- I. AMENDMENT TO STATUTE No. 7—MATRICULATION OR ADMISSION TO THE UNIVERSITY.
- 1. Clause 3 is revoked and the following clause substituted:-
 - 3. Persons who have not matriculated may, with the consent of the Professorial Board on the recommendation of the Faculty concerned and on payment of the prescribed fees, if any, be permitted to attend any course of lectures or of practical instruction without undergoing any preliminary test of fitness.

II. AMENDMENT TO STATUTE No. 8—THE FACULTIES.

1. Clause 16A is revoked and the following clause substituted:-

16A. Appeals under Section 16 of the Act

MAIN ROADS DEPARTMENT-ADMINISTRATIVE AND CLERICAL DIVISIONS.

DOG ACT, 1903.

The Municipality of the Shire of Dandaragan.

By-laws Relating to Dogs.

L.G. 600/72.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on the 17th day of August, 1972, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

- 1. In these by-laws the term "Council" shall mean the Dandaragan Shire Council.
- 2. The Council may establish a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903.
- 3. A dog seized by the police or by an officer authorised by the Council may be placed in a pound.
- 4. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound the keeper of the pound or other officer authorised by the Council shall, if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him, forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.
- 5. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog, then, upon payment of the fees specified in the schedule hereto together with the prescribed license fee relating to that dog, the dog shall be released to such person.
- 6. The poundkeeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.
- 7. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of the poundkeeper or other officer authorised by the Council the ownership of the dog or his authority to take delivery of it. The poundkeeper or officer may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Council in respect of the delivery of a dog in good faith.
- 8. If a dog should not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of its being seized, or if the dog having collar around its neck with a registration label for the current year affixed thereto shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of the service of a notice upon the registered owner, the poundkeeper or other officer authorised by the Council may sell the dog.
- 9. Upon the sale of a dog, the proceeds of sale shall be the property of the Council and may be disposed of in such a manner as the Council thinks fit. The owner of the dog pursuant to these by-laws shall have no claim against the Council in respect of the proceeds thereof.
- 10. If within the times mentioned in by-law 8 hereof or at any time before the destruction of a dog, the dog has not been claimed as aforesaid, and the said fees paid, and if no offer has been received for its purchase, the dog may be destroyed.
- 11. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, but subject to the provisions of section 19 of the Dog Act, 1903, any dog seized or impounded may at any time be destroyed upon the authority of the Shire Clerk of the Council if in the opinion of the Shire Clerk the dog is too savage or noisy to be kept or is suffering from an injury, disease or sickness.

- 12. If the Council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner, whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not, the owner shall pay to the Council the fee specified in the schedule hereto, which sum shall be recoverable in a court of petty sessions.
 - 13. No person shall-
 - (a) unless a poundkeeper or other officer of the Council duly authorised in that regard, release or attempt to release a dog from the pound;
 - (b) destroy, break into, damage or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any pound;
 - (c) destroy, break into, damage or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any dog cart, vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching, holding or conveying dogs which have been seized.
- 14. The owner of a dog shall keep or cause to be kept such dog chained or under effective control from sunset to sunrise.
- 15. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—
 - (a) A public building.
 - (b) A theatre or picture gardens.
 - (c) A house of worship.
 - (d) A shop or other public business premises.
- 16. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—
 - (a) A sports ground.
 - (b) An area set aside for public recreation.
 - (c) A car park.
 - (d) A school,
 - (e) Any land vested or under the control of the Council.
 - (f) Any road within the townsites of Dandaragan, Badgingarra, Jurien and Cervantes.
- 17. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee of the Council or member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903, or the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions.
- 18. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of it of liability to a penalty under any of these by-laws.
- 19. Any person who shall commit a breach of these by-laws shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$10, provided that for a breach of clause 14 the penalty shall not exceed \$20.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 12th day of July 1972, to repeal—

- (a) General By-laws as published in the Government Gazette on the 11th day of October 1907,
- (b) Halls By-laws as published in the Government Gazette on the 6th day of March, 1925,
- (c) Poundage Fees By-laws as published in the Government Gazette on the 26th day of February, 1926,
- (d) Heavy Traffic By-laws as published in the Government Gazette on the 2nd day of July, 1926,
- (e) Heavy Traffic By-laws as published in the Government Gazette on the 24th day of June, 1927,
- (f) Dogs By-laws as published in the Government Gazette on the 13th day of December, 1929,
- (g) Hawkers By-laws as published in the Government Gazette on the 23rd day of January, 1931,
- (h) Hawkers By-laws (Amendment) as published in the Government Gazette on the 4th day of October, 1935,
- (i) Appointment of Employees By-laws as published in the Government Gazette on the 7th day of November, 1941,
- (j) Halls By-laws as published in the Government Gazette on the 1st day of August, 1952,
- (k) Halls By-laws (Amendment) as published in the Government Gazette on the 12th day of February, 1960,
- (1) Long Service Leave By-laws as published in the Government Gazette on the 4th day of January, 1952,

and to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws in lieu thereof.

By-laws.

Meetings and Procedures.

- 1. In the interpretation of these by-laws, the following words shall have the meaning assigned to them hereunder:—
 - (a) "Act" means the Local Government Act, 1960-1971;
 - (b) "Council" means the Williams Shire Council;
 - (c) "President" means the chief elective executive officer of the Council;
 - (d) "Member" means a person elected as a Councillor;
 - (e) "Clerk" means the Shire Clerk of the Council.
- 2. Meetings of the Council shall be of two kinds, "ordinary" and "special". Ordinary meetings shall be those held regularly in pursuance of these by-laws for the transaction of the General Business of the Council, including adjourned meetings, at which incompleted business shall be completed, together with other business considered necessary.
- 3. Special meetings of the Council are those called for specific purposes under section 172 of the Act, and notices of such special meetings shall have such special business specified therein, and nothing shall be discussed at any special meeting other than the special business set out in the notice of the meeting.
- 4. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the offices of the Council, or at some other convenient place, at 9.30 a.m. on the second Wednesday of each month or on such a day or at such a time as may be appointed from time to time by the resolution of the Council, passed at the previous ordinary meeting of the Council.
- 5. When there is not a quorum present, such circumstance, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the Minute book.
- 6. The Minute book prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business resolved by the Council at meetings shall be entered by the Clerk, provided that pasting or permanently affixing the minutes of the meeting of the Council to the leaves of a book shall be the equivalent on an entry therein. Minutes of both ordinary and special meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting of the Council.
- 7. The Common Seal of the Council shall be kept in the Council's strongroom. It shall not be used except by Council resolution.

Standing Orders.

- 8. The order of business at all ordinary meetings of the Council shall be as follows:—
 - (a) The confirmation of the minutes of the last ordinary meeting also any special meetings as circulated to members of the Council. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of the proceedings except as to their accuracy or for rectification of a clerical error.

- (b) Consideration of business arising out of the minutes.
- (c) Adoption of monthly financial statements as prescribed by the Local Government Act Accounting Directions.
- (d) Presentation and passing of accounts for payment.
- (e) Reports;
 - 1. The President shall have the right of directing attention at any meeting to any matter or subject within the jurisdiction or official cognisance of the Council. He shall also report to the Council on any functions he has attended as representative of the Council.
 - 2. Clerk. The Clerk shall report on all matters which his duties require him to bring before the Council, matters of information which require Council attention, works carried out during the previous month, and other matters requested by the Council.
 - 3. Other Committees: As required by the Council.
- (f) Questions on which notice of motion has been given in accordance with the Act.
- (g) Business arising from General correspondence, as such correspondence is read by the Clerk.
- (h) Business arising from Health Correspondence.
- Business arising from correspondence pertaining to Vermin and Noxious Weeds control.
- (j) Business arising from tabled correspondence.
- (k) General Business
- 9. The foregoing Standing Orders may be suspended by resolution of the Council for the reception of deputations or visitors to the meeting, but shall be resumed after the withdrawal of the deputation or visitors from the meeting.
- 10. Deputations. For a deputation to be received at a Council meeting, seven days' prior notice must be given to the Clerk. In an emergency, the President may ask the Council to receive a deputation immediately, and the Council will, by resolution, agree or disagree.
 - (a) Deputations will be under the control of the President and shall speak only upon the subject matter upon which the Council agreed to receive such deputation. Council members may ask questions, but no discussion involving Council policy will take place in the presence of the deputation.
 - (b) Upon the deputation retiring, the Council will proceed immediately to discuss the matter presented, and instruct the Clerk as to what Council decision is to be forwarded to the deputation.
- 11. All correspondence to the Council shall be addressed to the Clerk, and submitted to the Council if requiring a Council resolution. No letter addressed to the Council shall be submitted by a member.

12. Committees.

- (a) If, in a report of a committee, distinct recommendations are made, the decision of the Council may be taken separately on each recommendation.
- (b) Any report of a committee or any portion of such a report may be amended by the Council in any manner it may think fit, or may be referred back to the committee for further consideration.
- (c) The recommendation of any committee, when adopted by the Council, shall become the resolution of the Council.
- 13. When the President rises in his place during the progress of a debate, any member then speaking or offering to speak shall immediately resume his seat and every member shall preserve strict silence so that the President may be heard without interruption, but the member who was speaking many resume when the President takes his seat.
 - 14. A member, when speaking, shall not digress from the subject of debate.
- 15. In the absence of any member who has placed a notice of motion on the business paper for a meeting, any other member may, at such meeting, move the same, or such motion may be deferred until the next ordinary meeting of the Council.
- 16. Council resolutions may be determined by the President in either of the following methods:—
 - (a) Undebated Resolutions. Where a resolution is proposed by a member and there appears to be no dissentient, the President may put such a motion, and if there is no member against the motion, he shall declare it carried.
 - (b) Debated Resolutions. Where a resolution is proposed by a member and there appears to be a dissentient, the President shall require the motion to be seconded, and when the motion has been proposed and seconded it shall become subject to the control of the Council.
- 17. Where a motion has been proposed and seconded any member shall be at liberty to move an amendment thereon, but no such amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded. After an amendment has been moved and seconded, any member desirous of moving a further amendment may give notice of his intention to do so and may briefly state his proposed amendment and the effect thereof.
- 18. No motion or amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been reduced to writing, if the President so directs.

- 19. A motion or an amendment before the Council shall be debated by members speaking in rotation in the affirmative or negative, and no member, except as provided in these by-laws, may speak twice on any motion or amendment.
- 20. In submitting a motion or amendment the President shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.
- 21. If an amendment has been carried, the question as amended shall itself become the question before the Council, whereupon any further amendments upon such question may be moved.
- 22. If an amendment, whether upon an original question or amended as aforesaid has been negated, then a further amendment may be moved to the question to which such firstmentioned amendment was moved, and so on until there are no further amendments, and the question is then decided by the final vote in the affirmative or negative; provided that no more than one motion or one proposed amendment thereof shall be before the Council at any one time.
- 23. No discussion shall be permitted upon any motion for the adjournment of the Council. If, upon the question being put on any such motion, the same is negated, the subject then under consideration or the next on the business paper shall be discussed and it shall not be competent for any member to again move for an adjournment until half an hour has elapsed from the time of moving the one that has been negated.
- 24. On resuming any discussion that has been adjourned, the mover of such adjournment shall be entitled, if he has not already spoken on the subject under discussion, to speak first.
 - 25. Every such question shall be put categorically and without argument.
- 26. No discussion shall be permitted respecting any reply or refusal to reply to any question.
- 27. Members shall on all occasions when at a meeting address the President and the Clerk and members by their official designations, such as President, Clerk or Councillor as the case may be.
- 28. The mover of an original motion shall have the right of general reply to all observations which have been made in reference to such motion or to any amendments moved thereon as well as the right to speak upon every such amendment.
- 29. At meetings of the Council, except where he is prohibited from voting by the Act, a Councillor present in his seat when the question is put shall vote on the question openly and not by secret ballot. Where a member discloses an interest in a matter in accordance with the Act, the Clerk shall record particulars of the disclosures made.
- 30. The result of voting openly is determined on the voices, unless a member of the Council calls for a show of hands, in which case the result is determined on the count of raised hands, and upon a vote on the voices or on a show of hands being taken a Councillor may call for a division. Where a member dissents he may request that his name be recorded in the minutes as opposed to the motion, and it shall be so recorded.
- 31. The division shall thereupon be taken by those voting in the affirmative passing to the right of the chair and those voting in the negative to the left of the chair. The names of the members who voted on the question on which there is a division shall be recorded by the Clerk.
- 32. The President shall be at liberty to put any question as often as may be necessary to enable him to form his opinion as to the result of the voting and declare the same.

Damage to Council Property.

- 33. No person shall make or leave a fire near any road or track or reserve under the jurisdiction of the Council without taking proper precaution against such a fire spreading.
- 34. No person shall set fire to any standing tree upon or near any road or track without the permission of the Council.
- 35. No person shall light a fire, or place any rushes, bushes or other inflammable substance under, near or against any bridge or culvert in the District.
- 36. No person, without having first obtained the permission of the Council shall break up, cut down, damage or destroy any footpath, gutter, drain, culvert, bridge, road, public way, tree, plant, gate, post, lantern, lamp post, implement, material, building or other property under the control of, or owned by, the Council.
- 37. No person shall carelessly, wilfully or wantonly, injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place, any tree, scrub or plant, standing in any of the roads, enclosures, public places, of or belonging to, or under the control of the Council, or shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place, or ride or drive against any tree guards, fences or other protection to any such trees, scrub or plants as aforesaid.

Depasturing of Cattle.

- 38. No person shall turn loose or suffer any kind of animal belonging to him or under his control, to stray or go about or be tethered or depastured in or upon any road, recreation ground or reserve.
- 39. Any person owning or in control of any animal found wandering at large on any road, recreation ground or reserve, shall, upon the direction of any Council officer or a member of the Police force, remove such animal immediately.

Sand, Timber, Gravel, etc.

40. No person shall remove any timber, sand, gravel, soil, or other material from any land belonging to or in the charge of or under the control of the Council, without written permission of the Council; any person contravening this by-law shall, upon conviction, be liable to pay to the Council the value of the materials removed, in addition to the penalty imposed.

Blasting.

41. No person shall blast any rock, stone or timber, or use explosives for other purposes, in or near any roadway, street or townsite, without obtaining the permission of the Council, and attending to such directions in regard thereto given in conjunction with such permission, or subsequently given by the Clerk.

Fencing.

- 42. The Council may require the owner of land within any townsite or prescribed area within the District to fence the boundary thereof abutting on any road, right of way, or footpath. No fence containing bush posts, barbed wire, or fowl netting will be permitted.
- 43. The Council may require the owner of land within any townsite or prescribed area within the District to carry out repairs as prescribed on any fence abutting any road, right of way, or footpath.

Removal of Encroachments, Obstruction, and Undergrowth.

44. The Council may direct the removal within thirty five days of any building, fence, or other obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, road, lane, or public place under the control of the Council. In any case of failure to comply with such direction, it shall be lawful for an officer appointed by the Council to remove same at cost of the person so offending, and to proceed against the offender for a breach of this by-law.

Street Stalls, Collections, etc.

45. No person or body of persons shall conduct a street stall, collection, sale or exhibition, without the permission of the Clerk, who shall report his approval at the next ordinary meeting of the Council. The Council may, from time to time, direct the Clerk to withhold permission for any subsequent street stalls, collections, sales or exhibitions.

Appointment of Employees.

- 46. The Clerk is hereby authorised, acting for and on behalf of the Council to employ any casual or weekly servant required by the Council in connection with any works, but shall report the fact of the employment of any such servant to the Council at its next meeting following such employment, and the Council shall be deemed to have ratified the employment of any such servant, and such employment may be continued unless at such meeting the Council by resolution directs that the employment of the servant shall be discontinued.
- 47. The authority given by this by-law shall be supplementary to and shall not derogate from the power of the President of the Council under Section 186 of the Act.

Management and Use of Reserves.

- 48. These by-laws shall apply to all public reserves, parklands, gardens and recreation grounds under the management or control of the Council, hereinafter called the reserves.
- 49. Under such conditions and stipulations as shall be determined by the Council, and upon payment of such fees as determined by the Council from time to time, the Council may grant to any person, or association of persons, the exclusive right to use and occupy any reserve or portion of a reserve for the purpose of conducting thereon any games, sports, racing, trotting, amusements or entertainments, but the public shall have the right to enter upon such reserves or portion thereof on payment to the person or association of persons so using and occupying as aforesaid, such sum as such person or association of persons shall have determined as to be payable for admission to such reserve or portion thereof.
- 50. No person except the officer or servants of the Council acting in the discharge of their duty, or unless authorised by the person or association of persons to whom an exclusive right has been granted under by-law 49 of these bylaws, shall enter a reserve on such days as may be set aside for games, sports, racing, trotting, amusements or entertainments, except through the proper entrance for such purpose and upon payment of such fees chargeable for admission at the time, but on such days as are not set apart as aforesaid, the reserves shall be open to the public, free of charge.

- 51. No person shall bring or take any horse onto the reserves for the purpose of exercising or training such horse without first having obtained from the Council a training or exercising permit, nor train or exercise such horse contrary to any restrictions, conditions, or stipulation that such permit may impose on the holder thereof.
- 52. No person shall damage or interfere with any property placed or used in or belonging to the reserves, nor break, pull up, damage or injure any tree scrub or plant, nor commit any nuisance in any reserve, nor stand on or climb or jump over the seats, trees or fences, or leave on any reserve any bottles, cans, paper, cast off clothing or any litter or rubbish of any kind.
- 53. No person, unless authorised by the Council, shall bring into any reserve any horse, cow or other animal for the purpose of depasturing the reserve.
- 54. With the exception of any Caravan Park properly constructed for the purpose, no person shall camp, lodge or tarry overnight, or frequent a reserve for the purpose of camping or lodging on any reserve, unless authorised by the Council.
- 55. No person shall drive any vehicle in or through any reserve except on such portions as are reserved or set apart for such a purpose, and then at a speed not exceeding five miles per hour.
- 56. No person except the officers or servants of the Council acting in the discharge of their duty, shall light any fire within a reserve without the written consent of the Council, except in such places as are provided on the reserves for such a purpose.
- 57. The Council may, upon application, grant to any sporting club or other responsible association of persons, a permit authorising the serving and consumption of intoxicating liquor at any properly organised social gathering under the control of such club or association, subject to such conditions and restrictions as the Council may see fit to impose.
- 58. Any person behaving in a reserve in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance or using any profane, indecent or obscene language or committing any act of indecency or misconducting himself or committing any breach of these by-laws, may be removed forthwith from the reserve by any officer, servant, or member of the Council, or officer of the Police Force, or any member of the committee of any club or association or other authorised body having the right to use and occupy the reserve at the time, without affecting such person's liability to prosecution for an offence against these by-laws.
- 59. Any person who obtains keys to unlock any locked buildings on reserves shall return the same to the Council office, or to a servant of the Council as soon as possible after use.

Damage or Injury to Roads by Water.

60. Whenever it appears to the Council that through the construction of a dam on lands adjacent to a road, such a construction is likely to cause damage or injury to a road, the Council may serve notice requiring the owner or occupier of the dam to lower the level of the spillway to coincide with the lowest tabledrain level of the adjoining roadway, and to refrain from doing any act to prevent the free flow of water from the lowered spillway. If the owner or occupier of the land on which the dam is situate fails or neglects to comply with the order within thirty-five days, the Council may effect the required work, and recover the costs thereof in a Court of competent jurisdiction.

Long Service Leave.

- 61. In the interpretation of these by-laws, the following words shall have the meaning assigned to them hereunder,— $\,$
 - (a) "Council" means the Williams Shire Council.
 - (b) "Continuous Service" means service in the employment of the Council during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Council for a continuous period of more than ten days, without leave of absence being granted by the Council. For the purpose of this clause, service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—
 - (1) the taking of any annual leave or long service leave,
 - (2) any period of absence on account of illness or injury,
 - (3) any interruption occasioned by services in the Armed Forces of the Crown through conscription.
- 62. All employees of the Council, shall, after a period of ten years continuous service as permanent full time employees thereof, commencing from the first day of January, 1946, be entitled to three months long service leave. Long service leave is to be taken at the convenience of the Council, which will, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Council may require the employee to take his leave by giving not less than three months notice.

Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary or wage paid in the week immediately preceeding the taking of long service leave. The Council may, at its discretion either—

- (i) pay to an employee his salary or wages periodically during long service leave or.
- (ii) pay to an employee in advance the sum representing the amount of his salary or wages for the period of his long service leave.

- 63. Employees shall not be entitled to long service leave until the completion of ten years continuous service. After the completion of the first ten years, employees will be entitled to a *pro rata* payment if they leave the service of the Council before the next period is completed.
- 64. In the event of resignation retirement or death of an employee, the Council may pay to such employee (or in the case of death to his personal representative), a sum of money equal to his salary or wages for the period of long service leave which the Council was empowered under these by-laws to grant to such employee at the date of his resignation retirement or death, or if the Council after consideration of all the circumstances, directs that the death of an employee may be presumed the Council may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of salary or wages which would under this by-law have been granted to the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the
- 65. An employee dimissed by the Council, except in the matter of retrenchment, shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.
- 66. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward unless by special permission of the Council. Any contravention of this by-law shall entitle the Council to dismiss the employee from its service, and to cease paying, or recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

Footpath Crossings.

- 67. No person shall construct a vehicle crossing place over any made footpath without first obtaining a permit from the Council.
- 68. Such a permit shall be issued by the Council provided that the depth of the material and method of construction shall be to the satisfaction of the Council and capable of carrying the heaviest vehicle likely to use the crossing.

Pipelines under roads and Footpaths.

- 69. No person shall put a water pipe or other service pipe or conduit under any road or footpath without a permit from the Council.
- 70. Any damage done shall be made good by the applicant, or by the Council at the applicants expense.
- 71. The Council may require, in the permit, an outer or larger pipe or covering through which such water pipe or conduit may be withdrawn for repairs or replacement without any further damage to the road or pavement.

Verandahs.

72. No person shall construct a verandah over the footpath of any street in the townsite of Williams, unless it be of a cantilever type with no supporting verandah posts.

Prevention of Damage by Implements.

73. No person shall drive, draw impel, or cause to be driven, drawn or impelled on or across any road within the Shire of Williams, any agricultural implement or machinery, in such a manner that any part other than the wheels (if not of a fianged type), shall touch the ground. Penalty \$40.00. The owner of any agricultural implements or machinery driven, drawn or impelled on or across any road, and also the driver or person having the control of such agricultural implement or machinery, shall be liable to pay to the Council the cost of repairing any damage caused to any road by the use of such implements or machinery.

Hall and Sports Pavilion Control and Management.

- 74. In these by-laws, subject to the context-
 - (a) "Buildings" means and includes all parts of the Williams Memorial hall situated on Lot 49, Williams Townsite, Agricultural Hall, situated on Lot 9 Williams Townsite, and Sports Pavilion and minor buildings situated on Location 13311 Williams.
 - (b) "Building grounds" means Town Lots 49, 9, and Williams Location 13311.
 - (c) "Caretaker" means the caretaker of buildings duly appointed by the Council.
- 75. Application for the hire of buildings or any part thereof shall be made to the Council not less than 48 hours before the actual time required, except in such circumstances as are set out in by-law 76. The application shall state the time and purpose for which the buildings are required. The person making such application shall be the official hirer, and as such shall be responsible for the requirements of these by-laws.
- 76. The Council may, from time to time, let such of the buildings as it considers appropriate to any local organisation on a season term basis, and the Secretary of the local organisation for the time being shall be deemed to be the hirer for the purposes of these by-laws.
- 77. The fees and hire charges for the buildings and for the consumption of alcoholic liquor therein shall be as determined by the Council from time to time.
- 78. In the case of persons not resident in the District hire fees shall be paid on application for the booking.
- 79. The Council may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, pay the required fees, and this amount shall be forfeited to the Council if the booking is cancelled.

- 80. The hours for which hire may be effected at daytime rates shall be from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Night time hire may be effected from 7 p.m. until 3 a.m.
- 81. If in the opinion of the Council exceptional cleaning is involved after the hiring of any of the buildings, the Council may require the hirer to pay the costs incurred by such cleaning.
- 82. The Council reserves the right to refuse to let the buildings or part thereof to any applicant without assigning any reason for such refusal.
- 83. The Council may from time to time cancel any arrangement for hiring of the buildings or any portion thereof, in which case any charge or deposit received shall be returned forthwith.
- 84. In the event of two or more applications for hire being received through the mail on the same day and date, the Council shall determine which applicant shall receive the booking. Applications received at the counter shall be granted in strict order as received.
- 85. The hirer of the buildings or any part thereof shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act and the by-laws for the control and management of such buildings, and any other Act in force applicable to such hiring. If in the opinion of the Council, the Clerk or the Caretaker, all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts and by-laws mentioned above, the Council or the Clerk may cancel the hirers term of engagement and prevent the use or continued use of the building.
- 86. In the event of the use of the building or any portion thereof being forbidden or prevented under the last preceding by-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payble for the hire as if the hire had been duly fulfilled, and the Council shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.
- 87. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale, beer or spirits, or any other intoxicating liquor shall be brought into or consumed in the buildings or any part thereof, or on the building grounds, except by special Council permit in writing.
- 88. The hirer of the buildings or any part thereof shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour within the buildings and grounds, and shall be responsible for any damage done to the buildings, fixtures, fittings, furniture, crockeryware, etc., and shall pay for any damages which may occur during the term of hiring as may be assessed by the Council.
- 89. No person shall in the buildings or grounds be guilty of any misbe-haviour.
- 90. The Clerk, caretaker, or any police officer shall be permitted to have free ingress to the buildings or building grounds at all times during the terms of engagement, and shall be given every facility for seeing that these by-laws are duly carried out.
- 91. No person shall erect any internal or external decorations, place any nails or screws in the woodwork, walls, or any part of the buildings, and no advertising matter shall be attached to any wall or fitting without express permission of the Council.
- 92. The hirer of the buildings or building grounds shall be responsible for the unlocking of doors and windows and for the subsequent locking of the same. Similar conditions apply to the use of electric current and water supplies.
- 93. The hirer shall use only that portion of the building or building ground which has been hired to him and shall not use or allow to be used any other part thereof.
- 94. The Council may from time to time direct the erection of regulatory signposting for the parking of vehicles on the building grounds, and no person shall park any vehicle in an area not designated for parking.
- 95. The hirer or persons using the buildings or building grounds shall obey any reasonable request made upon him or them by the Shire Clerk or Caretaker for proper use and control of the buildings or building grounds.

Penalty.

- 96. Any person offending against any of the provisions of these by-laws, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$60.00.
- 97. Section 263 of the Local Government Act shall apply to all by-laws, that is to say: Nothing in any by-law shall relieve any person from any penalty punishments, or action done by him in breach of any by-law made under this Act: and the Council may sue any person for any damage done to any road, public place, building structure, appliance, apparatus or thing, in addition to recovering the amount of any breach of any by-law.

MARKETING OF LAMB ACT, 1971.

Department of Agriculture, South Perth, 14th November, 1972.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting pursuant to the provisions of section 31 of the Marketing of Lamb Act, 1971, has been pleased to make the regulations set forth in the schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

MARKETING OF LAMB ACT REGULATIONS, 1972.

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Marketing of Lamb Act Regulations, 1972.
 - (2) In these regulations-
 - "approved" means approved by the Board;
 - "inspector" means an inspector appointed under these regulations;
 - "lamb" includes a sheep delivered to and accepted by the Board as a lamb but which after slaughter is identified as not being in the category of lamb;
 - "proprietor" means the person having the management or control of lands or premises used for or in connection with the slaughtering of lambs or the treatment, storage or chilling of lamb products;
 - "representative" means a person acting as agent for the Board under section 15 of the Act whose appointment as such for the time being has been notified in the *Gazette*;
 - "the Act" means the Marketing of Lamb Act, 1971;
 - "the Board" means the Western Australian Lamb Marketing Board.
 - 2. It is hereby declared that section 19 of the Act does not apply-
 - (a) where a lamb is delivered for slaughter at a place north of the 26th parallel of south latitude; or
 - (b) where a lamb is slaughtered in an abattoir situate south of the 26th parallel if—
 - (i) the lamb was delivered to the Board and acquired by the Board before being purchased live for slaughter in that abattoir;
 - (ii) the information required by these regulations is furnished to the Board in relation to that abattoir; and
 - (iii) that abattoir is classified by the Board as an abattoir killing less than one hundred lambs in any week.
 - 3. The Board may, by notice in the Gazette—
 - (a) specify the general areas of duties and the names of the persons and associations who have agreed to act as agents of the Board;
 - (b) specify in relation to any abattoir the class assigned to it by the Board for the purpose of these regulations.

- 4. At all abattoirs the proprietor shall cause all carcasses to be mouthed in the presence of an inspector as soon as practicable after slaughter to determine whether or not, the carcass is within the category of lamb.
- 5. (1) All export abattoirs, and all non-export abattoirs classified by the Board as killing more than one hundred lambs in any week, shall classify or grade all lamb and edible lamb products obtained from lambs slaughtered by or on behalf of that abattoir in accordance with the conditions and restrictions applicable to the kinds of meat as specified in items 34 to 41 of the Third Schedule to the Exports (Meat) Regulations in force under the Customs Act, 1901 and the Commerce (Trade Descriptions) Act, 1905 of the Commonwealth.
- (2) The provisions of subregulation (1) of this regulation do not apply to lamb products in the form of offal obtained from lambs slaughtered by or on behalf of a non-export abattoir in accordance with the prior written approval of the Board.
- (3) At an abattoir of the kind referred to in subregulation (1) of this regulation the proprietor shall mark all lamb to be sold for consumption in the State with a marking device consisting of the design—

W.A. LAMB

together with a numeral authorised by the Board for the use of the proprietor at the place of marking, and the marking shall be effected by so applying the device using an approved ink or stain as to produce a continuous series of identifying designs on each outer side of the carcass from the neck to the rump.

- (4) At an abattoir classified by the Board as killing less than one hundred lambs in any week the proprietor shall mark the lambs slaughtered in the manner from time to time required by the Marking of Lamb and Hogget Act, 1967.
 - 6. (1) The Board may appoint inspectors for the purposes of the Act.
- (2) A person appointed to be an inspector shall be furnished with a certificate evidencing his appointment and shall produce the certificate whenever required so to do by any person in respect of whom he has exercised or is about to exercise any of his powers under the Act.
 - (3) An inspector has power to-
 - (a) enter and search any building, premises or place which he has reasonable grounds for believing is used for, or in connection with, the slaughtering, processing, storage or sale of lamb or lamb products;
 - (b) enter and search any vehicle or other conveyance which he has reasonable cause for believing is used for, or in connection with, the transportation of lamb or lamb products in the course of trade, sale or delivery and for that purpose may detain any such conveyance;
 - (c) require the production of, and to inspect, accounts, invoices, receipts, returns and other documents relating to lamb or lamb products, at abattoirs and elsewhere:
 - (d) organise, supervise or carry out the mouthing of lamb and the identification, classification, grading, weighing, recording, marking and tagging of lamb and lamb products;
 - (e) organise, supervise or carry out training schemes, grading procedures, processing programmes, evaluation procedures, and the drying, packing, transportation and sale of skins.
- (4) An inspector may be appointed either generally, or for one or more specific purposes or in relation to one or more specific places.
 - 7. (1) Every consignment of lambs to the Board shall be accompanied by-
 - (a) an acceptance form completed and signed by the representative authorising the delivery; and
 - (b) a statement of liens and other interests completed and signed by the producer pursuant to subsection (2) of section 17 of the Act.
- (2) Within twenty-four hours of the receipt of any lambs at an abattoir the proprietor shall complete an approved stock arrival form in respect of the consignment and send copies of it to—
 - (a) the representative authorising the delivery of the consignment;
 - (b) the Board's skin valuers;
 - (c) the carrier of the lambs; and
 - (d) the Board.
- (3) A killing return in the approved form shall be completed on a daily basis by the proprietor in relation to all lambs slaughtered and shall be furnished by him to the Board and to such other persons as the Board may direct.
- (4) Unless the Board otherwise requires, a representative shall complete and furnish to the Board weekly reconciliation statements, and copies of all account sales to the producer, invoices sent, and receipts given with respect to moneys collected on behalf of the Board in such manner and at such times as the Board may direct.
 - A person who—
 - (a) fails to comply with any of the requirements of these regulations within the time or in the manner thereby specified; or
- (b) contravenes any provision of these regulations, commits an offence.

Penalty: One hundred dollars.
