AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in Executive Council Chamber at Perth on the 18th day of October, 1972, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Fires Brigades Act, 1942-1971.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1971, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, constitute as a fire district any portion of a district of a local authority which, after the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1971, is not a fire district, assign a name to a fire district and include the name of a fire district in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby—

- (a) constitute that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Williams, more particularly described in the schedule hereunder, a fire district;
- (b) assign the name Williams Fire District to that district; and
- (c) include in column one of Part IV of The Second Schedule to the Act, immediately below the words "Waroona Fire District", the words "Williams Fire District" and in column two opposite that name, the name of the local authority, "Shire of Williams".

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the southern corner of Williams Location 14748 and extending northwesterly and north-easterly along boundaries of that location to the western corner of Reserve Number 20417; thence northeasterly along the northwestern boundary of that reserve to the southern corner of Land Titles Office Lot 1 of Part Locations 13306 and 13307, as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 17590; thence northwesterly, northeasterly and southeasterly along boundaries of that lot to the northernmost corner of Location 13277; thence easterly along the northern boundary of that location to the western side of Albany Highway (Road Number 6963), a point on the present boundary of the Williams Townsite; thence generally northerly along that boundary to a point situate in prolongation west-erly of the northern side of Hamersley Street; thence easterly to and along that side and onward to the eastern side of Fry Street (Road Number 1092); thence southerly along that side and onward to the right bank of the Williams River; thence generally northeasterly upwards along that bank to a point situate in prolongation northwesterly of the northeastern side of Pollard Street; thence southeasterly to and along that side and onward to the northwestern side of the Railway Reserve; thence generally northeasterly along that side to a point situate in prolongation northwesterly of the northeastern side of Martin Street; thence southeasterly along that side to the northwestern boundary of Reserve Number 17309; thence south-westerly, southerly, southeasterly, northeasterly, generally southerly, easterly and again southerly along boundaries of that reserve to the north-eastern corner of Marjiddin Estate Lot 30; thence westerly along the northern boundary of that lot and onward to and along the northern boundary of Lot 29 to the eastern boundary of Williams Location 12070; thence northerly along that bound-ary and onward to a point situate in prolongation northwesterly of the southwestern side of Glenfield Street, a point on the present boundary of Williams Townsite aforesaid; thence northwesterly, gen-erally southwesterly and generally northwesterly along that boundary to the southeastern side of the Williams-Darkan Road (Road Number 2278); thence southwesterly along that side to a point situate in prolongation southeasterly of the south-western boundary of Location 14748 aforesaid; and thence northwesterly along that prolongation to the starting point.

Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1963-1965.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of sec-tion 6 in Part II of the Foreign Judgments (Reci-procal Enforcement) Act, 1963-1965, that the Gov-ernor may extend the provisions of that Part to any Commonwealth or foreign country on being satisfied as to substantial reciprocity of treatment as respects the enforcement within that country

of judgments given in the Supreme Court: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, being so satisfied, and acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said section, directs—

- (a) that Part II of the Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1963-1965, shall extend to the countries specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order;
- (b) that a court specified in column 2 of that Schedule shall, for the purposes of that Part, be deemed to be a superior court of the country specified in relation thereto,

and, pursuant to subsection (2) of section 4 of that Act, further directs that the following Orders in Council are hereby cancelled, that is to say—

- (a) an Order in Council issued under section 8 of the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act, 1921, in relation to the Dominion of New Zealand published at page 1225 in the *Government Gazette* on the 11th July, 1924; and
- (b) an Order in Council issued under sections 146 and 147 in Part VIII of the Supreme Court Act, 1935, in relation to the Dominion of New Zealand published at pages 1020-1 in the *Government Gazette* on the 9th June, 1939.

A. Rural Land (i.e. all land within the Shire of Harvey other than land within the townships of Yarloop, Harvey, Wokalup, Benger, Brunswick, Roelands, Australind, Binningup and Myalup).

- (5) You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1972, where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar

manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) clear of all inflammable material firebreaks not less than 1 chain wide in the following positions on the land on which the bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated:—

- (a) Immediately inside the external boundaries of the land; and
 - (b) in such positions as would divide the land into separate areas of not more than 300 acres, each surrounded by a firebreak at least one chain wide.
- (6) Where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) and such bulldozing, chaining and preparing of the bush is completed after the 15th day of November, 1972, you shall, within 28 days of completing the bulldozing, chaining or preparing of the bush, clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks not less than 1 chain wide in the following positions on that land on which the bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated—
- (a) Immediately inside the external boundaries of the land; and
 - (b) in such positions as would divide land into separate areas of not more than 300 acres, each surrounded by a firebreak at least one chain wide.

B. Townsite Land (i.e. all land within the Townsite of Yarloop, Harvey, Wokalup, Benger, Brunswick, Roelands, Australind, Binningup and Myalup).

- (1) You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1972 clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks not less than 6 feet wide immediately inside the external boundaries of the land owned or occupied by you.
- (2) You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1972, clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks not less than 10 feet wide, immediately surrounding any drums, or bulk tanks situated on the land, which are normally used for the storage of fuel, whether they contain fuel or not.

If for any reason it is considered to be impractical to clear firebreaks or to remove the inflammable material from land as required by this notice you may apply in writing to the Council or its duly authorised officer, on or before the 31st day of October, 1972, for permission to provide firebreaks in an alternative position. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The owner or occupier of land who fails or neglects to comply with the requirements of this notice is guilty of an offence under subsection 3 of section 33 of the Act and is liable for a penalty of not less than \$10 or more than \$200 and the Council may do the works and charge the owner or occupier for such works. If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

Firebreaks in the situations described hereunder will be accepted as complying with the requirements of this notice as far as it applies to the common boundaries between the land of any owner or occupier and the abutting land referred to hereunder:—

NOTICE to all owners and/or occupiers of land in the Shire of Carnarvon. Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required, on or before the 31st day of October, 1972 to clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks of not less than ten feet in width of the following positions of the land owned or occupied by you and thereafter maintain the land free of all inflammable material until the 15th day of April, 1973:—

1. Rural Land: (Other than townsite land)
 - (1) Inside and along the whole of the external boundaries of the property or properties owned or occupied by you.
 - (2) Where buildings are situated on the property, additional firebreaks not less than ten feet in width, must be provided within five chains of the perimeter of such buildings in such a manner as to completely encircle the buildings.

2. Townsite Land: In respect of land owned or occupied by you in the townsite of Carnarvon, you are required on or before the 31st day of October, 1972, to remove all inflammable material from the land or to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following and thereafter maintain the land or firebreaks clear of inflammable material until the 15th day of April, 1973.

- (a) Where the area of the land is one half of one acre or less, remove all inflammable material on the land from the whole of the land,
