WHEREAS by subsection (8) of section 21 of the Coal Mine Workers (Pensions) Act, 1943-1971, it is provided (*inter alia*) that the Governor may from time to time by proclamation increase or decrease the rates of contribution payable by each mine worker or by each owner in respect of each mine worker employed by such owner, as provided under the said Act; and whereas it is expedient to increase the rate of contribution payable by each mine worker and each owner aforesaid: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, do hereby proclaim that—

on and after the 7th day of July, 1972, but subject to subsection (5) of section twenty-one of the said Act, the rates of contribution payable by each mine worker shall be one dollar and sixty-eight cents per week and by each owner in respect of each mine worker employed by such owner six dollars and thirty cents per week.

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1971.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Reg. 83 amended.

1. In these regulations the Public Service Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th October, 1964, as amended by notices from time to time published in the *Government Gazette*, are referred to as the principal regulations.

2. Subregulation (12) of regulation 83 of the principal regulations is revoked and the following subregulation substituted:—

(12) Where, on or after the first day of August, 1972, an officer in the discharge of his duties suffers personal injuries by accident that are compensable in accordance with the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912, and which necessitate the granting of leave of absence under this regulation—

- (a) no charge shall be made against his sick leave credits in respect of so much of the period of leave as does not exceed twenty-six weeks and the officer shall receive full pay for any such part of his leave of absence; and
- (b) where the officer is unable to resume duty at the expiration of the period of twenty-six weeks, he shall be granted on full pay or half pay as the case requires, such further leave under this regulation as is required, but half the period only of such further leave shall be charged against his sick leave credits on full pay or half pay, as the case may be.
