"children's crossing" means a portion of a carriageway between two parallel broken or unbroken lines, each approximately 12 inches wide and not more than 15 feet apart, marked across, or partly across the carriageway and near which a fluorescent red-orange flag or sign bearing the words, "CHILDREN CROSSING—STOP", in black letters, is displayed and, where the lines are so marked partly across a carriageway, includes the portion of the carriageway between the prolongations of those lines;

TOWN PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT, 1928 (AMENDED).

City of Melville.

Town Planning and Redevelopment Scheme No. 1.

THE Melville City Council, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (amended) and the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act, 1959 (amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning and Development Scheme for the purpose of:—

- (1) Achieving the redevelopment of the lots edged by a broken black border on the zoning map.
- (2) Acquiring a strip of land as outlined in pink on the zoning map for the purpose of widening Canning Highway.
- (3) Permitting the development of the land to proceed in accordance with the site plan as depicted on the redevelopment map.

Part I.

Preliminary.

1.1 This Town Planning and Development Scheme may be cited as the City of Melville Town Planning and Redevelopment Scheme No. 1 hereinafter called "The Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the map which forms part of the Scheme.

1.3 The Scheme is complementary to, and is not a substitute for, the Metropolitan Regional Scheme, and the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Scheme, as amended from time to time, shall continue to have effect.

1.4 The zonings for the land within this Scheme as set out in Town Planning Scheme Number Two which was published in the *Government Gazette* on the 30th day of June, 1972, and subsequently from time to time amended are hereby revoked.

1.5 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the City of Melville, hereinafter referred to as "the Council".

Part II.

Interpretations.

2.1 The term "Petrol Pump" shall mean any mechanical device, whether fixed or moveable, used, or designed to be used, for dispensing petrol, and includes all tanks and equipment ancillary thereto.

2.2 "Major Owner" shall mean the owner who holds title to the majority of land in this Scheme.

Part III.

Zoning and Permitted Uses as set out in the Zoning Map.

3.1 The area edged by a broken BLACK line shall be classified as a Special Development Zone.

3.2 The area within the Special Development Zone set aside as a private right of way and coloured BROWN shall be common to Lots 23 and 24 and shall only be used for vehicular and pedestrian purposes but such terminology shall not include parking.

3.3 The area shown as Lot 24 and coloured Blue, shall be set aside for Local Shopping only and may include any form of retail business, a bank and a doctor's surgery.

3.4 The area shown at Lot 23 and coloured BLUE with RED border, shall be set aside for the purpose of Service Station.

3.5 The area coloured PINK and shown as Road Widening shall be Vested in the Crown by the Applicants at their expense and shall thereafter come under the care, management and control of the Main Roads Department.

Part IV.

General Provision.

4.1 Development on site shall be in accordance with the building layout shown on the Redevelopment Map.

4.2 No petrol pump shall be sited closer than 15 feet to any road boundary as depicted on the resultant lots nor any closer to a structure than the distance prescribed by the Flammable Liquids Act, 1967 (amended).

4.3 The paved areas within the Title boundaries included in the map shall be available at all times to owner(s) of Lots 23 and 24 for parking of vehicles in accordance with the parking layout shown thereon and the paved areas, including the right-of-way, shall be maintained to Council's satisfaction at all times at the owners' expense. Notice to carry out maintenance of these paved areas, served on the major title holder, shall be deemed sufficient for maintenance to be carried out as directed by Council.

4.4 No provision of this document shall prevent the issue of Strata Title on individual buildings should this be desired by the applicants and approved by Council in accordance with the Strata Titles Act, 1966 (amended) but each and every title so issued shall be subservient to the requirements of these Parts.

4.5 No provision of this document shall prevent the issue of separate Title to Lots 23 and 24 as shown on the zoning Map, should the applicants so desire subject to such subdivision being approved by the Town Planning Board.

4.6 Any alteration to the structures and/or paved areas, other than internal alterations agreed by Council in conformity with the provisions of the Uniform Building By-laws 1965 (as amended), shall only be permitted subject to Council agreeing to initiate an amendment to this Scheme, such amendment being duly Gazetted in accordance with the procedure set out in Town Planning Regulations, 1967.

4.7 All structures shall be maintained, repaired and painted at all times to Council's satisfaction and specification.

Part V.

Penalties.

5.1 Any person who fails to comply with any provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence, and is liable to such penalties as are prescribed in the City of Melville Town Planning Scheme Number Two.

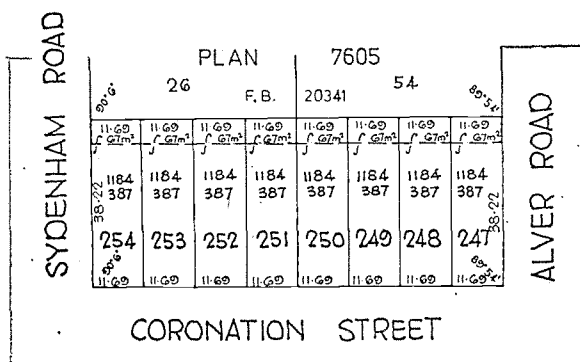

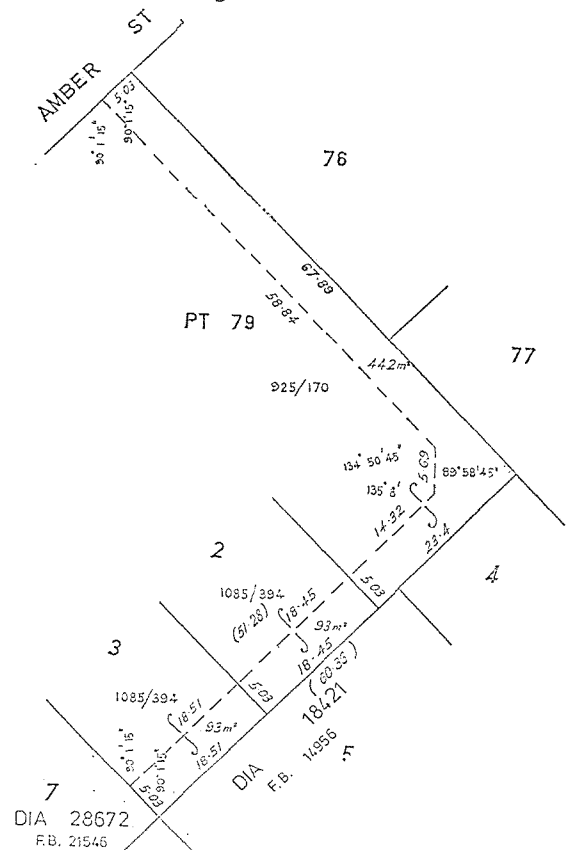
