WHEREAS by section 18 of the Native Welfare Act, 1963, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown Lands to be a Reserve for Natives; and whereas it is now deemed desirable that the Central Reserve No. 17614 be increased in area: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the area more particularly described in the Schedule hereto be included into Central Reserve for Natives. (Reserve No. 17614.)
