FIREARMS AND GUNS ACT, 1931-1971.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the Firearms and Guns Act, 1931-1971, has been pleased to make the regulations set out in the Schedule hereunder.

Principal regulations.

Reg. 22 amended.

1. In these regulations the Firearms Regulations, 1931 reprinted ^{18.} pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th January, 1970 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published are referred to as the principal regulations.

2. Regulation 22 of the principal regulations is amended by substituting for paragraph (iv) the following paragraph—

- (iv) that where the ammunition is supplied:-
 - (a) in response to a mail order, the dealer affixes the mail order in column 9 of the ammunition sales book opposite the relevant entry;
 - (b) in response to an order placed by another licensed dealer, the dealer affixes a copy of the invoice in column 9 of the ammunition sales book opposite the relevant entry;
 - (c) in circumstances other than those set out in subparagraphs (a) and (b) of this paragraph, the person to whom such ammunition is supplied shall sign a statement in such book acknowledging the truth of all such details.

3. Regulation 23 of the principal regulations is amended:-

- (a) by substituting for the passage "(iii), and (iv)" in line eight, the passage "and (iii)"; and
- (b) by substituting for the passage "ammunition." in line eleven, the passage "ammunition, and the agent shall sign a statement in column 9 of the ammunition sales book acknowledging the truth of all such details.".

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 28th day of June, 1972, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-law:—

1. The occupier of premises whereon a dog is kept shall—

- (a) Enclose such premises or the portion thereof in which the dog is kept with a fence of sufficient height and of such a nature as to prevent the dog from escaping therefrom.
- (b) Maintain the said fence in good order and condition.
- (c) Prevent the dog or dogs kept on the said premises from wandering at large.

2. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to—

(a) A maximum penalty of \$100; and

(b) A maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$10.00 per day.

By-law Relating to Noxious Weeds.

Penalty: For a first offence a fine not exceeding twenty dollars, and for a subsequent offence a fine not exceeding fifty dollars.
