At a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 10th day of January, 1973, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Milk Act, 1946-1971. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Metropolitan Dairy Area was constituted and declared by Order in Council dated the 18th June, 1969, and published in the Government Gazette on the 27th June, 1969; and whereas that dairy area was, by Order in Council dated the 26th August, 1970, and published in the Government Gazette on the 28th August, 1970, divided into the districts specified in the schedule to that last mentioned Order in Council with the boundaries respectively defined in that Schedule; and whereas the districts so specified included Bayswater Districts Nos. 41 and 42, Canning Districts Nos. 147 and 150, Inglewood District No. 30 and Osborne Park Districts Nos. 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 13, 21, 22, 23 and 24 with their boundaries respectively so defined; and whereas Osborne Park Districts Nos. 22 and 23 as so specified and defined were altered by Order in Council made on the 24th April, 1972, and published in the Government Gazette on the 5th May, 1972; and whereas it is provided inter alia, by subsection (1) of section 9 of the Milk Act, 1946-1971, that the Governor may from time to time on the recommendation of the Minister by Order in Council alter the boundaries of a district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by that section, doth hereby alter the boundaries of—

- (a) Canning Districts Nos. 147 and 150 by substituting for the areas of land comprising those districts as defined in the Schedule to the Order in Council made on the 26th August, 1970 and published in the Government Gazette on the 28th August, 1970, the areas of land defined and described respectively in Schedule "A" to this Order in Council;
- (b) Osborne Park Districts-
 - (i) Nos. 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 13, 21 and 24 by substituting for the areas of land comprising those districts as defined in the Schedule to the Order in Council made on the 26th August, 1970 and published in the Government Gazette on the 28th August, 1970.

(ii) Nos. 22 and 23 by substituting for the areas of land comprising those districts as defined in the Schedule to the Order in Council made on the 26th August, 1970 and published in the Government Gazette on the 28th August, 1970 as altered by Order in Council made on the 24th April, 1972 and published in the Government Gazette on the 5th May, 1972.

the areas of land defined and described respectively in Schedule "B" to this Order in Council;

- (c) Inglewood District No. 30 by substituting for the area of land comprising that district as defined in the Schedule to the Order in Council made on the 26th August, 1970 and published in the Government Gazette on the 28th August, 1970, the area of land defined and described respectively in Schedule "C" to this Order in Council; and
- (d) Bayswater Districts Nos. 41 and 42 by substituting for the areas of land respectively comprising those districts as defined in the Schedule to the Order in Council made on the 26th August, 1970 and published in the Government Gazette on the 28th August, 1970, the areas of land defined and described respectively in Schedule "D" to this Order in Council.

Schedule A.

Canning District No. 147.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the prolongation westerly of the centre line of Keith Road with the centre line of Leach Highway and extending northeasterly along the lastmentioned centre line to the prolongation westerly of the centre line of High Road; thence easterly to and along that centre line to the centre line of Riley Road; thence generally southely along that centre line to the centre line of Collins Road; thence westerly, northwesterly, again westerly and again northwesterly along that centre line to the prolongation northeasterly of the centre line of Brolga Promenade;

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the prolongation southerly of the centre line of Karel Avenue with the prolongation westerly of the centre line of Ibis Place and extending easterly to and generally easterly along the lastmentinoned centre line and onwards to the centre line of Brolga Promenade; thence generally southerly and generally easterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Collins Road; thence southeasterly, easterly, again southeasterly and again easterly along that centre line of Beasley Road; thence southwesterly to and generally southwesterly along that centre line of Beasley Road; thence southwesterly to and generally southwesterly along that centre line of Road Number 441; thence westerly to and generally westerly along that centre line to the prolongation southerly of the centre line of Karel Avenue aforesaid and thence northerly along that prolongation to the starting point.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre line of Wanneroo Road with the prolongation southwesterly of the centre line of the western section of Camberwell Road and extending northeasterly to and generally easterly along the last mentioned centre line and onwards to the centre line of Princess Road; thence northeasterly along that centre line to the prolongation northwesterly of the centre line of Balga Avenue; thence southeasterly to and generally southeasterly along that centre line to the prolongation southwesterly of the centre line of Finchley Crescent; thence northeasterly to and generally northeasterly along that centre line to the prolongation westerly of the centre line of Heathcroft Road; thence easterly to and along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of the northern section of Mirrabooka Avenue; thence southerly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of the Northern Perimeter Controlled Access; thence generally westerly along that centre line to the prolongation southerly of the centre line of Loxwood Road; thence northerly to and along that centre line to the prolongation easterly of the centre line of Loxwood Road; of Fernhurst Crescent; thence westerly to and

generally westerly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Walderton Avenue; thence southwesterly along that centre line to the prolongation southeasterly of the centre line of Aldwick Place; thence northwesterly to and along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Chilgrove Way; thence southwesterly along that centre line to the prolongation southeasterly of the centre line of Framfield Way; thence northwesterly to and generally northwesterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Selsfield Place; thence generally southwesterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of the Northern Perimeter Controlled Access aforesaid; thence generally northwesterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Wanneroo Road aforesaid and thence generally northwesterly along that centre line to the starting point.

Osborne Park District No. 7.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre line of Wanneroo Road with the prolongation northwesterly of the centre line of the Northern Perimeter Controlled Access and extending southeasterly to and generally southeasterly along the last mentioned centre line to the prolongation southwesterly of the centre line of Selsfield Place; thence northeasterly to and generally northeasterly along that centre line to the prolongation westerly of the centre line of Framfield Way; thence easterly to and generally south-easterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Chilgrove Way; thence northeast-erly along that centre line to the prolongation northwesterly of the centre line of Aldwick Place; thence southeasterly to and along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Walderton Avenue; thence northeasterly along that centre line to the prolongation northwesterly of the centre line of Fernhurst Crescent; thence southeasterly to and generally easterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Loxwood Road; thence southerly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of the Northern Perimeter Controlled Access aforesaid; thence generally easterly along that centre line to the prolongation northerly of the centre line of the southern section of Mirrabooka Avenue; thence southerly to and along that centre line to the prolongation easterly of the centre line of Ravenswood Drive; thence westerly to and westerly and generally southwesterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Wanneroo Road aforesaid and thence generally northwesterly along that centre line to the starting point.

Osborne Park District No. 8.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre line of Wanneroo Road with the prolongation southwesterly of the centre line of Ravenswood Drive and extending northeasterly to and generally northeasterly along that centre line to the prolongation northerly of the centre line of Flinders Street; thence southerly to and generally southerly along that centre line to the centre line of Moriey Drive; thence generally westerly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Wanneroo Road aforesaid and thence generally northwesterly along that centre line to the starting point.

Osborne Park District No. 9.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre line of Wanneroo Road with the prolongation westerly of the centre line of Morley Drive and extending easterly to and generally easterly along the last mentioned centre line to the centre line of Flinders Street; thence southerly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Wiluna Street; thence generally southwesterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Charles Street; thence northwesterly along that centre line and generally northwesterly along the centre line of Wanneroo Road aforesaid to the starting point.

Osborne Park District No. 13.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre line of Main Street with the centre line of Amelia Street and extending westerly along the last mentioned centre line and onwards to the centre line of Odin Road;

thence generally northeasterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Balcatta Road; thence southeasterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Wanneroo Road; thence generally southeasterly along that centre line to a point situate in prolongation northeasterly of the centre line of Main Street aforesaid; and thence southwesterly to and southwesterly and southerly along that centre line to the starting point.

Osborne Park District No. 21.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the prolongation northerly of the centre line of Deanmore Road with the centre line of Jeanes Road and extending generally northeasterly along the last mentioned centre line and onwards to the centre line of Karrinyup Road; thence generally northwesterly along that centre line to the prolongation southwesterly of the centre line of Burroughs Road; thence northeasterly to and generally northeasterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Pascoe Street; thence northeasterly and easterly along that centre line and onwards to and along the centre lines of Porter Street, North Beach Road and Bryan Road and again onwards to the centre line of Odin Road; thence southwesterly along that centre line to the centre line of North Beach Road aforesaid; thence generally westerly along that centre line and the centre line of Killarney Road and onwards to the centre line of Huntriss Road; thence southerly along that centre line to the prolongation easterly of the centre line of Newborough Street; thence westerly to and generally westerly along that centre line to the centre line of Deanmore Road aforesaid and thence northerly along that centre line to the starting point.

Osborne Park District No. 22.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the prolongation easterly of the proposed northern side of Beach Road, as shown on Lands and Surveys Miscellaneous Plan 431, with the centre line of Wanneroo Road and extending generally southerly along the last mentioned centre line to the prolongation southeasterly of the centre line of Balcatta Road; thence northwesterly to and along that centre line to the prolongation northeasterly of the centre line of Odin Road; thence southwesterly to and generally southwestrely along that centre line to the prolongation easterly of the centre line of Bryan Road; thence westerly to and along that centre line and the centre line of North Beach Road and Porter Street to the eastern boundary of Lot 8 of Swan Location At as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 20677; thence westerly to and westerly and southwesterly along the centre line of Pascoe Street to the prolongation southeasterly of the southwestern boundary of Swan Location 462; thence north-westerly to and along that boundary and generally northerly along boundaries of Lot 240 of Location 92, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 9263 sheet 2, and onwards to the centre line of North Beach Road aforesaid; thence generally westerly along that centre line to the prolongation southerly of the centre line of Everingham Street; thence northerly to and northerly and easterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Okely Road; thence northerly along that centre line to the northern side of Beach Road aforesaid and thence generally easterly along that side to the starting point.

Osborne Park District No. 23.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the High Water Mark of the Indian Ocean situate in prolongation westerly of the northern side of Beach Road and extending generally easterly to and along that side to the centre line of Okely Road; thence southerly along that centre line to the prolongation easterly of the centre line of Everingham Street; thence westerly to and westerly and southerly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of North Beach Road; thence generally easterly along that centre line to the prolongation northerly of the northernmost western boundary of Lot 240 of Swan Location 92, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 9263, sheet

2; thence southerly to and generally southerly along boundaries of that lot to the western corner of Location 462; thence south-easterly along the southwestern boundary of that location and onwards to the centre line of Pascoe Street; thence southwesterly along that centre line to the prolongation northerly of the centre line of Burroughs Road; thence southerly to and southerly and southwesterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Karrinyup Road; thence generally southeasterly along that centre line to the prolongation northeasterly of the centre line of Jeanes Road; thence south-westerly to and generally westerly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Elliot Road; thence generally southwesterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Sandringham Street; thence southwesterly to and along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Peet Crescent; thence northwesterly along that centre line to the prolongation northeasterly of the centre line of Fyfe Court; thence southwesterly to and along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Bournemouth Parade; thence south-westerly, generally northwesterly and again southwesterly along that centre line and onwards to the High Water Mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid and thence generally northerly along that mark to the starting point.

NAVIGABLE WATERS REGULATIONS.

Harbour and Light Department, Fremantle, 23rd January, 1973.

ACTING pursuant to the powers conferred by regulation 48A of the Navigable Waters Regulations, the Harbour and Light Department, by this notice:

Defines and sets aside the following area of navigable waters for the purpose of water skiing on Monday, 29th January, 1973, only between the hours of 1.00 p.m. and 5.30 p.m. and orders that bathing shall be prohibited therein:—

Canning River—All the waters of the Canning River south of a line drawn from the Deepwater Point launching ramp eastwards to the Manning foreshore and west of a line drawn between the junction of Fifth Avenue at Rossmoyne and Salters Point, but so that no boat or skier shall approach within 60 metres of the foreshore on the west bank between Queens Road and the junction of Bull Creek or within 60 metres of the southern foreshore at Rossmoyne between the junction of Bull Creek and Fifth Avenue, with the exception of an area 60 metres in width set aside as a take-off area and marked by signs on the foreshore opposite to Jennifer Way, or within 60 metres of the foreshore of Aquinas Bay from the foot Sulman Avenue to a sign on the foreshore on the eastern side of Mount Henry.

The area of water immediately north of Deepwater Point and to Canning Bridge is prohibited to water skiers between the hours of 1.00 p.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Monday, 29th January, 1973 (Australia Day) only, on the occasion of a rowing regatta organised by the Amateur Rowing Association of Western Australia.
