Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Collie.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 30th day of November, 1972, to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following, and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of infiammable material up to and including the 15th day of April, 1973.

 - (b) Where the area of land exceeds one-half of an acre clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks not less than 6 feet wide immediately inside all external boundaries of your land and immediately surrounding all buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land.

If for any reason it is considered to be impracticable to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply in writing to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 15th day of November, 1972, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land.

No such application will be considered unless it is supported in writing by a Bush Fire Control Officer.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Cunderdin.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, all owners or occupiers of land in the Shire of Cunderdin are required to observe the following requirements pertaining to the provision of firebreaks in each and every year:—

Rural Areas:

- (1) A firebreak as prescribed hereunder shall be provided completely surrounding areas of the land comprising of more than 400 acres.
- (2) Such firebreaks as defined shall be completed on or before the 15th October, of each year.
- (3) Inmediately surrounding all buildings, haystacks, and fuel ramps, situated on the land.

Definition of "Firebreak". For the purpose of the above Regulation a firebreak shall be deemed to be a strip of land not less than 8 ft. in width clear of all infiammable material by either ploughing, cultivating, burning, etc., so that such strip cannot carry fire.

For the purpose of this regulation, any made road cleared to a width of not less than 20 feet and of all infiammable material will be accepted as a firebreak.

Townsites: All town lots shall conform with the following prior to the 31st October, in each year and maintained in such order until the 1st April of the following year:—

(1) \(\frac{1}{4}\) acre or less to be cleared and maintained free of all grass and debris of an infiammable nature.

(2) Over ¼ acre to be cleared and maintained free of all debris of an inflammable nature to a width of 8 ft., immediately inside all external boundaries.

Where it is not considered practicable or advisable by reason of possible erosion or other effect to adhere in detail to the Regulation, a variance from such may be applied for from the nearest Fire Control Officer.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Gingin.

- 3. Urban Land (all land within the Gingin Townsite): You shall—
 - (a) Where the area of land is less than 4 acres, clear of all infiammable material firebreaks at least 3 feet wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land; and
 - (b) Where the area of the land exceeds 4 acres clear of all infiammable material firebreaks at least 6 feet wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land.

If it is considered to be impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this Notice you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised Officer not later than the 31st day of October, 1972, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised Officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

Townsites: On or before the 10th day of December, 1972 all townsite residential lots of an area of one acre or less, within the Shire of Kojonup are required to be cleared by the owner and/or occupier of all inflammable materials and maintained free of such inflammable materials until the 15th day of April, 1973. Other townsite blocks must comply with requirements listed in the preceding sections.

 - 31C. Subject to the following clauses the parking requirement outside the Central Business Area is three square feet of parking space for each one square foot of gross building floor area.
 - 31D. An Owner may satisfy the requirements of the preceding clauses-
 - (a) by the provision of not less than 50 per cent. of the parking area on his own land contiguous to the development and the Title of such land must be consolidated with the developed area; and
 - (b) if the Council has provided or proposes to provide parking facilities sufficiently close to the development to be used by customers the owner may if the Council so agrees pay to the Council the estimated cost of not more than 50 per cent. of the parking requirements.
 - 31E. The estimated costs referred to in Clause 31D(b) shall be the estimated cost to the Developer of providing the additional parking requirements or the estimated cost to the Council of providing the parking requirements whichever is the greater. The Council may from time to time adopt a figure as the estimated cost of each unit of parking space provided by it. For the purpose of this Clause a car parking space shall be deemed to be 300 square feet. Until otherwise determined by the Council the figure shall be \$1.66 per square foot of parking space.
 - 31F. If evidence, including a statutory declaration of the owner, is produced to the Council that portion of a building cannot be used for retail shopping the Council may exclude such portion from the gross building floor area of a shopping development for the purpose of calculating the parking requirements of that development.
- 4. Amending Clause 32 by adding after the words "except where public access" the words "satisfactory to the Council".
- 5. Amending Clause 33 by deleting reference to "Gibson Street" and substituting "Tuckey Street" therefor.

No person should be permitted to act as a member of a panel if he has any pecuniary interest in the matter before it.
- (5) The Council is not bound by a recommendation of the panel but if it does not accept the recommendation it should give reasons for its
