970. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT, DOUGLAS KENDREW, Governor. [L.S.]

By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas Anthony Kendrew, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided (*inter alia*) by section 5 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1963-1970, that "public holiday" means (in addition to the days therein specified) any day appointed by the Governor by proclamation to be a public holiday throughout the State; and whereas it appears to me, the Governor, expedient that the day hereinafter mentioned should be appointed a public holiday throughout the State: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the 1st day of April, one thousand nine hundred and seventy-two, to be a public holiday throughout the State; and all shops (except small shops and exempted shops) and warehouses shall be kept shut on that day.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 4 of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960-1970, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister and the Board from time to time, and at any time, by proclamation, declare any portion or portions of the State to be a totalisator agency region for the purposes of that Act; and whereas the Minister and the Board have recommended that the portion of the State hereinafter described be declared a totalisator agency region for these purposes: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that as from and including the 20th day of March, 1972, the portion of the State comprising the townsite of the town of Wyndham shall be a totalisator agency region for the purposes of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960-1970.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 531/71.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (3) of section 245A of the Local Government Act, 1960-1971, that the Governor may make and publish in the Government Gazette uniform general bylaws for all or any of the purposes for which bylaws may be made by a council under that section and all of the provisions of section 433A of that Act apply to and in relation to uniform general by-laws made under the provisions of section 245A of that Act as if those provisions were enacted in section 245A of that Act; and whereas it is enacted by section 433A of the Local Government Act, 1960-1971, that the Governor may, *inter alia*, make and publish in the Government Gazette make and publish in the Government Gazette uniform general by-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a council under Part XV of that Act, and by order, declare that all or any such uniform general by-laws as are specified in the order together with any amendments thereof whether by way of addition, substitution or cancellation shall apply to the whole or any portion of a district consolidation whole or any portion of a district so specified: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, doth hereby declare that the whole of the Uniform Private Swimming Pool By-laws published in the Government Gazette on the 6th February, 1970 and on the 17th March, 1972, apply to the municipal districts specified in the Schedule to this Order in Council.

DOG ACT, 1903.

Shire of Tambellup.

By-law Relating to Dogs.

L.G. 141/72.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in Dog Act, 1903, the Shire of Tambellup hereby records having resolved on the 12th day of January, 1972 to submit for confirmation of the Governor the following By-law for control of dogs within the area of the Shire of Tambellup and repeals all by-laws at present in force within the Shire of Tambellup in so far as they relate to the above subject matter.

1. In these by-laws the term "Shire Council" means the Shire of Tambellup.

2. The Shire Council may establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903.

3. A dog seized by the Police or by an officer authorised by the Shire Council may be placed in a pound.

4. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound the keeper of the pound or other officer authorised by the Shire Council shall, if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him, forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.

5. An authorised person shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Shire Council.

6. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog, then upon payment of the fees specified in the schedule hereto the dog shall be released to such person.

7. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of an authorised person the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. The officer may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Shire Council in respect of the delivery of the dog in good faith.

8. If the dog shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of its being seized or if a dog having a collar around its neck with a registration label for the current year affixed thereto shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of the service of a notice upon the registered owner an authorised person may sell the dog.

9. Upon the sale of the dog, the proceeds of sale shall be the property of the Shire Council and may be disposed of in such manner as the Shire Council thinks fit. The owner of a dog sold pursuant to these by-laws shall have no claim against the Shire Council in respect of the proceeds thereof.

10. If within the time mentioned in by-law 8 hereof or at any time before the destruction of a dog the dog has not been claimed as aforesaid and the said fees paid and if no offer has been received for its purchase the dog may be destroyed.

11. Notwithstanding anything herein contained but subject to the provisions of Section 19 of the said Dog Act, 1903, any dog seized or impounded may at any time be destroyed upon the authority of the Shire Council if, in the opinion of the Shire Clerk, the dog is too savage or noisy to be kept or is suffering from an injury, disease or sickness.

12. If the Shire Council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not, the owner shall pay to the Shire Council the fees specified in the Schedule hereto.

13. No person shall:—

- (a) Unless authorised in that regard, release or attempt to release a dog from a pound.
- (b) Destroy, break into, damage or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof, any pound.
- (c) Destroy, break into, damage or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof, any dog cart, vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching, holding or conveying dogs which have been seized.

14. The owner of a dog shall keep such dog chained or under effective control from sunset to sunrise.

15. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—

- (a) A public building.
- (b) A house of worship.
- (c) A shop or other public business premises.

16. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—

(a) A Sportsground.(b) An area set aside for public recreation.

(c) A car park.

- (d) A school.
- (e) Any land vested in or under the control of the Shire Council other than a road.

17. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from wandering at large without any effective control upon any road being vested in or under the control of the Council.

18. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee of the Shire Council or member of the Police Force in the performing of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act 1903, or the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions.

19. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of it of liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of these by-laws.

20 Any person who shall commit a breach of these by-laws shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$20.
