(2) Where a person has been appointed to perform the duties referred to in paragraph (a) of subregulation (1) of this regulation, the person is empowered to stop vehicles from proceeding through a children's crossing or a pedestrian crossing, to require vehicles to remain stationary and to prohibit persons from walking across or onto a children's crossing or a pedestrian crossing, and the person so appointed may give such signals or directions to drivers of those vehicles and to those other persons as are necessary for that purpose.

(3) Where a person has been appointed to perform the duties referred to in paragraph (b) of subregulation (1) of this regulation that person is empowered—

- (a) to examine any vehicle at a place provided for the examination of vehicles and may for that purpose do all such things as are necessary for him to ascertain whether any such vehicle complies with the provisions of the Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1965, as in force from time to time under the Act; and
- (b) to do all such things as members of the police force or traffic inspectors are authorised to do by regulations 105, 106 and 107 of the Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1965, as in force from time to time under the Act.

- Uniforms. 36B. A person appointed to perform the duties referred to in paragraph (a) of subregulation (1) of regulation 36A shall wear—

- (a) a peaked cap with white cover on which there is displayed a badge embossed or stamped with the words "Crossing Attendant"; and
- (b) a white dust coat,

Regulations.

- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Fauna Conservation Regulations made pursuant to the Fauna Conservation Act, 1950-1969, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th November, 1970, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 8 amended. 2. Regulation 8 of the principal regulations is amended—
(a) by revoking subregulations (2) and (3);
(b) by deleting from line two of subregulation (5) the passage "receive into any chiller or refrigerated vehicle, or"; and
(c) by revoking subregulations (6) and (7).
- Reg. 8A added. 3. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 8 the following heading and regulation:—

Use of Chiller Units.

8A. (1) A person shall not use a chiller unit for the holding of carcasses of kangaroos, unless—

(a) the owner of that chiller unit has registered the chiller unit with the Chief Warden of Fauna; and

(b) a registered number allotted in respect of that chiller unit is displayed thereon in a prominent position as directed by the Chief Warden of Fauna.

(2) The registered number required to be displayed pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation shall be painted in black on a yellow background in symbols not less than six inches in height.

(3) A person shall not—

(a) receive any kangaroo or part of a kangaroo into a chiller unit; or

(b) allow any kangaroo or part of a kangaroo to remain in a chiller unit, unless that kangaroo or part of a kangaroo is duly marked with a tag as prescribed.

(4) The person in charge of a chiller unit shall keep a daily record in duplicate in the form of Form 3 in Appendix A or in such other form as the Chief Warden of Fauna may require, and shall—

(a) make the record available for inspection on being demanded to do so by a warden or other authorised person; and

(b) on or before the fifteenth day of each month, forward the original of the completed form for the immediately preceding calendar month to the Chief Warden of Fauna.

(5) Where the holder of a professional shooter's license or any other person is in charge of a chiller unit owned by the holder of a license to process kangaroos or a direct dealer's license, the owner shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that the provisions of paragraph (b) of subregulation (1) and of subregulations (2), (3) and (4) of this regulation are complied with at all times.

(6) The owner of a chiller unit shall forthwith notify the Chief Warden of Fauna of the name of the person from time to time in charge of the chiller unit.

(7) The owner of a chiller unit shall forthwith notify the Chief Warden of Fauna where he disposes of or ceases to use the chiller unit and the Chief Warden of Fauna may transfer or cancel the registration as the case may be.

**CITY OF STIRLING TOWN PLANNING SCHEME
No. 31—BALCATTIA SCHEME.**

THE City of Stirling under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

SCHEME TEXT.

1. Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as City of Stirling Town Planning Scheme No. 31—Balcatta Scheme (hereinafter called "the Scheme").

2. Responsible Authority: The Authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the City of Stirling (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

3. Maps: The following Scheme Maps are attached to this Text and form part of the Scheme:

Land Use Map.

Scheme Map.

4. Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the lands contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map and on the Scheme Map, with the exception of those portions annotated on the Scheme Map as "excluded from Scheme". The said area is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".

5. General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are:—

- (a) To improve and develop the Scheme Area to the best possible advantage.
- (b) To make suitable provision for the better use of the land within the Scheme Area for building purposes.
- (c) To make suitable provision for roads within the Scheme Area.
- (d) To ensure the proper drainage of those parts of the Scheme Area that require drainage and to provide adequate drainage areas and drainage compensating basins.
- (e) To make provision for land to be used for ornamental lakes and public open space within the Scheme Area.
- (f) To provide reticulated water and sewage disposal services throughout the Scheme Area.

- (g) To provide sites for an Hotel, shops, service station, and civic uses.
- (h) To provide for the placing of low voltage power lines underground wherever practicable.
6. Scheme Works: The following works shall be carried out:—
- (a) The Scheme Area shall be re-surveyed in conformity with the design shown on the Scheme Map with such minor variations as may be determined by the Council and approved by the Town Planning Board.
- (b) The Scheme Area shall be re-graded so that it shall conform to the contours shown on the Scheme Map.
- (c) Such earthworks as are necessary for the implementation of the Scheme shall be carried out.
- (d) The lands shown as roads on the Scheme Map shall be reserved as roads and, unless now constructed, shall be constructed and drained, and all necessary earthworks undertaken.
- (e) Footways and underpasses shall be constructed where appropriate.
- (f) The lands designated for such purpose on the Scheme Map shall be set aside for public open space.
- (g) Low-lying areas shall be developed and maintained as ornamental lakes and fauna sanctuaries as shown on the Scheme Map.
- (h) Landscaping, tree planting and garden treatment and basic development of public open space and water areas shall be carried out.
- (i) The Scheme Area shall be properly drained and all necessary drainage works carried out.
- (j) Sewage disposal facilities by means of deep sewerage shall be provided throughout the Scheme Area.
- (k) All lots within the Scheme Area shall be supplied with reticulated water.
- (l) Where necessary, drainage works, sewerage works and water supply works shall be undertaken outside the limits of the Scheme Area, to bring the services to the Scheme Area.
- (m) As far as practicable, low voltage power lines and power lines for street lighting shall be placed underground; and where considered necessary, electric light standards shall be provided.
- (n) Those buildings and fences, which in the opinion of the Council interfere with the proper development of the Scheme Area, or conflict with the new subdivision, will be demolished or otherwise removed; and in cases considered desirable by the Council, such fences and buildings may be re-erected.
7. Acquisition of Land: The land within the Scheme Area or so much thereof as is necessary to implement the Scheme shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council. Nothing in this Clause shall preclude the Council from exercising the powers provided in Clause 43 (a).
8. Closure of Roads: Those roads which are shown as closed roads on the Scheme Map shall be closed and the land shall vest in the Council free from encumbrances and be used for the purposes shown on the Scheme Map.
9. Valuations: The Unimproved Capital Value of the lots shown on the Land Use Map (hereinafter called "old lots") shall be ascertained as at the date on which the Scheme comes into operation.
10. The lots created by the re-survey of the Scheme Area in accordance with the Scheme Map (hereinafter called "new lots") shall be valued as at the date on which the Scheme comes into operation, on the basis that all works to be undertaken as part of the Scheme have been carried out.

11. Increase Value Ratio: From the sum of the values of the new lots within the Scheme Area shall be deducted the costs or estimated costs of the Scheme; and the figure so ascertained is the net value of the new lots. The Increase Value Ratio is the relationship between the net values of the new lots and the sum of the values of the old lots within the Scheme Area.

12. Owners' Interest in the Scheme: Each owner of an old lot in the Scheme Area shall be deemed to be entitled to an interest in the Scheme of a value equal to the value of his old lot within the Scheme Area increased in the ratio of the increase Value Ratio determined in accordance with Clause 11 hereof.

13. Council's Land: If, at the date of the coming into operation of the Scheme, the Council shall be the owner of land within the Scheme Area not acquired by it for the purposes of the Scheme, it shall in all respects have similar rights to an interest in the Scheme replacement lots and otherwise, as have other owners of land within the Scheme Area.

14. If any land in the Scheme Area shall have been acquired by the Council for the purposes of the Scheme, such land shall be made available by the Council upon payment to it of all costs relative to the purchase or acquisition of the lands and improvements thereon, together with compound interest thereon, from the date of each expenditure until the repayment at a rate of interest commensurate with bank overdraft interest applicable from time to time.

15. Cost of Scheme: The Scheme shall be debited with:—

- (a) The administration costs of the Scheme, including an amount to reimburse the Council for such overhead and supervision costs as may be incurred in the implementation of the Scheme.
- (b) The costs of the Scheme works.
- (c) All compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation and any payment to be made under Clauses 18 and 19 hereof.
- (d) The estimated compensation and costs payable under Clause 16 hereof.
- (e) The cost of acquisition of any land within the Scheme Area, in the event of such land being acquired other than by resumption.
- (f) Moneys payable to the Council under Clause 14 hereof.
- (g) Any moneys paid by the Council in order that water supplies and sewerage facilities may be available within the Scheme Area.
- (h) The costs of extension of water mains and any contribution made, or to be made, to the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board in respect of sewerage and drainage works.
- (i) The cost of altering existing electricity, water, sewerage, drainage, telephone services and all other services.
- (j) The costs of the provision of adequate housing for all persons who have been displaced from their residences by reason of the Scheme.
- (k) All other costs and expenses which the Council shall be required to meet in order to implement and complete the Scheme.

16. Estimate of Compensation: In the event of any claims for compensation not having been settled at the time when the Council is ready to transfer lots in pursuance of the Scheme, the Council may estimate the amounts of compensation payable and the costs relating thereto, and debit the Scheme with the amount so estimated. In the event of the Council so doing, the difference between the estimated and the actual compensation payable shall be received or paid by the Council, as the case may be.

17. Allocation and Disposal of New Lots: The new lots created by the re-survey of the Scheme Area will be dealt with as follows:—

- (a) Each owner of land within the Scheme Area shall be offered a new lot or lots zoned for residential purposes (hereinafter called "replacement lots"), of a value as near as practicable to the owner's interest in the Scheme as calculated according to Clause 12. The replacement lots shall be chosen and allocated as equitably as possible, so that, if practicable, the replacement lot will have characteristics similar to those of the old lot required from the owner.
- (b) The Hotel site shown on the Scheme Map shall be dealt with in accordance with Clauses 29 to 35.
- (c) The Kindergarten site shown on the Scheme Map shall vest in the Council free of cost and its value shall not be credited to the Scheme.
- (d) The Primary School site is reserved for that purpose by the Scheme for the Minister of Education, who will be responsible for the cost of its acquisition.
- (e) All the remaining lots including the sites marked Service Station and Shopping Centre on the Scheme Map (hereinafter referred to as "saleable lots") may be sold to pay the Scheme Costs and otherwise dealt with in accordance with the Scheme.

18. Additional Damage or Inconvenience: If an owner shall in the opinion of the Council suffer any additional damage or inconvenience by reason of the Scheme, the Council shall offer to such owner such sum (if any) as it (acting on the advice of the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department, or a Valuer appointed under Clause 44) considers equitable.

19. Demolition of Occupied Dwellings: The Council may make arrangements for the re-housing of owners and occupiers of the dwelling houses to be demolished when the Scheme works are carried out. Such arrangements shall be on the basis that no financial loss is suffered and that the dislocation of the existing amenity of the owners and occupiers is kept to a minimum.

20. Nature of Offers: An offer pursuant to Clause 16 (a) hereof shall be made on the basis that the owner's equity in the Scheme is maintained as provided for in Clause 11. In the case where the value entitlement results in an allocation involving part of a lot, a cash adjustment will be made either by or to the Council. An owner may accept no lots or a lesser number of lots than his allocation, subject to payment by Council to him.

21. The offers mentioned in the above clause shall be made in writing to each of the said owners and served by registered post on him at his address as appearing in the Rate Book of the Council and shall specify the new lot or lots the subject of the offer, and the old lot in respect of which the offer is made. It shall also specify the owner's interest in the Scheme, the valuations placed on the said lots, and the payment to be made or received, as the case may be, and how the amount is calculated.

22. If a pipe drain has been, or is to be, laid across land within a new lot, such new lot may be offered or sold expressly subject to the condition that the transferee shall grant to the Council or to the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board, a drainage easement over so much of the lot as is required for the drain. If the Council shall itself have granted an easement to the said Board, the lot shall be transferred subject to such easement.

23. The offer shall specify a date not being less than twenty-eight (28) days after the posting of the said offer within which the offer may be accepted.

24. The offer may be accepted by notice in writing to the Council at any time before the date specified in the said offer, and if not accepted

within such time, shall be deemed to have been rejected unless the time shall have been extended by the Council.

25. An owner who accepts an offer wholly or in part shall be liable to pay to the Council all rates which would have been payable on his old lot if such lot had remained in the name of the owner until the transfer of the new lots to him.

26. If the offer be accepted, it shall be accepted by the owner in full settlement and satisfaction of all claims for compensation in respect of the resumption from him of the old lot or lots in respect of which the offer was made, and otherwise in respect of the operation of this Scheme, and on the condition that the owner will indemnify the Council against any claims which may be made by any other person who has, or claims to have, any estate or interest in the lots in respect of which the offer is made.

27. If an owner does not accept an offer wholly or in part he shall not be entitled to any interest under this Scheme.

28. Registration of Transfers: The Council shall cause to be prepared and sent to those owners entitled, transfers in respect of each lot offered and which has been accepted by the owner in accordance with the Scheme. If an owner shall fail to complete the transfer in accordance with the Transfer of Land Act 1893, as amended, and return it to the Council for registration, or if the owner shall fail to make payment of any money which may be due by him to the Council, within twenty-eight (28) days after having been called upon to do so by notice served by registered post on the owner at his address last known to the Council (which notice may be served with the Transfer), the Council may rescind any agreement whereby such owner is entitled to have the land, the subject of the transfer, transferred to him; and thereupon such owner shall have a claim against the Council only for a cash payment equal to his interest in the Scheme, and the land the subject of the transfer shall be treated as a rejected lot.

29. Hotel Site: The Swan Brewery Company Limited, of 98 Mounts Bay Road, Perth, is the owner of all that piece of land being Swan Location 2872; and being the whole of the land comprised in Certificate of Title Volume 1208, Folio 575, situate at the corner of North Beach Road and Cedric Street, and hereinafter referred to as "Location 2872". Location 2872 is situated outside the Scheme Area.

30. The Council and the Swan Brewery Company Limited executed an Indenture dated the 27th May, 1969, whereby the Council agreed, subject to the conditions therein contained, to endeavour to have Location 2872 zoned for the purpose of an hotel and shopping centre; and the Company agreed that upon the change of zoning becoming effective it would, subject to the conditions mentioned in the Indenture, construct an Hotel and Shopping Centre on Location 2872. Clause 5 of the said Indenture imposed certain additional obligations on the Company.

31. The Council shall ascertain the value of the Hotel site shown on the Scheme Map and shall ascertain the value of Location 2872. Both valuations shall be made as at the same date and on the basis that both sites have been zoned to permit the lands to be used for an Hotel. In making the valuation of Location 2872, account shall be taken of the reduction of the value due to the obligations imposed on the Company by Clause 5 of the said Indenture. All other requirements which would be expected to be made by the Council in considering development applications for the said sites shall also be taken into consideration.

32. The Council shall negotiate with the Company for the exchange of the Hotel site in the Scheme Area for Location 2872. The Company shall pay to the Council the excess in value, if any, of the new site over the value of the old site. The negotiations shall be on the basis that each party releases the other from the provisions of the Indenture made the 27th May, 1969, and that the

Hotel site shall be developed within a period and on terms to be agreed upon. Any agreement may contain such other terms and conditions as are appropriate in the circumstances.

33. If agreement can be reached with the Swan Brewery Company Limited, Location 2872 shall be treated as a surplus lot.

34. The Council shall have power to refer any matters in dispute with the said Company to arbitration.

35. If no agreement with the Company is reached the Hotel site on the Scheme Map shall be treated as a surplus lot.

36. Saleable Lots and Rejected Lots: Any lot offered to but not accepted by an owner in accordance with this Scheme, or the subject of a transfer not completed as aforesaid, may be dealt with by the Council as hereinafter appears.

37. The Council may sell the saleable lots and the rejected lots, either by public auction, tender, or private contract; as a whole, or in separate lots, upon such terms and conditions as the Council may think fit. In the event of a sale by private contract the price shall not be less than the price recommended by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia or a valuer appointed by the Council under Clause 44, unless, after submitting the land for sale by public auction or tender, that price has not been obtained.

38. The Council may, instead of selling all or any of the saleable lots or rejected lots, ascertain the value of them or those unsold, and credit the Scheme with the value so ascertained; and in that event the lots shall be the property of the Council and may be retained, sold, or otherwise dealt with in such manner as the Council thinks fit.

39. Profits of Scheme: In the event of the Scheme showing a profit, the amount of such profit shall be expended by the Council in the development of the Scheme Area.

40. Loss: If the Scheme shall show a loss, the amount of the loss shall be paid by the Council.

41. Encumbrances on Title: In the event of any land in the Scheme Area being subject to a registered mortgage, charge, or lease, or to a caveat to protect the interest of the purchaser, mortgagee, chargee, or lessee, the Council shall not make any payments to, nor transfer a new lot to, the owner, without the consent of all persons entitled to the benefit of the encumbrance, or unless subject to similar encumbrances.

42. Money Owing to Council and for Rates and Taxes: The Council may deduct from any monies payable to an owner the amount of any unpaid rates or taxes and any other monies owing by the owner to the Council, the Commissioner of State Taxation, or the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Board. Except in the case of pensioners, no new lot shall be transferred to an owner until all monies owing by him for municipal rates have been paid.

43. Powers of Council: The Council, in the conduct and management of this Scheme, shall, in addition to the powers and authorities hereinbefore mentioned, have the following powers:—

- (a) To implement the Scheme in stages, or to resume land and to carry out the Scheme works successively, in such part or parts of the Scheme Area as it shall from time to time determine.
- (b) To postpone the implementation of the Scheme.
- (c) To enter and inspect the land within the Scheme Area.
- (d) To enter into agreements or arrangements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the Scheme Area.
- (e) To extend the time within which any offer of replacement lots may be accepted.
- (f) Where necessary for the implementation of the Scheme, to acquire by purchase or otherwise any land or buildings within and outside the Scheme Area.

- (g) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled as the owner of land within the Scheme Area at the date of the coming into operation of this Scheme, upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit.
- (h) To dispose of any lots for the time being vested in it pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme.
- (i) Without limiting the generality of the foregoing paragraphs, the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition that buildings of a specified character with specific parking or other facilities shall, within a limited period, be constructed thereon; or that the land and buildings be used for a specified purpose.
- (j) To transfer any land acquired by it in pursuance of this Scheme, as compensation or part compensation; and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation.
- (k) To enter into such agreements and arrangements with the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Board, as seem proper to the Council, for the purpose of drainage, water supply, or sewerage facilities.
- (l) To remove, alter, or demolish any building which obstructs the observance or carrying out of this Scheme.
- (m) With the consent of the Town Planning Board, to make minor variations to the survey design where necessary, or desirable.
- (n) To let or lease, on such terms and conditions as it thinks fit, any land or buildings acquired by it pursuant to this Scheme.
- (o) To acquire or take on lease, land and buildings, for the purpose of making such land and buildings available to persons whose dwellings have been demolished or removed; and to lease or sell the Council's interest therein, on such terms as it thinks fit.
- (p) To construct buildings on land owned or leased by the Council.

44. Valuations: Where it is necessary to ascertain the value of any land for the purpose of the Scheme, the value shall be determined by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia; or at the option of the Council, by an independent valuer, who is a member of the Commonwealth Institute of Valuers, appointed by the Council.

45. Arbitration: Any dispute or difference between the owners as to their respective rights under this Scheme, or as to the valuation of land made for the purpose of the Scheme, may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895 or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force.

46. Time Limit for Claims for Compensation: Claims for compensation, other than for resumption of land, by reason of the operation of this Scheme, shall be made within six months of the coming into operation of this Scheme.

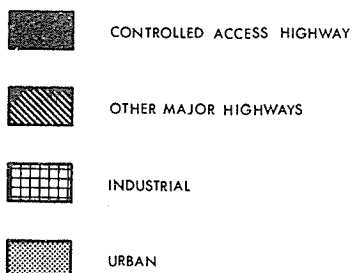
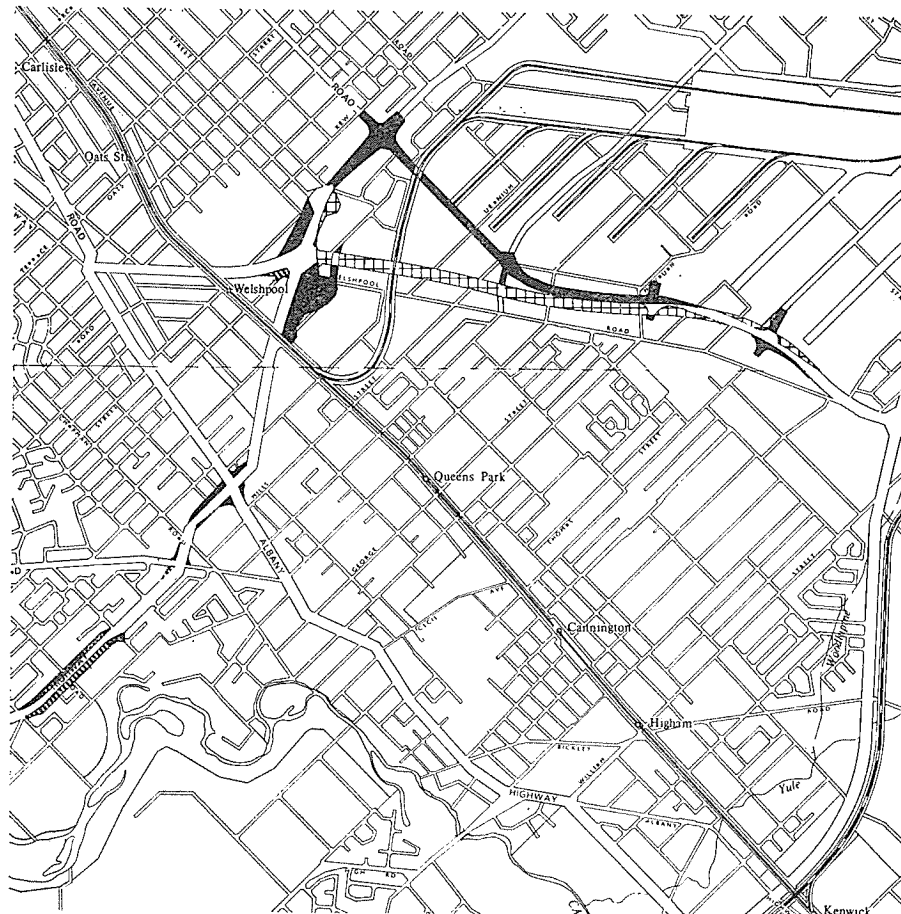

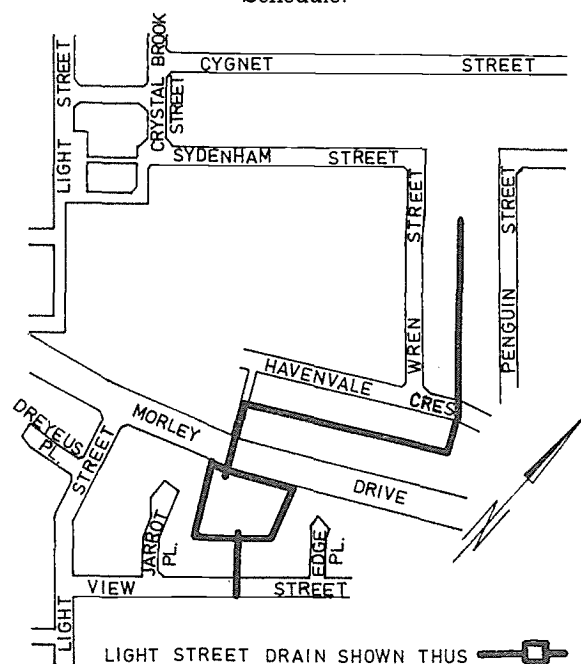
