WHEREAS by section 13 of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1969, the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioner, declare by proclamation that any road shall be a main road: and whereas the Commissioner has recommended that the roads specified in the Schedule hereto be so declared: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and pursuant to the said recommendation do declare that the road shown coloured red on Plan M.R.D. 7122-157 shall be a main road and that footpaths, if any, of such road be excluded from the main road.

SHIRE OF GINGIN TOWN PLANNING
SCHEME No. 2.

THE Gingin Shire Council under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of—

(a) Preserving the amenity of the Shire of Gingin.

(b) Controlling land development.

(c) Preventing ribbon development.

(d) Restricting the placing of signs, billboards and overhead wires.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Gingin Town Planning Scheme No. 2, hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the Shire of Gingin. The Council may prepare guiding plans in respect of any townsite which it shall use to assist it in the use of its discretionary powers under the Scheme.

The Council may prepare detailed Town Planning Schemes to cover townsites or other defined areas within the Shire, and such Town Planning Schemes, when approved in accordance with the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended) shall replace the Scheme within those areas.

1.3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Gingin, hereinafter called "the Council".

1.4 Arrangement of the Scheme: The Scheme is divided into the following Parts:—

Part I—Preliminary.

Part II—Reserves.

Part III.—Zones.

Part IV.—Non-conforming use of land.

Part V.—General provisions.

Part VI.—Administration.

The Scheme documents comprise this Text and the Scheme Map.

1.5 Interpretation:

(a) Subject to the provisions of subclause (2) of this clause, in this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix D of the Town Planning Regulations 1967, unless specifically stated herein.

(b) In this Scheme, unless the context requires otherwise, "major roads" means the roads designated as such on the Scheme Map.

PART II.—RESERVES.

2.1 Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the Scheme Map.

2.2 Where land reserved as Unalienated Crown Land under the Scheme is transferred in leasehold or in freehold such land shall be deemed, as long as it is so held, to be in the Rural Zone, and the provisions of the Scheme relating to land in that Zone shall apply.

PART III.—ZONES.

3.1 The Scheme area is divided into the following zones:

- Urban
- Rural

3.2 All land within the Scheme Area is divided into the zones mentioned in Clause 3.1 above and the zoning of any portion of land may be ascertained by reference to the Scheme Map and the legend thereof.

3.3 Table No. 1 appended to Clause 3.4 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such use being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left hand side of the table and the list of "zones" on the top of that Table. Where a use is not mentioned in the list of "Use Classes" it shall be deemed to be not permitted in any zone.

3.4 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 appended to this clause have the following meanings:

- "P" = A use that is permitted as of right.
- "AA" = A use that is permitted only if approval is granted by the Council.
- "IP" = A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Council.
- "X" = A use that is not permitted.

PART IV.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

4.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), or any other law authorising the development to be carried out, had been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, buildings may not be extended for that use except by written permission of the Council.

- 4.3 Discontinuance of Non-conforming use:
- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provision of the Scheme.
 - (b) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and occupier of that property and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

PART V.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

5.1 Signs, Hoardings, Billboards:

- (a) No sign, hoarding, billboard, advertising device or like structure shall be erected within ten (10) chains of the centre line of a major road without the written approval of the Council.
- (b) The Council will not approve the erection of any advertising sign for a service or commodity which is not offered or produced or sold on the lot on which the sign is to be erected.
- (c) In exercising its discretion under this section the Council will consider the design of the sign, hoarding, billboard, advertising device or like structure, its effect on the scenic attraction of the area and the distractive effect that any such structure may have on motorists.
- (d) Clause 5.1(a) of this part shall not apply to cautionary road signs and other signs erected by public authorities.
- (e) Council may specify an area on the approaches to an Urban Zone where approved signs may be erected.

5.2 Overhead Wires:

- (a) No overhead wires or appurtenances thereto shall be erected within two (2) chains of the centre line of a major road without the written approval of Council.
- (b) Clause 5.2(a) of this part shall not apply to the State Electricity Commission when exercising its powers pursuant to the State Electricity Commission Act.

5.3 No person shall without the written permission of the Council erect any temporary structure on any Reserve within that part of the Shire of Gingin between high water mark and the Perth-Lancelin Road, where such Reserve is under the control of the Council.

5.4 The Council may order the removal of any structure which has been erected contrary to the provisions of this Part, and such structure shall be removed within 30 days of the issue of an Order of Removal.

5.5 Where a person fails to act upon an Order of Removal, the Council may execute the work and recover from the person in default such costs as the Council has incurred in the execution of that work.

PART VI.—ADMINISTRATION.

- 6.1 The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.
- 6.2 Any application to develop required under any provision of the Scheme shall be in writing addressed to the Shire Clerk of the Gingin Shire Council and may be approved by the Council or approved subject to conditions, or refused.

- 6.3 The procedure for the lodgment and determination of appeals by persons aggrieved by a decision of the Council exercising its discretionary power pursuant to the provisions of this Scheme shall be as laid down in Part V of the Town Planning and Development Act and the Regulations made under that Act.
- 6.4 Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.
