AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 24th day of January, 1973, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1972.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (3) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1972, that an order in council made pursuant to the provisions of that section may from time to time be cancelled; and whereas by Order in Council made on the 6th October, 1972 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 20th October, 1972, the name of the Koolyanobbing Fire District was transferred from Part IV to Part III of the Second Schedule to the Act; and whereas there is an impediment occurring in that Order in Council; and whereas it is deemed expedient to cancel that Order in Council; and whereas it is further enacted by subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1972, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by order in council transfer the name of a fire district from one Part to another Part of the Second Schedule to the Act; and whereas the name of the Koolyanobbing Fire District was included in Part IV of that Schedule by Order in Council dated 26th July, 1972 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th August, 1972; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the name of Koolyanobbing Fire District and the name of the local authority, Shire of Yilgarn, opposite that fire district be transferred from Part IV to Part III of the Second Schedule to the Act: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby—

- (a) cancel the Order in Council made on the 6th October, 1972 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 20th October, 1972;
- (b) transfer the name of the Koolyanobbing Fire District from Part IV to Part III of the Second Schedule to the Act so that it appears in column one immediately under Kalgoorlie-Boulder Fire District; and
- (c) transfer the name of the local authority, Shire of Yilgarn, in column two opposite the Koolyanobbing Fire District from Part IV to Part III of the Second Schedule to the Act so that it appears opposite that fire district.

- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Rights in Water and Irrigation (Construction and Alteration of Wells) Regulations, 1963, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 15th May, 1963 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 10A added. 2. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 10 the following regulation—
- 10A. (1) In this regulation the term "Table" means the Table to this regulation.
- (2) Where on the first day of July in any year a person is the occupier of land—
- (a) that is situated in an area specified in Column 1 of the Table; and
- (b) on which a well that is—
- (i) of a type specified in respect of that area in Column 2 of the Table; and
- (ii) the subject of a license under section 20 of the Act authorising some or all of the water drawn from the well to be used for a purpose specified in respect of that area in Column 3 of the Table,
- is sunk,
- that person shall, on or before the first day of August in that year, pay to the Minister the fee specified in respect of that area in Column 4 of the Table.
- (3) A person is not required to pay more than one fee under subregulation (2) of this regulation in relation to one parcel of land, but if—
- (a) a person is on the first day of July in any year the occupier of two or more separate parcels of land in an area specified in Column 1 of the Table; and
- (b) a well of the description set out in paragraph (b) of subregulation (2) of this regulation is sunk on each of those parcels of land,
- that person is required to pay a fee under that subregulation in relation to each of those parcels of land.
- (4) For the purposes of this regulation where a well is sunk on the bed of a watercourse adjoining a parcel of land and water drawn from that well is used on that parcel of land, that well shall be deemed to be sunk on that parcel of land.

Murray River—That portion of the Murray River commencing at a point 40 metres upstream of the Ravenswood Bridge and extending upstream to a point 450 metres downstream of Murray Bend.

- (2) Revokes sub-paragraph 3 (g) of the notice published in the *Government Gazette* pursuant to the powers conferred by the Navigable Waters Regulations on 14th April, 1972, and substitutes the following:—

All the waters of the Murray River with the exception of that portion commencing at a point 40 metres upstream of the Ravenswood Bridge and extending upstream to a point 450 metres downstream of Murray Bend. Provided that the revocation in respect of this portion of the Murray River shall apply only between the hours of 1.00 p.m. and 5.00 p.m. on Saturday 3rd February, 1973 and between the hours of 9.00 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. on Sunday 4th February, 1973. The 8 knot speed limit will apply to all waters of the Murray River at all other times.

During the conduct of the Water Ski Championships the above section of the Murray River will be closed on occasions to the general boating public, but will be reopened occasionally to permit the passage of vessels.

Schedule.

MAIN ROADS (Control of Advertisements) REGULATIONS, 1973.

Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Main Roads (Control of Advertisements) Regulations, 1973.

Application. 2. (1) These regulations apply in relation to any road—
 (a) which is declared by proclamation to be a main road; or
 (b) which is proclaimed to be a controlled-access road,
 pursuant to the provisions of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1972.
 (2) These regulations do not apply to—
 (a) a sale sign on premises that are not in a residential area;
 (b) a sale sign on premises that are in a residential area if the sign does not exceed four square feet in area;
 (c) a sign indicating the name and the trade or occupation of the occupier of the premises that—
 (i) is affixed to a dwelling or erected or affixed behind the building line if the sign does not exceed four square feet in area;
 (ii) is erected or affixed on the street alignment or between the street alignment and the building line and consists of a plate that does not exceed two square feet in area;
 (d) an advertising sign inside a building which is not an illuminated sign directed primarily towards vehicular traffic.

Interpretation. 3. For the purpose of these regulations—
 (a) the area of a sign shall be ascertained by reference to a notional rectangle enclosing the outermost portions of the sign and in computing the area only that face or faces of the sign which can be seen from any one direction at one time shall be counted;
 (b) "residential area" means an area that has been so designated under a Town Planning Scheme or in Zoning By-laws or any lot used or intended to be used for residential purposes and not exceeding one-half acre in area;
 (c) "sale sign" means an advertisement indicating that the premises whereon it is affixed or erected are for sale or for letting;
 (d) the expressions "building line", "council", "district", "owner", and "street alignment" have the same respective meanings as are given them in and for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1960-1972;
 (e) a person who places, attaches, affixes, or otherwise constructs or maintains any sign, hoarding or other advertising structure is deemed to erect it, and a person who paints, affixes, or otherwise exhibits any advertisement is deemed to display it.

4. The provisions of these regulations are complementary to, and shall not be construed in derogation of, any by-laws made or adopted by a council under the Local Government Act, 1960-1972, which relate to the prohibition, regulation or control of advertisements, signs, hoardings or other advertising structures.

Applications for consent. 5. (1) An application for the consent of the Commissioner to the erection of a sign, hoarding or other advertising structure or to the display of an advertisement shall be made in the first instance through the council in whose district it is to be erected or displayed.

(2) The application shall be made in the manner prescribed by any by-law made by that council which relates to the prohibition, regulation or control of advertisements, signs, hoardings or other advertising structures, or, if no such by-law has been made, then

as though that council had adopted the provisions of the latest draft model by-law relating thereto published in the *Gazette* pursuant to section 258 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1972, but no fee is payable to the Commissioner in respect of any such application.

Design of
signs and
hoardings.

6. The specification, design, and maintenance of any advertisement, sign, hoarding or structure subject to these regulations shall comply with the requirements of the latest draft model by-law published in the *Gazette* pursuant to section 258 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1972, relating to the prohibition, regulation or control of advertisements, signs, hoardings or other advertising structures.

Consent to
be obtained.

7. (1) Subject to the provisions of regulation 13 of these regulations a person who, without the written consent of the Commissioner, erects or displays, or causes or permits to be erected or displayed any advertisement, sign, hoarding or other advertising structure on or in the vicinity of any main road or controlled-access road commits an offence.

(2) The consent of the Commissioner subsists only for such time as is therein specified, and may be given subject to the conditions therein specified.

8. The Commissioner may, at his absolute discretion, refuse his consent to the erection or display of any advertisement, sign, hoarding or other advertising structure on or in the vicinity of any main road or any controlled-access road if, in his opinion, it—

- (a) is, or is likely to be, an obstruction to the vision of persons using that road, or otherwise prejudicial to their safety;
- (b) affects, or would be likely to affect, injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure ground; or
- (c) is objectionable or otherwise undesirable from aesthetic considerations.

Removal or
alteration of
structures
may be
ordered.

9. (1) Where the Commissioner, at his absolute discretion, determines that had an application been made under these regulations for the erection of an existing sign, hoarding or other advertising structure the application would have been refused for any one or more of the reasons referred to in regulation 8, he may by notice in writing—

- (a) direct the removal of that sign, hoarding or structure; or
- (b) direct that it be altered in the manner and within the time specified in that notice.

(2) A notice under this regulation shall be served upon the owner of the sign, hoarding or other structure concerned and upon the owner of the land on which it is situate, or, where the owner is unknown or cannot be found after reasonable inquiry, by affixing a copy to some conspicuous part of the structure.

(3) A person who fails to comply with the provisions of a notice served under this regulation commits an offence.

10. If within the time specified in a notice served under regulation 9 of these regulations the sign, hoarding or other advertising structure is not removed, or is not altered in the manner specified, as the notice may require, the Commissioner may, by his agent duly authorized in writing, enter on the land and any building thereon and may pull down and remove that structure.

Removal of
advertisements.

11. The Commissioner, or his agent duly authorized in writing, may obscure, obliterate or remove without notice any sign, insignia, slogan, wording or other advertisement on or in the vicinity of any main road or controlled access road which in the opinion of the Commissioner constitutes a traffic hazard or is aesthetically objectionable.

Recovery
and
expenses.

12. (1) The Commissioner may, without incurring any liability therefor, dispose of anything lawfully removed under these regulations in such manner as he thinks fit.

(2) Where any materials are disposed of by way of sale the Commissioner shall apply the proceeds of sale in re-imbursing the expense of the enforcement of these regulations and in the payment of any fee or penalty due from the owner.

(3) The Commissioner may recover, in any court of competent jurisdiction, the expense of the enforcement of these regulations from the owner of the sign or other person responsible.

13. Subject to the provisions of regulation 9 and regulation 11 of these regulations it shall not be necessary for any person to make an application for the consent of the Commissioner under these regulations in relation to any advertisement, sign, hoarding or other advertising structure in being at the date on which these regulations first take effect.

Penalty.

14. A person who is guilty of an offence against these regulations is liable to a penalty not exceeding forty dollars.

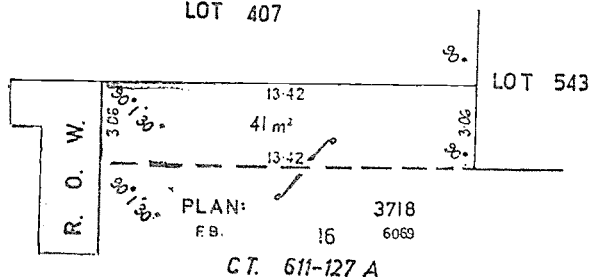

1. Applications for the hire of halls owned by the Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale or any portion of such buildings, equipment or property, shall be made to the Serpentine-Jarrahdale Shire Council not less than twenty-four hours before the hour at which hiring is required.

2. Hiring of the hall building and property including furniture and equipment shall be at rates as decided by the Council from time to time.

3. The hours for which hiring may be effected at day-time rates shall be from 8.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. Evening hiring shall be from 6.00 p.m. to midnight, with additional charge after midnight.

4. (a) The Hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit with the Council an amount estimated to cover hall hire and any damage that may occur during the term of engagement.

(b) The halls may be reserved in advance on the payment of a deposit of fifty per cent of the hire charge payable, and the balance of the hire charge must be paid fourteen days prior to the date of the engagement. If such balance of hire charge and deposit, which may be required for damage which may occur be not paid before fourteen days prior to the engagement as set out above, the fifty per cent hiring charge deposit shall be forfeited and the booking shall be automatically cancelled.

5. If, after payment of the required deposit, the hall booking is cancelled, the deposit, being fifty per cent of hire charge, will not be refunded unless the hall is re-let for the date of such cancelled booking.

6. The Council reserves the right to refuse to let the hall or any portion thereof to an applicant without assigning any reason for such refusal.

7. The Council may at any time cancel any agreement for hiring of any portion of the hall property.

8. In the event of two or more applications being received for the hire of the same portion of the hall property at the same time and date, the Council may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hall hiring shall be granted.

9. The hirer of any portion of the hall property shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, Entertainment Tax Act and other Acts, in force for the time being, applicable to such hiring of buildings. If, in the opinion of the Council all necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the requirements of above and all other relevant Acts, the Council may prior to or during the term of engagement, forbid and prevent the use of such building.

10. In the event of the use of any portion of the hall property being forbidden or prevented under the last preceding by-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire, as if the hire had been duly fulfilled, and the Council shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.

11. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale or spirits shall be brought into or consumed upon any portion of the Council's property except when permitted in writing by the Council.

12. No hall plant, furniture, fittings or effects, cutlery, crockery, glassware, or other utensil or materials of any kind shall be hired or loaned without the written permission of the Shire. Any furniture removed from the halls to the external loggios shall be replaced to the original positions in the halls.

13. The driving of nails, tacks or screws, etcetera into any of the woodwork, or walls of the halls is strictly forbidden. No internal or external decorations are permitted to be erected without special permission in writing from the Council. Decorations remaining after the functions shall be removed from the halls and their precincts and disposed of by the hirers. Failure to do so will result in a charge being made to the hirer. The use of adhesive tape or similar adhesive material on any woodwork or walls of buildings is strictly forbidden. The setting up of trestles, furniture, etc., and removing and storing of same, shall be the responsibility of the hirer.

14. No person whilst intoxicated shall be permitted to enter or remain upon any portion of the halls, nor be guilty of misbehaviour whatsoever, nor be permitted to use profane or improper language, nor damage, mark or deface any wall or other part of the hall or property. Any person who does, permits or suffers any such damage shall be liable to pay cost of such damages in addition to any penalty imposed under these conditions.

15. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons or anything deemed likely to produce disturbance, riot or breach of peace shall be permitted within the buildings or properties.

16. The hirer of any part or parts of the hall buildings shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour within the property, and shall be solely and entirely responsible for the carrying out and compliance with the requirements of these by-laws and for any damage done to the buildings, fixtures, fittings, furniture, crockery etcetera, and shall pay for such damage as may be assessed by the Council.
