WHEREAS by section 24 of the Aboriginal Affairs Planning Authority Act, 1972, it is provided that the Governor, on the request of the Aboriginal Affairs Planning Authority, may by Proclamation place any land to which Part III of that Act applies under the control and management of the Aboriunder the control and management of the Aboriginal Lands Trust; and whereas Part III of the Aboriginal Affairs Planning Authority Act, 1972, applies to the lands referred to in the Schedule to this Proclamation by virtue of those lands having been reserved for the use and benefit of the Aboriginal inhabitants under the provisions of section 29 of the Land Act, 1933, and being the subject of proclamations made under either paragraph (a) of section 18 of the Native Welfare subsection (1) of section 18 of the Native Welfare Act, 1963, or under paragraph (a) of section 25 of the Aboriginal Affairs Planning Authority Act, 1972, the references to the relevant proclamations 1972, the references to the relevant proclamations in each case being also specified in the schedule hereto; and whereas it is now deemed desirable that the control and management of the lands referred to in the schedule hereto should be transferred to the Aboriginal Lands Trust. Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the request of the Aboriginal Affairs Planning Authority hereby place the lands Affairs Planning Authority, hereby place the lands referred to in the schedule to this Proclamation under the control and management of the Aboriginal Lands Trust upon the following terms and conditions:-

- (1) The control and management vested in the Trust shall be exercised by the Trust in accordance with any direction, whether of a general or a specific character, given to the Trust by the Minister after consul-tation with the Trust, and the Trust shall give effect to any such direction.
- (2) The Minister shall not be bound to give effect to any recommendation made by the Trust.

- (3) Subject to the direction of the Minister and to the approval of the Treasurer of the State, the Trust may exercise the power of the Aboriginal Affairs Planning Authority to receive, for the benefit of persons of Aboriginal descent, either generally or in specific classes of case approach. really or in specific classes of case, any rental, royalty, share of profit or other revenue that may be negotiated or prescribed in relation to the use of those lands or the natural resources of those lands.

Constitution Act, 1889. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

- 2.1.2 No building of less than 60 square metres shall be erected on any lot except where the building is to be an associated outbuilding.
- 2.1.3 No building shall be located on any lot nearer to the front or rear boundaries than 100 metres or nearer to the side boundaries than 45 metres.
- 2.1.4 In granting approval under Section 2.1.5, the Council shall be satisfied that the natural bushland environment shall not be prejudiced, shall pay regard to the provisions of Section 2.2 of the Scheme and may impose such conditions on approval as it deems fit.
- 2.1.5 The minimum lot size in the Scheme Area shall be ten acres.
- 2.2 Preservation of the Natural Environment.
 - 2.2.1 No building shall be erected, placed or altered on any lot until the Owners' Committee, provided for under Section 3.1.3, shall have recommended to the Council that the plans, specifications and location, materials and design of the building indicate that it will be in harmony with the bushland environment and the Council has given written approval.
 - 2.2.2 No person shall erect any sign, hoarding, billboard, advertising device or like structure without prior permission of the Council and in giving approval under this section, the Council shall be satisfied that the sign is wholly justified.
 - 2.2.3 No lot shall be cleared of native vegetation to a greater area than 25 per cent. of lot size excluding firebreaks required by the Council or Bushfires Board.
 - 2.2.4 No exotic grasses, shrubs or tree areas are to be introduced into the Scheme Area except by approval of the National Parks Board.
 - 2.2.5 No chemical fertilizers or sprays are to be used except with the approval of the National Parks Board.

PART III.-ADMINISTRATION.

- 3.1 Application for Development.
 - 3.1.1 Any application for development required under any provision of the Scheme shall be in writing and be accompanied by such plans, sketches and specifications as to fully illustrate the proposal.
 - 3.1.2 Such plans shall embody the basic premise that development and associated services are secondary to the natural features of the site and indicate the extent of earthmoving and clearing.
 - 3.1.3 For the purposes of assisting and guiding the Council in administering the Scheme the owners of land within the Scheme Area shall, from time to time, elect or appoint an Owners' Committee of five members.
 - 3.1.4 The Council shall refer any application for development to the Owners' Committee and the Committee shall recommend in writing to the Council that the application be approved, conditionally approved or refused.
 - 3.1.5 The Council shall pay regard to, but shall not be bound by, the recommendation of the Owners' Committee.
- 3.2 The Council may, by an authorised officer, enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.
- 3.3 Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Council in the use of its discretionary powers under the Scheme may appeal in accordance with Part V of the Town Planning and Development Act and the regulations made thereunder.
- 3.4 Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed in the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended).


