WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by paragraph (e) of subsection (3) of section 30 of the Marketing of Potatoes Act, 1946-1966, that the Western Australian Potato Marketing Board may deduct from the proceeds of the sale of potatoes, or, as the case may be, from any progress or final payments made by it under subsection (2) of that section, such portion thereof but not exceeding one and a half per cent. thereof, as the Governor by proclamation from time to time declares: Now, therefore, I, the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred on me by the Marketing of Potatoes Act, 1946-1966, do by this proclamation declare that in respect of potatoes which form part of the No. 1 Potato Marketing Pool for the 1972-73 season or any subsequent Potato Marketing Pool operated by the Western Australian Potato Marketing Board, that Board may, for the purposes of paragraph (e) of subsection (3) of section 30 of the Marketing of Potatoes Act, 1946-1966, deduct from the proceeds of the sale of potatoes, or, as the case may be, from any progress or final payments made by it under subsection (2) of that section, one and a half per cent. thereof.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1969 it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Governor may by proclamation—

- (a) revoke any proclamation made under the Act; and
- (b) prohibit either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations, the

bringing or sending into the State either generally or from any specified State, country or place, of any specified kind of plant, fruit or other thing which would in his opinion be likely to introduce any disease within the meaning of the Act into this State or of anything which is infected or anything which is infected with any specified disease; and whereas, I, the Governor, am of the opinion that the bringing or sending into this State from any other State or Territory of the Commonwealth, of plants of any species belonging to the genus *Sorghum*, or seeds or other parts of such plants, would be likely to introduce the disease of sorghum known as Sorghum Midge (*Contarinia sorghicola*) into this State: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1969, do by this proclamation—

- (a) revoke the proclamation made under that Act on the 24th April, 1972, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd May, 1972; and
- (b) prohibit, except in accordance with the Plant Diseases (*Sorghum Midge*) Regulations, 1972, the bringing or sending into the State, from any other State or Territory of the Commonwealth, of sorghum plants, or seeds or other parts of sorghum plants.

(c) When any cleared, or partly cleared land abuts a railway reserve a firebreak not less than 6 feet wide shall be cleared within 10 feet and parallel to the common boundary.

(d) A firebreak 10 feet wide shall be cleared not less than 1 chain and not more than 5 chains from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks, homesteads and fuel storage areas by 30th November, 1972, and the area between the firebreaks and the building or haystack cleared of all inflammable material by 15th December, 1972.

(e) The control officer can approve a well burnt roadside as a substitute for a firebreak inside the property.

On or before 15th December, 1972, all town lots under one acre in area and all fuel depots within the Shire are required to be cleared of all debris or inflammable material. Firebreak Order.

Burning is not Permitted on Sundays.

Notice to Owners and/or Occupiers of Land.

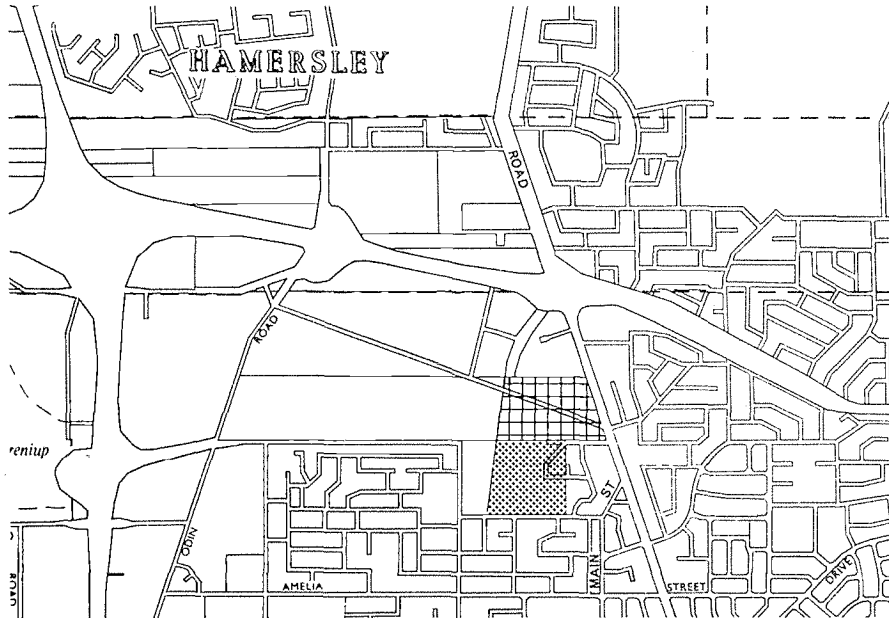

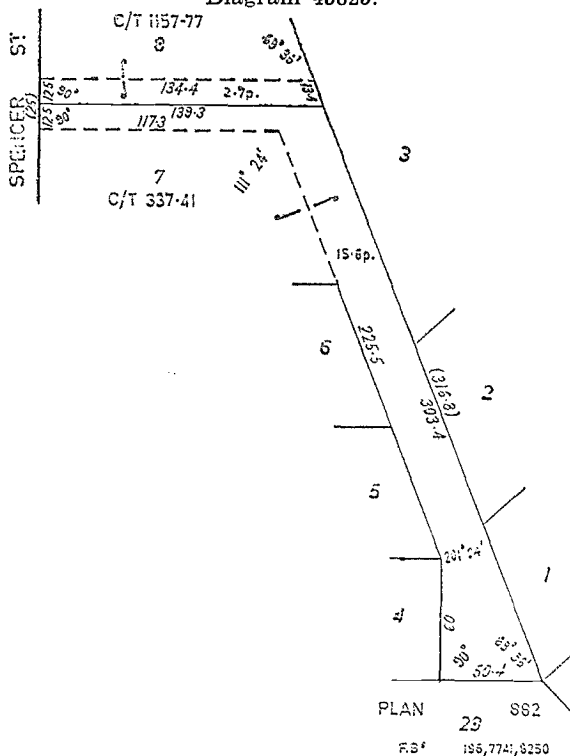

(a) is accompanied by a certificate issued by the Department of Agriculture of the State or Territory of origin, certifying that the seed has been fumigated at the rate of one standard phosphate (Phostoxin) tablet per 25 kilograms of seed for five days followed by aeration;
(b) contains less than one per cent. by weight of chaff consisting of pieces of vegetative parts of plants other than seeds or seed fragments;
(c) is packed in new, securely sealed—
(i) polypropylene bags of 12 x 10 construction; or
(ii) double jute bags; and
(d) immediately after its arrival, is made available to an inspector for inspection.
- Reg. 5 substituted. 5. The principal regulations are amended by revoking regulation 5 and substituting the following regulation—
5. Any plant, or seed or other part of a plant that is introduced or attempted to be introduced into the State contrary to these regulations may be seized by an inspector and dealt with in accordance with the provisions of section 23 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914.
