(d) if and whenever requested by the Minister, a statement shall be furnished to the Minister by Commercial Continental (Securities) Ltd. setting out full particulars of all loans made during the period to which the request relates, specifying in respect of each loan the amount of the loan, the interest charged and the reasons advanced by the borrower for seeking the loan.

Firebreak Requirements 1972-1973.

Notice to all Owners and/or occupiers of land within the Shire of Northam:

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the dates referred to below to clear firebreaks on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the following and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of all inflammable material up to and including the 15th day of April, 1973:—

- (1) You shall on or before 15th day of October, 1972, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least six feet in width immediately inside and along all external boundaries of the land.
- (2) You shall on or before 15th day of October, 1972, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least six feet in width in such positions as to divide properties of more than 500 acres into separate sections of no more than 500 acres completely surrounded by a firebreak of at least six feet in width.

width within five chains of the perimeter of all buildings and/or haystacks or groups of buildings and/or haystacks in such a manner as to completely encircle the buildings and/or haystacks.

- (4) You shall on or before the 29th day of November, 1972, in the Western section of the Shire of Northam (i.e. all land west of the dividing line described hereunder) and on or before the 15th day of November, 1972, in the Eastern section of the Shire of Northam (i.e. all land east and south of the dividing line described hereunder), clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least six feet in width immediately surrounding all areas of standing crop or standing crop and pasture combined in such positions so as areas of standing crop or standing crop and pasture combined of more than 250 acres are divided into separate areas of no more than 250 acres.
- (5) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1972, clear of all inflammable material two firebreaks of at least six feet in width and approximately one chain apart inside and along all property boundaries which abut a Railway Reserve on which railway traffic is operating and where the Railway Reserve is situated outside a townsite boundary.
- (6) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1972, clear of all inflammable material (including standing and fallen trees, branches and undergrowth) firebreaks of at least ten feet in width along and as close as possible to all external boundaries of each separate area of undeveloped land and in such extra positions so as areas of undeveloped land of more than 500 acres are divided into areas of no more than 500 acres completely surrounded by a firebreak.
- (7) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1972, completely clear of all inflammable material all separate townsite lots where the lot is one acre or less in area.

Dividing Line.

An imaginary line commencing at the North Eastern corner of Avon Location 1779, thence running South and South East along the Western Boundaries of Buckland Road (No. 25) and Irish-town Road (No. 109) to the North Western Boundary of the Town of Northam, thence North East along the said boundary, along the North Eastern and South Eastern boundaries of the said town to its intersection of the Avon River, thence South along the said Avon River to the South Eastern boundary of the Shire.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer, not later than the 7th October, 1972, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this order is a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$200, and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this order if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

Definition and Clarification.

For purpose of correct interpretation of this notice please note that—

- (1) Cropped Land:
  - (a) If several paddocks of standing crop or standing crop and pasture total no more than 250 acres then a firebreak completely surrounding the several paddocks is sufficient.

- (b) If a single paddock comprises several areas of standing crop divided by pasture, timbered, stony or other areas and the total area of the paddock is no more than 250 acres, then a firebreak surrounding the paddock is sufficient.
- (c) If a single paddock of standing crop or standing crop and pasture combined is more than 250 acres in area, then additional firebreaks would have to be provided so as to divide the paddock into separate areas of no more than 250 acres, with each separate area being surrounded by a firebreak.
- (2) Undeveloped Land:
- (a) Undeveloped land should be regarded as land which is virtually still in its virgin state and includes land on which development has commenced but has not been completed to any final stage. The term is not intended to apply to areas of bush or semi bush which have been left uncleared within a developed property because of the nature of the terrain or for shelter or similar purposes. Land which is developed to a "Parkland" state should be considered as developed land.
- (b) An area of undeveloped land means an area, irrespective of shape or size which is not completely or partially divided by developed land. This means if two undeveloped areas, whether of the same location number or not, are separated by developed land, they must be regarded as separate areas and should be treated accordingly.
- (3) Owner or Occupier: An owner or occupier is considered by this Office to be the person registered in Council's ratebook as such, irrespective of whether the land concerned is subject of Conditional Purchase Agreement, Contract of Sale, Mortgage, etc.

- (g) Where the area of land is one half of one acre or less all inflammable material on the land shall be removed from the whole of the land, and
- (h) Where the land exceeds one half of one acre in area firebreaks at least six feet wide shall be cleared of all inflammable material immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act
