Pearson Street Drain, Ashfield and Bayswater
—Takeover and Reconstruction.

The takeover, by constituting as a Metropolitan Main Drain, that portion of the existing Pearson Street Drain which is downstream of the southwestern end of the right-of-way at the rear of Maidos Street, Ashfield. Total length of drain

to be constituted is 2,800 feet approximately and is shown on Plan M.W.B. No. 11734. Following takeover the Board will undertake reconstruction works as required. Work will include all deepening, widening, piping, relocation, etc., together with all necessary apparatus and things connected therewith.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 16th day of February, 1973.

Shire of Gnowangerup Town Planning Scheme No. 1.

The Gnowangerup Shire Council under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purposes of:

- (a) Setting aside land for future public use as reserves.
- (b) Controlling land development.
- (c) Other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

PART 1.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Gnowangerup Town Planning Scheme No. 1 hereinafter called "The Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land within the border shown on the maps appended hereto.

1.3 The Responsible Authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Gnowangerup hereinafter referred to as "The Council".

1.4 Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme Text is divided into the following parts:—

- Part 1—Preliminary.
- Part 2—Reserved Land.
- Part 3—Zones.
- Part 4—Non-conforming Uses.
- Part 5—General Provisions.
- Part 6—Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are as follows:—

- (1) Land Use Map.
- (2) Scheme Map.

1.5 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix D of the Town Planning Regulations 1967 unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

1.6 Within this Scheme "Service Station" means a Service Station as defined in Appendix D of the Town Planning Regulations 1967 with or without public eating facilities.

"Trade Display" means the use of land and buildings for the display and/or sale of goods and equipment.

PART 2.—RESERVED LAND.

2.1 The Scheme area contains four types of reserves set out hereunder:—

- Government Purposes.
- Recreation.
- Railways.
- Local Roads.

2.2 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.

(b) In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve and shall in the case of land reserved for the purpose of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.

(c) No provision for this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance, for which the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

2.3 (a) Where a Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.

(b) Claims for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

(c) In lieu of paying compensation the Council may purchase the land affected by such decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

PART 3.—ZONES.

3.1 The Scheme is divided into 17 types of zones as set out hereunder:—

- Residential.
- Residential Development.
- Special Development.
- Service Station.
- Commercial A.
- Commercial B.
- Light Industry.
- General Industry.
- Hazardous Industry.
- Hotel.
- Drive-In Theatre.
- Rural.
- Fuel Depot.
- Civic and Cultural Areas.
- Private Clubs and Institutions.
- Place of Public Assembly.
- Car Park.

3.2 Table No. 1 appended to this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones set out hereunder. Such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left hand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on top of that Table.

3.3 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 appended to this clause have the following meanings:

- "P"—A use that is permitted under this Scheme.
- "AA"—A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Council.
- "A"—A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Council under the conditions of clauses 5.1 to 5.7 (inclusive) of the Scheme.
- "IP"—A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Council.
- "X"—A use that is not permitted.

3.4 The Council shall advertise its intention to consider granting preliminary approval for uses marked "AA" in Table No. 1 at least twice in a newspaper circulating in the Town of Gnowangerup, such advertisements to be published at least 7 days apart. Objections may be received at the Council offices within 21 days of the first advertisement of Council's intention.

3.5 The use of the following zones have been excluded from the Table and their use may be determined by reference to the Scheme Map and shall exclude any other use not incidental to that use:—

- Hotel Zone.
- Motel Zone.
- Drive-In Theatre Zone.
- Fuel Depot Zone.
- Civic and Cultural.
- Private Clubs and Institutions and Place of Public Assembly.

PART 4.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

4.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), and any other law authorising the development to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part 2 of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing;

(b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part 3 of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, and provided the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-Laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended) or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

4.3 Change of Non-Conforming Use: The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of the Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use, or is in the opinion of the Council closer to the intended uses of the zone.

4.4 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, except where a change of non-conforming use has been permitted by the Council under Clause 4.3, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

PART 5.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

5.1 Residential Development Zone: Before granting approval for any of the uses permitted within the Residential Development Zone subject to Council approval under Table No. 1 the Council will require the submission of and agreement to an Outline Development Plan for such areas as are the subject of an application to develop or subdivide together with other areas determined by the Council having regard to:—

- (a) The major road systems under the Scheme.
- (b) Topographic conditions.
- (c) Land holdings adjacent to or in the vicinity of the subject land.
- (d) The necessity of providing civic and public facilities.

5.2 Outline Development Plans shall be prepared for areas determined by the Council under clause 5.1 by either the owners of the land involved or by the Council and shall be submitted by the Council to the Town Planning Board for approval.

5.3 Outline Development Plans shall show the principles under which it is proposed to develop or subdivide the land and as a minimum requirement shall show:—

- (a) The location and width of the distributor road system proposed.
- (b) The approximate location and quantity of shopping, civic and public facilities proposed together with an analysis of the factors used in determination of such facilities.
- (c) The distribution of the recreation and open space areas proposed.
- (d) The population and residential densities proposed.

5.4 (a) Upon preparation of an Outline Development Plan the Council shall advertise that such plan has been prepared and will be available for public inspection and the lodgement of objections thereto.

(b) Advertisement of the preparation of an Outline Development Plan shall be by notice for each of three consecutive weeks in a newspaper circulating in the District of the Town of Gnowangerup and shall state a date on which objections to the Outline Development Plan may be made such date being not less than 21 days from the date of the last advertisement.

(c) Objections under subclause (b) of this clause shall be in writing addressed to the Shire Clerk.

5.5 The Council shall consider the objections if any made under clause 5.4 and may amend the Outline Development Plan after such consideration of objections.

5.6 The Council shall submit the Outline Development Plan so prepared to the Town Planning Board together with the objection received under clause 5.4 and request the Board to adopt the plan submitted as the basis for approval of subdivision and development applications within the area covered by the plan.

5.7 Where the owners of land within the area covered by an Outline Development Plan are aggrieved by a decision of the Council pursuant to clause 5.5 or where the Council is aggrieved by a decision of the Board pursuant to clause 5.6 an appeal to the Minister for his determination may be made and the decision of the Minister shall be final.

5.8 Any approval for development required under any provision of the Scheme shall be in writing addressed to the Shire Clerk of the Shire of Gnowangerup and may be approved by the Council or approved subject to conditions.

5.9 Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Council under the terms of Clause 5.1 may appeal to the Hon. Minister, for Town Planning seeking a variation of the Council's decision.

5.10 No building shall be so constructed or finished or left unfinished that its external appearance would in the opinion of the Council disfigure the locality or tend to depreciate the value of adjoining property. Further all land and buildings shall be maintained in such a manner as not to detract from the amenities of the neighbourhood in which they are situated.

5.11 Special Development: Within those areas zoned Special Residential on the Scheme Map a minimum Lot size of 1/2 acre shall apply to all land in this zone subdivided after the date of the gazettal of this scheme.

PART 6.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

6.1 Disposal of Land: The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

6.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purpose of Part 2 shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part 2 shall apply.

6.3 Entry to Premises: The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

6.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the maps forming part of the Scheme.

2.1 This Scheme shall not apply to Crown Reserves or unalienated Crown land unless these are transferred to freehold or leasehold when the Council shall amend the Scheme to include such land in appropriate zoning under Part III.

PART III.—ZONES.

3.1 The Scheme Area is divided into the following zones:—

Residential.
Public and Institutional.
Commercial.
Special Use.
Industrial.
Rural.

3.2 Table No. 1 appended to Clause 3.3 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of

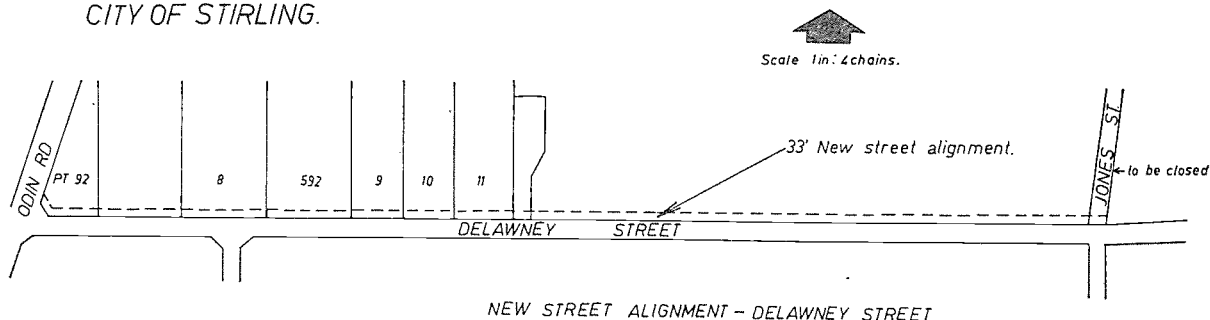

By-laws Relating to Public Reserves.

L.G. 44/73.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 18th day of December, 1972, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:—

1. In these By-laws the term "Council" means the Council of the Town of Canning, and the term "building" means any permanent or temporary structure including tents, marquees and stalls, and the term "function" means and includes a carnival show exhibition gymkhana sport party or picnic or a match or contest between opposing teams in any game.

2. No person shall on any public reserve within the Town of Canning—

- (a) throw stones or other missiles;
- (b) cause a nuisance;
- (c) except in a receptacle provided for that purpose deposit any rubbish utensils glass or litter;
- (d) break any glass metal earthenware or utensil;
- (e) be in a state of intoxication;
- (f) behave in a disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance or use any foul or indecent language or commit any act of indecency;
- (g) drive a vehicle on or over grounds prepared for a playing field or an established park or garden;
- (h) park a vehicle except in an area set aside for that purpose;
- (i) ride a horse over grounds prepared for a playing field or an established garden;
- (j) bring a dog or permit a dog to remain unless the dog is on a leash held by a person;
- (k) damage or injure any plant lawn flower or tree;
- (l) cut or damage any soil or turf;
- (m) light a fire unless in a fireplace provided for the purpose;
- (n) use or operate a device causing a loud noise or any siren or starting gun in such manner as to cause a nuisance or annoyance;
- (o) use or operate any musical instrument radio or loud speaker in such manner as to create excessive noise or as to cause a nuisance or annoyance.
- (p) bet gamble or call the odds or offer to bet or gamble;
- (q) climb over or upon any fence or gate;
- (r) unlock or unfasten any gate unless duly authorised to do so;
- (s) enter any dressing or training room or use any of the lockers unless authorised;
- (t) destroy damage injure or cause harm to any bird or animal;
- (u) climb any tree.

3. No person shall without the consent of the Council, on any public reserve within the Town of Canning—

- (a) park a caravan;
- (b) camp lodge or tarry overnight or frequent for the purpose of camping lodging and tarrying overnight.
- (c) consume alcoholic liquor;
- (d) remove tamper with or re-locate any structure or goal post;
- (e) damage or deface any building;
- (f) discharge a firearm;
- (g) organise, conduct or address a gathering or meeting of persons;
- (h) take part in a procession or demonstration;
- (i) erect or place any signboard hoarding notice or placard or stamp stencil affix or distribute any handbill notice or advertisement or any documents or papers;
- (j) carry a placard or notice;
- (k) use or install a loud speaker or amplifier;
- (l) sell or expose for sale any goods wares merchandise or things.

4. Any person found in a state of intoxication in any public reserve, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or using any foul or indecent language, or committing any act of indecency therein, may be forthwith removed from such public reserve by the caretaker or by any officer of the Council, or by any member of the Police Force.

5. Any person found betting, gambling or calling the odds or offering to bet or gamble within any public reserve, may be forthwith removed from such public reserve by the caretaker or by an officer of the Council or by any member of the Police Force.

6. No person shall organise, arrange or take part in a function on a public reserve unless a licence to hold or organise a function shall have been granted by the Council.

7. The Council may grant a licence to a person to hold or organise a function on a public reserve, subject to such conditions, if any, as it may deem fit, and may authorise a charge to be made for admission to the function.

8. A licence to hold a function on a public reserve shall specify—

- (a) the purpose for which such licence is granted;
- (b) the dates and times during which the function may be held; and
- (c) the charge if any which has been authorised by the Council for admission to the function.

9. No licence shall be granted for a continuous period of more than fourteen days.

10. Subject as hereinafter provided no person to whom a licence has been granted shall exclude any member of the general public from attending the function if such person pays the authorised charge for admission.

11. No person to whom a licence has been granted shall make a charge for admission to the function unless authorised to do so by the Council or shall make a charge for admission in excess of the amount of the charge authorised by the Council.

12. No person under the influence of alcohol or drugs or acting in a riotous or disorderly manner shall attend a function.

13. A person to whom a licence has been granted shall prevent persons under the influence of alcohol or drugs or persons acting in a riotous or disorderly manner from attending a function.

14. Any person to whom a licence has been granted who commits or permits the commission of a breach of any of the terms or conditions of the licence shall be guilty of an offence.

15. The Council is satisfied that the person to whom a licence has been granted has committed or permitted or authorised the commission of a breach of any of the terms or conditions of the licence or has committed a breach of any of these by-laws may by a notice in writing to such person cancel the licence and thereupon the licence shall be cancelled.

16. No person shall erect or permit or authorise the erection of a building on a public reserve without the consent of the Council.

17. Any person desirous of erecting a building on a public reserve shall make application to the Council for its consent thereto.

18. The consent of the Council to the erection of a building in a public reserve shall specify—

- (a) the purpose for which such building may be used;
- (b) the nature of the building which may be erected;
- (c) the time during which such building may be permitted to remain on the public reserve;
- (d) the times when such building may be used; and
- (e) the position in which such building may be erected.

19. Any person who shall erect or use or permit or authorise the erection or use of any building on a public reserve without the written consent of the Council or otherwise than in accordance with the terms of the written consent of the Council shall be guilty of an offence.

20. The Council may after having given to the person to whom a consent to erect a building on a public reserve has been granted one month's notice of its intention so to do withdraw such consent.

21. The Council may by notice in writing to the owner or to the person whom it believes to be the owner of a building on a public reserve, direct that a building erected or used on a public reserve without the consent of the Council or erected or used otherwise than in accordance with the terms of the consent of the Council, or any building in respect of which the consent to erect the same has been withdrawn, be removed within a period of fourteen days after the date of the service of the said notice.

22. In the event of the non-compliance with a notice given in pursuance of the preceding by-law the Council may sell the building in respect of which the notice has been given or may by its employees and contractors take down and remove the said building and may sell the materials of which it is constructed and shall hold the balance of the purchase money received by it after deducting all costs and expenses consequent upon such failure to comply with the notice and such taking down and removal and sale upon trust for the person entitled thereto.

23. Any person who fails to comply with a notice given by the Council to remove a building on a public reserve shall be guilty of an offence.

24. No unauthorised person shall cause any damage to a building on a public reserve.

25. No person other than the owner or a person authorised in that behalf by the owner of a building on a public reserve shall use such building.

26. No person shall without the approval of the Council use a building on a public reserve as a dwelling or for sleeping purposes.

27. No person who is the owner of or is a person authorised in that behalf by the owner of a building on a public reserve, shall use such building during the course of a function without the consent of the Council or without the permission of the person to whom a licence to hold such function has been granted.

28. No person shall assign or transfer his ownership of or his interest in a building on a public reserve without having first delivered to the Council a notice of transfer giving details of full name and address of the transferor and of the transferee and a description of the building and its location.

29. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws shall be liable to—

- (a) a maximum penalty of one hundred dollars; and
- (b) a maximum daily penalty during the breach of ten dollars per day;
- (c) a minimum penalty of one-tenth of the maximum penalty and of one-tenth of the maximum daily penalty for the breach.

By-laws relating to Swimming Pools.

L.G. 204/70.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 27th day of November, 1972, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following bylaws:—

The By-laws of the Town of Canning relating to Swimming Pools published in the *Government Gazette* of the 4th June, 1970, are amended in the following manner:—

1. The definition of "Pool Premises" contained in By-law 1 is altered by the insertion after the word "structures" of the word "parking areas and access ways".

2. After By-law 19 the following new By-law is inserted:—

19A. No person shall—

- (a) break up damage or destroy the surface of or excavate in a parking area or any access way forming part of the Pool Premises;
- (b) break up, damage or destroy any fence, flower, flower bed, tree, shrub, light or sign forming part of a parking area used by patrons of a Pool Premises;
- (c) drive a vehicle or ride a motor cycle in a reckless manner or at a speed exceeding 10 m.p.h. in a parking area forming part of the Pool Premises.

19B. (1) In this By-law 'owner' in relation to a vehicle means the person who is the holder of the requisite vehicle licence under the Traffic Act in respect of the vehicle, or if the vehicle is not licensed under that Act the person who owns the vehicle or is entitled to possession of the vehicle.

(2) The owner of a vehicle shall if required by a member of the Police Force or the Town Clerk or the Pool Manager or an Officer authorised by the Council inform the member or the Town Clerk or the Pool Manager or other Officer authorised by the Council as to the identity and address of the driver or person in charge of the vehicle at the time when an offence of which the use, parking or standing of a vehicle is an element, is alleged to have been committed by the driver or person in charge of the vehicle against By-law 19A.

(3) Where the driver or person in charge of a vehicle is alleged to have committed an offence referred to in the preceding sub-by-law and the owner of the vehicle at the time the offence was alleged to have been committed fails when required so to do within seven days of the commission of the alleged offence to inform a member of the Police Force or the Town Clerk or the Pool Manager or other Officer authorised by the Council as to the identity and address of the person who was

the driver or person in charge of the vehicle at that time, the owner shall be deemed to be the person who committed that offence and shall then be liable to the penalty prescribed in respect thereof unless the member of the Police Force or the Town Clerk is satisfied from information furnished by the owner that the owner could not reasonably have been aware of the identity of the driver or person in charge or that the vehicle was stolen or being unlawfully used at the time the offence was alleged to have been committed.

(4) Where the member of the Police Force requiring the information under the preceding sub-by-law or the Town Clerk is satisfied that the owner could not reasonably have been aware of the identity of the driver or person in charge of the vehicle or that the vehicle was stolen or being unlawfully used at the time the offence referred to in sub-by-law (2) was alleged to have been committed no proceedings shall be taken against the owner for the recovery of the penalty prescribed in respect thereof.

By-law relating to Control and Management of The Geraldton and Districts
Aquatic Centre.

L.G. 108/70.

IN Pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on the 22nd day of November, 1972, to submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-law:—

1. In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires—"Pool premises" means the swimming pools and all associated buildings and land provided for the purpose of swimming by the public and includes the land and improvements situate at Lot 2521 being Reserve No. 30329.

"Council" means the Council of the Town of Geraldton.

"Town Clerk" means the Town Clerk or acting Town Clerk of the Town of Geraldton.

"Pool Manager" means the Manager or other person appointed for the time being by the Council to have the control and management of the Pool premises and such term shall include the Assistant Manager.

"Attendant" means an employee of the Council performing any duties on or in connection with the Pool premises.

"Spectator" means any person admitted to the Pool premises for the sole purpose of viewing the swimming or other activities conducted therein.

"Swimming Coach" means any person licensed by the Council to enter the Pool premises for the purpose of teaching swimming.

"Kiosk Premises" means that part of the Pool premises which is the subject of a lease to the Kiosk Proprietor.

"Club Room" means that part of the Pool premises designated as the Club room of the Geraldton Amateur Swimming Club Inc.

2. The Pool premises shall be open for use of the public during such hours and periods as the Council may from time to time by resolution appoint the Council reserving to itself the right to refuse admission to any person at any time. No person under the age of six years shall be permitted to enter or remain at the Pool premises unless that person is and continues to be under the care and control of a person over the age of fourteen years. No person shall leave a person under the age of six years at the Pool premises otherwise than under the care and control of a person over the age of fourteen years.

3. The Pool premises or any part thereof may at any time in the discretion of the Pool Manager be set aside for the use of certain persons to the exclusion of others.

4. The Pool Manager may temporarily suspend admittance or clear the Pool premises or any part thereof of any person or persons if in his opinion such action is necessary or desirable.

5. No person (save the officers or workmen or invitees of the Council) shall enter the Pool premises without having first paid the proper fee or charge hereinafter prescribed.

6. Every person using the Pool premises shall obey all reasonable directions of the Pool Manager with regard to such use.

7. No person shall in any way obstruct the Pool Manager in his control of the Pool premises and of persons therein.

8. It shall be the duty of the Pool Manager (who is hereby so empowered and directed) to refuse admission to or remove or cause to be removed from the Pool premises any person who, in the opinion of the Pool Manager, is guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law or who, by his past or present conduct, is deemed undesirable and any such person shall, upon the request of the Pool Manager to withdraw from the Pool premises quietly and peaceably do so as soon as possible.

9. Any person who has been refused admission to the Pool premises or who feels aggrieved by action of the Pool Manager may appeal to the Council by letter addressed to the Town Clerk against such action and the Council may give such direction in the matter as is thought fit provided that such right of appeal shall not imply any right of action for damages or other remedy against the Pool Manager or Council arising out of such refusal of admission.

10. No male above the age of four years shall trespass upon any part of the Pool premises set apart for the exclusive use of females and no female shall trespass upon any part of the Pool premises set apart for the exclusive use of males.

11. No person shall enter or attempt to enter any bathroom or dressing box that is already occupied without the consent of the occupier.

12. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his bathing costume except in a dressing shed or enclosure provided for that purpose.

13. No person shall use any pool or appear in public unless properly attired in a costume so as to preserve public decency and shall so cover the body as to prevent indecent exposure of the person. Any person who in the opinion of the Pool Manager commits a breach of this clause may be required by the Pool Manager to resume ordinary clothing and such person shall forthwith comply with such requirement.

14. No person shall enter or be in the Pool premises while in an intoxicated condition.

15. No person shall take into the Pool premises or have in his possession therein any intoxicating liquor.

16. No person affected or appearing to the Pool Manager to be affected or suffering from any infectious, contagious or offensive disease or skin complaint shall enter or be in the Pool premises.

17. No person shall bring or deposit any filth or rubbish in or upon the Pool premises otherwise than in a receptacle provided for the purpose.

18. No person shall eat in or take into any part of the pools and associated buildings excepting the Kiosk premises and Club Room any food, drinks or confectionary of any kind whatsoever.

19. No person shall smoke tobacco or any other substance in or about a Pool or concourse or in any portion of the Pool premises where public notices direct that smoking is prohibited.

20. No person shall disfigure or write upon any part of the Pool premises.

21. No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, disorderly or riotous manner, swear or use any indecent, obscene or abusive language or gamble in the Pool premises.

22. No person shall climb up or on any fence, wall, partition or roof of the Pool premises.

23. No person shall waste or wastefully use water in the Pool premises.

24. No person shall spit or expectorate in the Pool premises or commit any nuisance therein.

25. No person shall damage or interfere with or use improperly any part of the Pool premises or the furniture or fittings therein.

26. No person shall in any way annoy or interfere with any other person in the Pool premises.

27. Dogs shall not be allowed or permitted in or upon any part of the Pool premises and no person shall cause or permit any dog or other animal belonging to that person or under his control to enter or remain in or upon any part of the Pool premises.

28. The Pool Manager may prohibit any person approaching or entering or remaining in a pool who in his opinion is dirty or unfit to use such pool and the Pool Manager may require such person to thoroughly cleanse and wash himself in one of the showers.

29. (i) No person, club or association or organization shall conduct a carnival at the Pool Premises unless with the prior consent of the Council;

(ii) The Council may grant such consent subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such consent;

(iii) a person, club, association or organization conducting any carnival held at the Pool premises shall be responsible for the conduct of the competitors and spectators during the carnival and shall prevent overcrowding and ensure that no damage is done to the buildings or fencing or any other portion of the Pool premises and that these By-laws are observed by all competitors, officials and spectators attending the carnival.

(iv) The person, club, association or organization conducting any carnival held at the Pool premises shall pay to the Council such charges as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.

(v) No person, club, association or organization shall, within the Pool premises, sell, have for sale or make available to the public any food, drink and such like without the written consent of the Council.

30. No person shall—

- (a) use soap in any part of the Pool premises other than in the shower baths or toilet facilities;
- (b) use any detergent or any substance oil or preparation whilst he is in any pool whereby the water therein may be discoloured or contaminated or rendered turbid or, in the opinion of the Pool Manager in any way unfit;
- (c) foul or pollute the water in any shower or pool;
- (d) bring into any part of the Pool premises or place thereon any chemical substance, liquid or powder;
- (e) wilfully soil or defile or damage any towel or bathing costume the property of the Council;
- (f) wilfully or negligently break, injure, damage destroy or tamper with any equipment, locker, key or other property of the Council.

31. The Geraldton Amateur Swimming Club (Inc.) shall have control, but not ownership, of the club room provided that any other Aquatic organizations may, by arrangement with the Geraldton Amateur Swimming Club (Inc.) use the club room at a mutually agreed charge.

32. No person shall enter the club room without the approval of the organisation in charge of the club room at the time.

33. The Manager shall ensure that the entrance ways leading from the club premises and adjoining compound to the swimming area remain securely locked at all times and no person shall unlock the entrance ways unless the Pool Manager is present. The Geraldton Amateur Swimming Club will be responsible to ensure that the Club Room and adjoining compound are maintained in a neat and tidy condition.

Charges and Admission.

34. The sums to be paid for admission to the Pool premises and the use of the Pool and the requisites supplied therein may from time to time be determined and/or varied by resolution of the Council. Until otherwise determined or varied the sums to be paid shall be as follows:—

35. Except with the express approval of Council a person shall not pay nor shall any Pool attendant or other Officer or servant of the Council receive any fee for admission to the pool premises, except upon such person being permitted to pass through a turnstile which upon inserting the coin appropriate to the fee automatically registers such admission.

Coaching.

36. (i) No person shall profit teach, coach or train any other person in any pool unless with the prior written permission of the Council.

(ii) The Council may grant such permission subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such permission without being under any obligation to assign a reason for so doing and without being liable to pay compensation.

Depositing of Articles and Lost Property.

37. Any person wishing to hire a locker shall make application to the Kiosk Attendant.

38. Any person who hires a locker shall before leaving the Pool premises return to the Kiosk Attendant the key or token or tag relating to such locker.

39. Any person may after having entered the Pool premises deposit with the Kiosk Attendant any article for safe keeping in the lockers subject to the following terms and conditions and any person making any deposit shall be deemed to agree that such conditions shall be applicable thereto:—

(i) If any article deposited be damaged, destroyed, lost or stolen neither the Council nor any officer, employee (including the Kiosk Proprietor and Attendants) or agent of the Council shall be in any way responsible for any such damage, destruction loss or theft, howsoever occurring.

(ii) Upon production to the Kiosk Attendant of a receipt or token given in respect of any article deposited the article may be handed to the person producing the receipt or token without proof that such person is the person to whom such receipt or token was originally issued.

(iii) If any article deposited is not reclaimed within three months from the date of the deposit the Council or some person duly authorised in that behalf by the Council may sell or otherwise dispose of the same and shall be under no liability either to the owner or depositor thereof by reason of such sale or disposal and may apply the proceeds of sale as the Council sees fit.

40. (i) There shall be kept by the Pool Manager or by an attendant a book (hereinafter referred to as the Lost Property Register).

(ii) Any person who finds any article which has been left in the Pool premises shall forthwith deliver it to the Pool Manager or an attendant.

(iii) Upon receipt of such article the Pool Manager or attendant shall forthwith take charge thereof and enter or cause to be entered in the Lost Property Register a description of the article, the time and date of its receipt and the name of the finder.

(iv) In the interpretation of this clause the word "article" shall include money.

41. The Pool Manager shall, as and when directed, report to the Town Clerk regarding all money and articles found in the Pool premises and handed to him and whether any such have been claimed and returned to the owners thereof, at the same time he shall hand to the Town Clerk any money or articles unclaimed.

42. Neither the Council nor any officer or employee of the Council shall be in any way responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the Pool premises or for any article damaged or destroyed whilst in on or about the Pool premises.

43. No ticket, token, licence or receipt issued as provided by this By-law shall be transferable and no person other than the person to whom it was originally issued shall enjoy any benefit therefrom or any privileges thereunder.

44. Any person committing a breach of or an offence against any of the provisions of this By-law shall for every such breach or offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100).

A person shall not sell except for the purpose of export from the State, any apples or pears of which the sale is, pursuant to Section 3D of the Act, prohibited and any person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence.

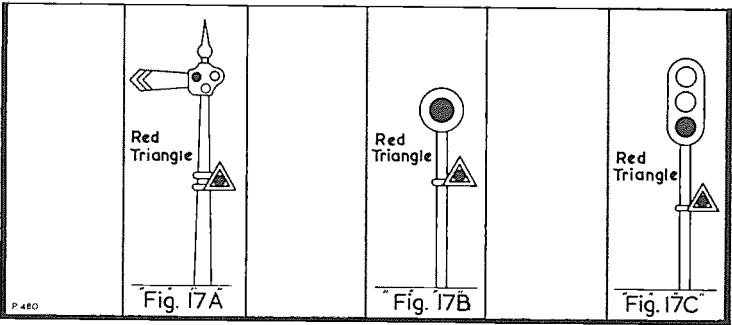
